Association of Nigeria, IPMAN, and the Major Oil Marketers Association of Nigeria have allayed the fear of a possible petrol price hike over the rising price of crude oil at the global market and the free-fall of the Naira at the forex window.

It is recalled that in the last three months fuel price has been increased twice.

Upon removing the fuel subsidy in June, the pump price was reviewed upward by 210 per cent to N546.83 per litre from N175/per litre. Less than a month later, the fuel pump price was increased to N617 per litre from N546.83.

Between July and September, no fuel increment has been affected despite the continued fall in the price of Naira at the forex market.

The development is sequel to President Bola Ahmed Tinubu's assurance to Nigerians that there will not be

increments, according to Ajuri Ngelale, Special Adviser to the President on Media and Publicity.

"We repeat, the President affirms that there will be no increase in the price of petroleum motor spirit," he said.

The Group Chief Executive of Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation Limited, Mele Kyari, reiterated Tinubu's assurance.

Except in July, when Emadeb Energy imported 27 million litres of fuel into Nigeria, NNPC limited has been the sole supplier of the product nationwide.

Speaking on Monday, the President of IPMAN, Chinedu Okonkwo said there is no cause for alarm over the fuel price increase.

Okonkwo explained that fuel marketers purchase their products in Naira.

He urged the federal government to speed up efforts toward ensuring the implementation of Compressed Natural Gas as a viable alternative to

"We are getting fuel products from our source, the NNPCL Retail. NNPCL has not told us that the price of fuel will change; I should not speculate on price increments.

"I think we have NNPCL fundamental determines the price; if NNPC decides to increase the fuel pump, we will also change.

"For now, there is nothing to worry about. The same reason the price could go up, it can also come down. NNPCL can do anything to remain in business. No marketer should complain of dollar scarcity because they are

not importing PMS. NNPCL

"Government should include stakeholders like IPMAN into the Compressed Natural Gas initiative; that is the way out", he said.

Also, a former Chairman of MOMAN, Tunji Oyebanji explained that the country has a special fuelderegulated market where NNPCL sets the price as the sole supplier.

According to him, as long as NNPCL remains the sole supplier and fuel importer, the product's price may likely remain unchanged in the interest the generality Nigerians.

"We are operating in a deregulated market in a peculiar situation, because the company importing fuel to Nigeria is only the NNPCL.

"If I want to import, the landing cost may be higher than the prevailing market price. As a result, only NNPCL can import at

# **Investors lose N39bn as trade volume increases**

TRADING Exchange closed negative on Friday by 0.11 per cent week-on-week due to weak market momentum which saw investors losing N39bn.

Both the market capitalisation and the Nigerian Exchange Limited All Share Index closed trading lower at N36.847tn and 67,324.59 respectively compared to the previous week's figure of N36.886tn and 67,395.74 basis points.

However, the total turnover of shares was 3.911 billion units worth N30.38bn in 38,536 deals, higher than a total of 2.933 billion shares valued at N47.45bn that exchanged hands the previous week in 44,654 deals.

Measured by volume, the Financial Services Industry led the activity chart with 2.774 billion shares valued at N15.24bn traded in 16,379 deals; thus contributing 70.92 per cent and 50.17 per cent to the total equity turnover volume and value respectively.

This was followed by the Oil and Gas Industry which saw 438.508 million shares worth N5.20bn traded in 6,258 deals. The third place was the ICT Industry, with a turnover of 294.470 million shares worth N4.447 billion in 3,078 deals.

The top three equities traded in the review period were Universal Insurance Plc, Oando Plc and United Bank for Africa Plc (measured by volume) which accounted for 2.212 billion shares worth N8.91bn in 7,593 deals, contributing 56.56 per cent and 29.32 per cent to the total equity turnover volume and value respectively.

The Insurance sector emerged as the top gainer in the week by 3.34 per cent week on week, followed by the Consumer goods (+2.98 per cent), Banking (+0.61 per cent) and the Oil & Gas sectors (+0.56 per cent) accordingly. On the contrary, the Industrial Goods sector closed the week negative by 4.80 per cent week on week owing price decrease in Dangote Cement.

Other indices which depreciated in value during the week were NGX 30, NGX Premium, NGX AFR Div Yield, NGX Lotus II, NGX Industrial Goods, NGX Growth and NGX Pension Broad which dipped by 0.13 per cent, 3.45 per cent, 1.72 per cent, 0.12 per cent, 0.36 per cent and 0.14 per cent respectively while the NGX ASeM index closed flat.

In the week under review, 48 equities appreciated higher than 32 equities in the previous week. Forty equities depreciated in price lower than 53 in the previous week, while 67 equities remained unchanged, lower than 70 recorded in two previous week.

Leading the gainers' chart was Sunu Assurances whose share

price rose by 32.91 per cent to N1.05, Ellah Lakes Plc's share appreciated by 28.79 per cent to N3.30, E-Tranzact International Plc gained 28.57 per cent to close at N9.45 per share, Chams Holdings' shares rose by 19.09 per cent to N1.31 and Abbey Mortgage Bank Plc took the fifth position on the gainers' table after gaining 17.65 per cent to close N2 per share.

On the losers' table, Tantalizers led with 21.05 per cent dip to close at N0.30, Guinea Insurance lost 20.69 per cent in its share value to close at N0.23, McNichols lost 13.33 per cent to close trading at N0.65, Unity Bank Plc's share lost 11.29 per cent in value to close at N1.10 and Secure Electronic Technology's shares depreciated by 10.34 per cent to close the trading week at N0.26

Meanwhile, analysts are of the view that this week will see mixed sentiments in the market, with positive momentum counterbalanced by profit-taking activities.

Analysts at Cowry Asset Management Limited opined that the uncertainty in "the market will be further fueled by the half-year earnings reports from Access Holdings while investors are likely to continue in portfolio reshuffling in preparation for the quarter-end reporting season."

THE Cement Producers Association of Nigeria has warned that the ongoing plan of the federal government to introduce concrete roads will raise the price of cement to N9, 000 per bag from the current price of N5, 000.

It also called on the current administration to permanently address the perennial cement price hike problem by facilitating larger participation in the cement industry, noting that Nigerians have no business buying cement for more than N5, 600 per bag.

The association, in a statement jointly signed by the National Chairman, Prince David Iweta and National Secretary Chief Reagan Ufomba, recently, commended the works Minister's position on cement-made roads but warned of dire consequences, if the supply end is not addressed properly.

As a solution, the cement producers urged the government to lay more emphasis on road design that allows both cement technology and asphalt pavement to run concurrently and provide ample time for a smooth transition that allows contractors to invest in commensurate and requisite equipment and retooling.

The statement read, "Our findings from various parts of the country show that cement sells for as high as N6000 per bag in the rainy season. Our prediction is that it will sell for over N9,000 per bag in the dry season, especially with the pronouncement of the Honourable Minister of Works on cement technology and the marching order on housing by Mr President if the government does

not take proactive steps.
"While we commend the

Honourable Minister's position on cement-made roads, we warn of the dire consequences if the supply end is not properly addressed. In fact, it would amount to dereliction of duty not to intervene. And the time is now. To do otherwise is to continue in a worsening pipe dream that prices would suddenly drop on this essential input that will continue to drain the purse of Nigerians, render them homeless, encourage chaos between demand and supply, and worsen the infrastructure deficit it sets out to cure, and lead to an unprecedented price hike.

"We also call on the Honourable Minister of Works to lay more emphasis on the design criteria of roads that allow both cement technology and Asphalt pavement to run concurrently, in turn, will provide ample time for a smooth transition that allows contractors to invest in commensurate and requisite equipment and retooling. We must also as a nation regulate static and dynamic load traffic by introducing weighbridges at access points on our highways. Working in sync with contractors, and allied Ministries of Trade and Investment, Transport, Environment and Finance on realistic policy on cement is most desirable at this critical time.

The association further requested the government to conclude the backward integration policy of the late Yar'adua administration that was already bringing availability and affordability of cement in the country.p

It added, "There has been so much comment on cement and cement pricing of late. What our nation needs is cement that is available and affordable. And this cannot be achieved by mere wishes, faulty policies and programmes, without breaking the chain of monopoly and favouritisms. Nigerians are tired of waiting for a downturn in the price of cement and for decent and affordable housing.

"We call on the Tinubu government to permanently

solve this perennial cement price hike problem by expanding participation in the sector with companies who have verifiable evidence of local investment, including greenfield licenses and quarrying. As a matter of fact, we call on the government to more specifically conclude the backward integration policy of the late Yar'adua administration which was already bearing availability and affordability fruits.

"As patriots, it is our view that the government reintroduces backward integration policy and the conclusion of old ones. Consequently, the government cannot be seen to approbate and reprobate by deregulating issues of petroleum products and foreign exchange on one hand and regulating on pricing of cement, essential goods and services on another. There is a need for policy harmonisation and convergence between fiscal and monetary policies.

"Finally, we call on the government to urgently intervene in the foreign exchange market, intervene in restructuring bad loans of manufacturers, and review palliative modules. The cry for elusive FDI will be drastically reduced if all manufacturing concerns are revived. The government must be decisive in the kind of economic policies it intends to foist on the people," the statement concluded.

Reacting to the news, a contractor Tosin Adedapo told Economic Confidential that " the price increase will make it challenging for a lot of people to afford the cement, as well as the estate contractors who will find it more difficult to afford properties".

In the same vein, Mike John, added that if the hike persist, "we will end up having more foundation of buildings that are unstructured which will lead to more collapse of buildings, causing lot of lives and properties. For instance, in my location, about 3 building collapsed of recent due to poor construction and management of cement".

# NCDMB, NNPC, IOCs sign agreement

WITH the goal of guickly ramping up Nigeria's flagging crude oil production, ensuring compliance with the provisions of the Nigerian Content Act, and timely approvals of documents, the Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board (NCDMB) on Monday in Abuja signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) cum Service Level Agreement (SLA) with the Nigerian National Petroleum Company Ltd (NNPC Ltd) and five international oilproducing companies. The SLA was conceptualised by the NCDMB and is intended to optimize the contracting cycle in the oil and gas industry and spur the speedy development of new oil and gas projects,

contributing to increased oil production and improved national economy.

The agreement was signed by the Executive Secretary of NCDMB, Engr. Simbi Kesiye Wabote, while the new Executive Vice President Upstream of the NNPC Ltd, Mr. Oritsemeyiwa A. Eyesan signed on behalf of the national oil company.

Other top industry officials who signed the agreement included the Managing Director of Shell Petroleum Development Company (SPDC) and Country Chair, of Shell Companies in Nigeria (SCiN) Mr. Osagie Okunbor, and the Chairman and Managing Director of ExxonMobil's affiliates in

Nigeria, Mr. Shane Harris. Others included the Director of Joint Ventures for Chevron Nigeria, Mr. Iwueze Cosmas; the Managing Director, Nigerian Agip Oil Company Ltd, Mr. Fabrizio Bloomfied, and the Executive Director, Joint Ventures, Total Exploration and Production Nigeria, Mr. Obi Imemba.

The Executive Secretary stated that the overall goal is to conclude the oil and gas industry's tendering to contract award processes within six months, affirming his conviction that the target is realistic with all key parties now on board with the execution of the SLA. He expressed delight that NNPC Limited signed up to the MoU, being the senior partner of the joint ventures and concessionaire of the production sharing contracts (PSC) arrangements that govern the operations of the industry.

Wabote recalled that NCDMB first introduced the 15-day Rule to the industry in 2017, when it promised that it would respond within 15 working days to any formal request for approvals in relation to projects execution. He noted that the rule was later formalized with an SLA in May 2017 with Nigeria LNG Ltd pioneering the process and breaking approval records in respect of the NLNG Train7 project.

He added that "the industry found the outcome impressive leading to the Independent Petroleum Producers Group (IPPG) signing the SLA in 2018 and Oil Producers Trade Section (OPTS) thereafter."

Wabote reaffirmed that NCDMB is a business-enabling regulator, hinting that "this is attested to by our being recognised and awarded as the most efficient amongst the MDAs in 2022 by the Presidential Enabling Business Environment Council (PEBEC). 'We are also rated PLATINUM by the Bureau for Public Service Reforms in recognition of the self-imposed reforms of our processes The NCDMB boss assured the industry that the SLA would not be an exception, adding that the Board would deliver its own part of the deal.

The SLA signed with the Nigeria LNG in 2017 was the first of its kind to be entered between a regulator and another entity in the oil and gas industry. The template was adopted for managing documentation, contracting and expatriate quota applications between the Board and international and local operating companies.

The agreement obligated NLNG to submit to the NCDMB documents like the Quarterly Job Forecast, Nigerian Content Plan, Bidders List, Nigerian Content Evaluation Criteria, Nigerian Content Technical Bid among others, while the Board had to respond on specific timelines. Should the Board fail to respond in accordance with the provisions of the SLA, the company could proceed with its tendering process after informing the Board in writing or email.

# **Deputy Governors: Spare or worthless tyres?**

The innuendos, machinations, and underbellies among the political class most often cross the bars of sanity and reasonability. It confounds the uninitiated and unearths treacherousness, backstabbing, and sometimes the inexplicable destruction of lives and properties that characterize the insatiable appetites of some politicians to wrestle, seize, sustain power or ruthlessly dislodge their perceived enemies at the slightest provocation, whether within the party or opposition. TRENDING, is the macabre dance and Bollywood blockbuster playing out in Edo State between His Excellency, Governor Godwin Obaseki and his one-time best buddy, Deputy Governor Philip Shaibu. On top of this is the returnee governor of Ondo State, His Excellency Arakunrin Rotimi Akeredolu, whose moves are rattling his deputy and causing him to run from pillar to post, as rumour is rife that the deputy lives in suspense and unaware when the axe will fall.

Not left out, the present Imo State governor showed his deputy the exit door long ago in preparation for his second stab at governance. In the same vein, the former deputy governor of Oyo State got brutally kicked out of office. And likewise, his counterparts in Zamfara in early 2022. The list is endless and cutting across the six geopolitical zones.

Unequivocally, succession contemplations invoke paralyzing and phobic reactions from most Nigerian office holders for selfconceit purposes, fear of the unknown, dictatorial tendencies, greed, institutionalizing a personal fiefdom, loyalty issues or just sheer wickedness. So, from the first republic to date, the war of calumny between the principals/leaders and their deputies is copious and welldocumented, and over time, Nigerians were treated to the ugly, bad, and worst-case scenarios as far as the subject matter is concerned.

So, speaking to facts, among the hundreds of Deputy Governors produced since the fourth republic, only a few deputies have succeeded their bosses as anointed heirs, i.e. having the blessing of their governors. Rephrasing, after 24 years of this democratic experimentation, not more than five deputy governors made it to the exalted position as governors in their states. The obvious question here, is being a deputy governor tantamount to political suicide or sentence to the political grave? In some cases, these deputies are not even allowed to vie for the National Assembly, and of course, they have outgrown the State Houses of Assembly.

It is politically dangerous to be a deputy governor in Nigeria, and little wonder, where the governors have the latitude to pick their deputies, they shop for very senior citizens trudging the departure lounge who are grateful to become a deputy, or they lure candidates with very low political energies to fill up the space, especially in cases where the party hierarchy did not impose any one on them.

The latter scenario is another kettle of fish where a strong character is drafted by the party as a deputy to balance the political zoning, religious or ethnic equations because as soon as most governors assume office, they seize the party structures and resources, transform overnight into the lords of the manor, and ruthlessly call the shots without recourse to no other. Interestingly, with the benefit of hindsight, the plight of these endangered political

species called deputies is a constitutional framing/creation or failure, making a review or reform inevitable to correct these anomalies.

Chapter Six, Part Two, Section 193 of the 1999 Constitution, spelt out unambiguously the roles of the deputy governors and are intrinsically tied to the discretion, whims and caprices of the governors, which is a bad deal for an African leader whose proclivity for absolute power is not farfetched.

The position of the law abhors vacancy or truncation of governance occasioned by ill health, sudden death, removal, or impeachment of the chief executive, and where such unforeseen circumstance occurs, the deputy steps in to save the situation. It stated how powers would be transmitted to the deputies when the principals were on vacation or could not function. However, that constitutional conjecture does not sit well with the average Nigerian politician who produces horrendous drama.


So, this is the graphic interpretation of the contemplation of section 193 - the deputies are drafted into the joint ticket, and after victory, at the polls, they assume office for four years without any clear roles but are waiting for that phone call –"please rush down to the State House fast, Mr Governor just had a stroke or a heart attack, and he is dead". The deputy sheds a few tears and resumes his destiny immediately as governor, or for some strange and impossible reasons, the State House of Assembly impeaches the governor. But on the other side of the fence, Mr Governor looks at his deputy daily and wonders why a man will take up a job that entails waiting for the other to drop dead - a simplistic nonsense, right? These are not musing for the fainthearted.

The rise and fall of the deputies are at the discretion and behest of their principals, courtesy of the law, except for a few strong characters like Senator Eyinnaya Abaribe, who took their destinies into their hands and rewrote the history of this sad tales of deputy governors, fought their governors to a standstill but not without a bloody nose.

This national dilemma also affects the office of the vice president. The former Vice President, the erudite and famed constitutional lawyer, Prof Yemi Osinbajo, one of Nigeria's finest, stepped in at the height of his principal's ill health and provided some sense of direction and leadership within that short period but was like eating the fruit in the garden of Eden and almost embarrassed after. Dr. Goodluck Jonathan almost ran out of luck when the cabals practically shot him out in the dying moments of his principal. How else can we describe the law but fittingly say the law is an ass.

If the governors work honestly and conscientiously with their deputies throughout the joint ticket, who better qualifies to continue the good work and legacy than the deputies who understood the blueprint, policies and programmes of the administration but suspicion, fear and indescribably devious thoughts overpowering the governors who transmute into vampires and seek to destroy these deputies, who most often worked tirelessly and honestly with them, like the case of Prince Eze Madumere and His Excellency Governor Rochas Okorocha, former governor of Imo State, who preferred his daughter's husband.

Indeed, most of these governors, at the twilight of their tenures, shop for their nephews, cousins, political sons, and stooges in the lower rung of the ladder – but their yeomen or man-Friday turned the fangs and ended some of their political

careers. The case of Comrade Adams Oshiomhole and his political son, presently distraught and persecuted by a similar disloyal governor to the same Osho Baba, is a Classic for keen observers and political historians.

How are deputies fit for the joint ticket but worthless to make any impact? You hear such submission that the deputies must be loyal to earn the trust – the governors are so powerful and overbearing that they can almost demand loyalty from God immediately they take power.

So, the only solution to this unnecessary problem is a constitutional amendment, and can that ever happen? Sadly, the answer is negative because the legal intricacies involved are

cumbersome. And trust me, the process can be bought by the governors. In practical terms, the roles and responsibilities of a deputy governor or Vice President should be deliberate, clearly affirmed and backed by law, or whoever takes the ticket of a deputy had just signed his political obituary.

In conclusion, Chief (Dr.) Chukwuemeka Ezeife, a former Governor of Anambra State and Special Assistant on Political Affairs to erstwhile president Olusegun Obasanjo at a seminar, invented and branded deputy governors as spare tyres! While it appeared vicious and denigrating, given section 193 of the 1999 Constitution, are these deputies spare or worthless tyres?

# 'Tinubu's Nigeria is taking its rightful place

Having hit the ground running at home, with a series of very bold and unprecedented reform decisions, President Bola Ahmed Tinubu has gone ahead to seize the opportunity offered by the month of September 2023, to make a grand entry onto the global stage. MOHAMMED IDRIS MALAGI writes.

IN what has been his busiest month on the global stage since he assumed office, President Tinubu traveled to India for the G20 Summit on the special invitation of Prime Minister Modi, made a stopover on his way back home for a crucial meeting with the leadership of the United Arab Emirates (UAE), on lingering issues of concern between UAE and Nigeria, and then traveled to New York to make his debut at the most important annual gathering of Heads of State, the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA).

At the UN, in a delivery reminiscent of the powerful and iconic 'Africa Has Come Of Age' speech by the late Head of State, General Murtala Muhammed, almost five decades ago, President Tinubu caught the attention of a listening world with his emphasis on an equal and mutually beneficial relationship between Africa and the world, instead of one defined by condescension, pity and greed.

The President spoke boldly for the entire African continent, tracing the history of the post-World War 2 global system, starting with a Marshall Plan that helped redeem Europe. Asking for a 21st century equivalent for that Plan, President Tinubu added, "We realize that underlying conditions and causes of the economic challenges facing today's Africa are significantly different from those of post war Europe. We are not asking for identical programs and actions. What we seek is an equally firm commitment to partnership. We seek enhanced international cooperation with African nations to achieve the 2030 agenda and Sustainable Development Goals."

At every engagement, he has taken the time to remind the world of just how significant his first four months in office have been, in terms of laying the foundation for unlocking levels of economic growth and prosperity that we have always been capable of, but have sadly remained a pipe dream.

He ended a costly and wasteful fuel subsidy regime that has, over the decades, deprived the country of tens of billions of dollars in potential infrastructure and human capital investments. He also commenced an overhaul of the Central Bank of Nigeria, (CBN) shaking up the leadership of the bank and supporting it to abolish an inefficient system of multiple exchange rates, which, like the petrol subsidy, has seen

The President is being supported in his many onerous assignments by a very energetic and committed Cabinet. In the my colleagues for events at the UN General Assembly, and can testify to the remarkable levels of determination within the cabinet, to solve Nigeria's problems with the support and cooperation of the global community.

From the global business executives he has held meetings with this month—Exxon Mobil, Bharti Enterprises, Oracle, Hinduja Group, Indorama, Skipper Seil, and others—he has received pledges amounting to several billions of dollars in new investments. This cannot be overemphasized: at the end of the day, one of our administration's overriding goals is to attract new investment that will create jobs and wealth for the people of Nigeria.





# Has democracy fail in the African continent?

In August, when a group of Gabonese military officers deposed President Ali Bongo, whose family had ruled the country for nearly six decades, many ordinary citizens came out on the streets to celebrate. KENT MENSAH writes.

WHEN Bongo put out a call for the international community to "make noise" against the coup, it quickly turned into a meme mocking him, with dancers and content creators ridiculing his desire to stay in power.

Neither the military putsch in Gabon nor the street response to it are unique. Since 2020, there have been nine coups in West Africa, Central Africa and the Sahel region.

Mali opened the floodgates three years ago when the army staged a mutiny and subsequently undertook a coup led by Colonel Assimi Goita who then followed up with another coup against an interim administration in May 2021.

Four months later, in September, Guinea followed with a military coup against President Alpha Conde. Sudan's civilian-military transitional government was overthrown in October 2021. Earlier that year, in April, Chad's army seized power after President Idriss Deby was killed on the battlefield while visiting troops fighting rebels in the north.

Burkina Faso joined this pattern of collapsing governments, with two military coups in 2022. Then, on July 26, 2023, the presidential guard in uranium-rich Niger overthrew democratically elected President Mohamed Bazoum, before the Gabon coup a few weeks later. Since the beginning of last year, The Gambia, Guinea-Bissau, and Sao Tome and Principe have all witnessed failed coup attempts.

In many – though not all – of these instances, these uprisings and coups appear to have had significant popular support from civilians.

So, are people fed up with civilianled governments even though they are often at least notionally democratic? Is Africa on the cusp of more coups? And how much of a factor are international players, whether former colonial powers like France or mercenaries from Russia, or regional groupings like the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS)?

The short answer: Weak democratic processes have often failed nations in Francophone West Africa and the Sahel in particular, resulting in deepening inequality, corrupt administrations and fragile ethnic and cultural accords, according to experts. Those conditions, in turn, attract paternalistic superpowers that are keen to extend their influence. This combination of economic, political and social challenges makes the region especially vulnerable to coups.

It's not just images and videos of people celebrating coups – hard data suggests a wide gap between the lived experience of democracy in large parts of the continent and the hopes people have pinned on the system of governance.

A vast majority of people from 34 African countries polled by the welcome a military government. independent political survey outfit Afrobarometer in September 2022 said they believed regular, honest fact that democracy hasn't delivered and open elections were the best the expectations of the local guarantor of their interests. But only 44 percent said elections help voters remove leaders who don't do what the people want. In 19 countries polled regularly since 2008-09, sentiments against elections as enablers of change have risen 6

Overall, support for elections has dropped in 26 of 30 African countries surveyed between 2011 and 2021.

But even in a country like South Africa, which has had consistent, largely free and fair elections since the end of apartheid, the support for elections has dropped 20 percentage points over the past decade.

According to Jonathan Asante-Otchere, a political analyst and lecturer at Ghana's University of Cape Coast, citizens in many countries "are not seeing the dividends of democracy". That is a key reason, he said, "why the coup makers seem to enjoy that kind of support", though Asante-Otchere also cautioned that it is unclear whether that support will last.

Corruption, human rights abuses, ethnocentrism and the militarisation of civilian politics - with armoured cars and boots on the ground used to quell civilian protests - have long blighted democratic experiments on the continent. "I think it's largely because of the economic situations within the subregion, especially in those countries," Anim, of the Accra-based Policy Initiative of Economic Development Africa. "The reasons are a high cost of living and people not getting jobs but seeing their political elite living very well."

However, experts believe there are other reasons behind public support for coups, too.

In the case of Bongo in Gabon, or the longtime president of Burkina Faso, Blaise Compaore, who was overthrown in 2014, popular sentiments in favour of the end of their rules helped legitimise military interventions.

In some instances, say experts, coups lead only to changes in rulers among the pre-existing elite that dominated the nation.

Sudan's 2021 coup saw the country's army, which had been part of a military-civilian coalition government since the 2019 revolution against former President Omar al-Bashir, grab direct power.

In Gabon, too, the main opposition leader has described Bongo's

overthrow as a "palace coup"; Brice Nguema, the military leader who led the uprising, is Bongo's cousin, and has allowed the removed president to travel without restrictions. It is an assessment with which Dave Peterson, senior director of the Africa Programme at the National Endowment for Democracy (NED), said he agrees. Peterson told Al Jazeera the Gabon coup was "a

change in hats", nothing more.

Yet, in other countries, regional instability has played a major role in creating the conditions that have allowed military takeovers to succeed - especially since 2011 and the violent overthrow of Muammar Gaddafi in Libya.

"Clearly, if you want to go back in terms of events, the collapse of the Gaddafi regime in Libya began to exacerbate the insecurity in Mali and across the Sahel," said Peterson. The chaos and power vacuum in Libya led to a proliferation of weapons and armed fighters across the Sahel region, including into northern Mali.

Chad has also been significantly affected by the conflicts in Libya and Sudan. The government-backed Sudanese militia known as the Janiaweed, which in 2013 morphed into the Rapid Support Forces armed

group that is currently battling Sudan's military for power, has been active across the country's borders.

The fighting in Sudan has also forced hundreds of thousands of refugees to seek shelter in eastern Chad. Idriss Deby, Chad's longtime leader, was killed in fighting in 2021 with rebels who had crossed over from Libya: Deby's death precipitated the military takeover.

But whether it is domestic challenges or the ripple effects of wars in another country, federal governments across the region have responded with political violence that has further escalated tensions, claimed civilian lives and livelihoods, and made the pursuit of lasting peace harder, say analysts. It's symbolic of an administrative state that views itself as a hammer and any problem at all, a nail.

This conception of the state as a tool to force obedience and adherence is, however, limited by the fact that governments are often incapable of preventing rebels from acquiring the ammunition and logistics for full-scale wars.

And when that happens, they frequently end up seeking support from global powers like France, and in recent times, Russia.

# Depression: More citizens battle mental illness

In light of the prevailing socioeconomic circumstances in the country, more Nigerians are going into depression. In this report by VINCENT KURAUN, medical experts explained why many Nigerians experience mental health conditions that involve the continual feeling of sadness, irritability, hopelessness and recurring thought of suicide

DEPRESSIVE disorder (also known as depression) is a common mental disorder that involves a depressed mood, persistent sadness or loss of pleasure or interest in activities for a long period, according to the World Health Organisation (WHO).

Its symptoms include a loss of energy, a change in appetite, sleeping more or less, anxiety, reduced concentration, indecisiveness, restlessness, feelings of worthlessness, guilt, or hopelessness. These symptoms if left untreated could lead to thoughts of self-harm or suicide even though, there is effective treatment for mild, moderate and severe depression

Giving a breakdown of widespreadness of the disorder, the WHO in its report claims that globally, an estimated five per cent of adults suffer from depression with more women being affected than men. In Nigeria, for instance, a 2018 study conducted by the Mind, Behavior, and Development Unit take it easy. They may see it at the while speaking with Sunday Tribune, (eMBeD) of the World Bank, gave a disturbing outlook of the health issue in the country. The report shows that one in every five Nigerians is depressed. This figure accounts for an average of 22 per cent of the Nigerian population who are chronically depressed.

"The first signal that tells us there is so much depression is when people become hypertensive, easily irritated, they are unable to control their emotions," a professor of clinical psychology at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka, Chuka Ifeagwazi, explained to Sunday Tribune while reacting to the question on why many Nigerians are going into depression.

According to him: "Wherever you look, you see people shouting at one another. Sometimes, they get into too many fights in a day over little things that could have been amicably

"When you have these signals, you look at the people and you can tell that nothing interests them in life anymore. It is as if there is a dark cloud hanging all over the horizon. You are not able to picture the future; you are not able to find any reason to be cheerful and you don't want to celebrate.

'You look at every aspect of life and you don't seem to know where you not in schools, not in the marketplace, not at petrol stations. The more you visit petrol stations, markets, or even church to commune with God, the more your depression heightens. It appears that there is no hope in sight.

# Ways social isolation affects your mental health

FOR people of all ages, social connection is vital to survival. We're hardwired to depend on one another for support. When we don't get the connection we need, we're sadder, sicker, and more at risk of early death.

This lack of connection is more common than many people realize. According to a survey conducted in January 2020, more than three out of five Americans feel chronically lonely.

It's normal for anyone who feels socially isolated to struggle with mental health, but there are steps you can take to cope with isolation and feel more connected.

There is impact of social isolation on your mental health.

Social isolation can affect nearly every aspect of your mental health. Studies show that feelings of isolation can be linked to suicidal thoughts and suicide attempts.

Less restful sleep, decreased ability to regulate eating, more stress, especially in the morning, greater difficulty paying attention and doing complex tasks, people of all ages are vulnerable to the effects of social isolation. If you experience loneliness as a preteen or teenager, for example, you're more likely to struggle with depression in adulthood.

Older adults are vulnerable emotionally and cognitively. Social isolation can cause up to a 40% increase in dementia risk.

Coping With Social Isolation.

No matter how old you are, it's important to recognize when you struggle with social isolation.



Noticing is the first step to developing healthy coping mechanisms. To cope with social isolation, try to acknowledge your feelings. Sometimes it seems easier to ignore your feelings when you're struggling, especially when it feels like you have no one to talk to. Take some time to acknowledge that things are hard. If you need to, reach out to a therapist.

Get outside. Being outdoors is beneficial to your mental and physical health. The natural light can help to boost your mood and the vitamin D in sunlight can ease symptoms of depression. Reconnect with your interests. If you find you have more time to

yourself, think about what solo fine without you. It's a common hobbies you used to enjoy or always wanted to take up. Pursuing a new hobby can redirect your mind and give you something positive to think

Practice self-care. It's important to counteract the stress responses that come with social isolation. Stress can cause problems with your breathing, blood pressure, muscles, and more. Take the time to relax in a way that works for you, whether that's a warm bath and soothing music or a meditation program. Check in with people you know. When you've been isolated, it's easy to feel that people are doing Choose the right living

Develop friendships at work. Work relationships can help you to feel more connected to others. Overall, people with better coworker relationships have lower self-reported loneliness scores,



can permanently damage your hearing in only 30 minutes. But it's not just your ears: Hearing loss in older adults is linked to brain problems, such as Alzheimer's and loss of brain tissue. This may be because your brain has to work so hard to understand what's being said around you that it can't store what you've heard into memory. So turn it down -- no louder than 60% of your device's maximum volume --



### Why restructuring remains essential Nigeria: By Cheta Nwanze

To address these structural flaws and improve governance in Nigeria, there is an urgent need for constitutional amendments that would allow for a fundamental reshaping of the national structure to create one that leaves Nigeria with presidents who gain enough votes to be legitimate and a devolution that allows for truly federal governance models.

The federal and state administrations ushered in via the recently held elections have been having their 100-day anniversaries. While the Lagos State government has tried to celebrate its controversial re-election with the launching of a Lagos Metro that took almost two decades to complete but has electric trains being pulled by a diesel engine painted to look like a metro train, it yet looked rather sophisticated in comparison to the endeavour of the Kano State Government, which recently approved a budget of \\$54 million for the first phase of the Auren Zaurawa - the Mass Wedding Initiative that offers financial assistance to young couples who cannot afford to pay for their own weddings. The budget will go to the wedding expenses of 1,800 couples who also get ₩20,000 to start businesses. But this grant amounts to a total of ₦36,000,000 a measly 4.21% of the ₦854 million budgeted for the event that will take place at the Sani Abacha Stadium later this month.

One has to ask if a mass wedding of this nature and cost actually belongs on a list of the priorities of Kano State. A couple of years ago, the state had the most out-of-school children in Nigeria, on the basis of the research of the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), which stated that 1,496,736 children were out of school in Kano State at that time. According to the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS), Kano State has 10.51 million people living in poverty, which is 66.3 per cent of its estimated population of 15.9 million people. The state had an unemployment rate of 26.8 per cent and an underemployment rate of 25.8 per cent in the second quarter of 2020, which means that more than half of the labour force in Kano State was either unemployed or

underemployed, and the economic downturn faced by Nigeria since then hasn't offered the opportunity for improvement for them. The state government has budgeted ₩1.2 billion to combat the deadly malaria scourge, and ₦500 million has been earmarked to complete the state's cancer treatment centre. These healthcare initiatives are of much greater importance and will serve the needs of people even into the long term, but the mass-wedding programme has a budget that is 50% of their combined budgetary allocation.

This bizarre wastefulness is a pattern seen with Nigerian state governments, and at this point, we have to accept that the only way to achieve a positive wholesale change in governance is to totally reset the national structure into a format that provides the different tiers with the appropriate motivation to act properly.

Nigeria, Africa's most populous country and largest economy, is facing a crisis of governance and legitimacy. The recent presidential election, which was supposed to usher in a new era of democracy and development, was instead marred by widespread irregularities, violence, and low turnout. Bola Tinubu was declared the election assemblies saw one in five, one in six and one winner with only 36.61 per cent of the votes cast, far below the 51 per cent required by the constitution to avoid a runoff. His main challengers, Atiku Abubakar and Peter Obi, rejected the results and filed petitions at the Presidential Election Tribunal, alleging massive fraud and manipulation. The court dismissed the petitions, but many Nigerians remain unconvinced by its verdict.

The presidential election was not the only source of controversy and discontent. The state and local government elections, which were held separately from the presidential poll, also revealed deep divisions and dissatisfaction among the electorate. Many state governors were accused of rigging the elections in their favour, using their control of the security forces, electoral commissions, and

protests and legal challenges from their own party members, who felt sidelined or betrayed by their actions. While none of the gubernatorial results has been overturned, a few legislature results have been annulled, even if they go almost unnoticed. This relative silence regarding the state and legislature appeals is what has gotten to me.

The poor accountability, and thus the generally poor performance of state governments, can be directly tied to this overweening interest in the Executive in Abuja and it is one of the major problems facing Nigeria today. Despite receiving a large share of the country's oil revenues, most states have failed to deliver basic services and infrastructure to their citizens.

Before the general elections, SBM Intelligence partnered with the Enough is Enough Coalition to conduct a countrywide survey on the elections, and we found that most people were uninterested in the downballot elections. While all our respondents had something to say about the presidential election, only a third of them were interested in the governorship elections. It was further downhill from there, as interest in the Senate, House of Representatives and state in seven respondents answering questions put to them about those polls.

Some governors even faced current political system in Nigeria is highly centralised, giving the Federal Government enormous powers and responsibilities over a wide range of issues, including security, the economy, education, health, and justice. The Federal Government also collects most of the country's revenues from oil and taxes. and distributes them to the states and local governments according to a complex formula that is often contested and politicised.

This is not helped by the fact that people are so mindful of the Federal Government that they do not put enough attention and pressure on the facets that actually lie within the legal reach of the lower tiers of governance at the state and local government levels, which are actually in the best position to impact directly on the people.

This system creates a dependency culture among state governments, relying on federal allocations rather than generating revenues from productive activities. This is why Kano State would operate as it has opted. The current system also reduces the subnational units' accountability to their citizens, who have little say or influence over how their resources are spent or managed. Moreover, it fosters a winner-takes-all mentality among the political elites, who see control over the Federal Government as the ultimate prize and source of patronage.

My biggest disappointment in the Tinubu government thus far is not that they are in power, but that for so long, the South-West wing of the APC noisily talked about restructuring Nigeria and the devolution of powers and has gone completely silent about it now that it has the federal power. If this wing truly comprises of the progressives that they claim to be, they should know that it is important to grant more autonomy and fiscal responsibility to state and local governments...

# Nigerians expecting much from an ineffective legislature

A legislature that is alive to its roles and responsibilities is a symbol of hope, a shield and a voice for the people. It is marked by robust debates, strict commitment to checks and balances, and deliberate accountability to the people. Also, it confers legitimacy on the government because governance is productive and the citizens are fulfilled. Mon-Charles Egbo writes.

HOWEVER, in developing nations, the legislature is defined by weak institutional capacity. It faces the challenges of executive dominance, public trust deficit, poor democratic culture manifesting as a weak electoral system and disrespect to democratic tenets and then disruptions through elections, leading to a high turnover of legislators.

And, central to all these issues are a weak constitution, a low level of morality in politics as well as poor knowledge of the duties of the parliament.

To begin with, Nigeria's situation validates the assertion that any constitution midwifed by the military is as faulty as it is anti-democracy. It does not offer the legislature the necessary support for true independence and effective supervision of the executive.

For example, mere legislative refusal of consent cannot stop the executive from borrowing and or engaging in non-budgeted expenditures. Equally, the muchtouted powers to override the presidency on critical issues exist merely on paper in the same manner that executive appointees can hold offices without legislative confirmation. And again, legislative summons and resolutions are brazenly ignored because the legislature does not possess the instruments to effectively enforce compliance.



# How to boost living standards

The growing cost of living is having an effect internationally. In various ways, it is certain that costs and bills are continuing to climb sharply, including the number of Impoverished on the African continent. TIMI OLUBIYI writes.



THOUGH the cost of food, household products, and other necessities has risen widely in recent years, from Delhi to Shanghai, Rome, Manchester, Dubai, Houston, Mexico City, Belfast, Islamabad, Dublin, and Manila, to mention a few, the effect has been greatest in Africa.

Here, the standard of living and the quality of life continue to deteriorate. This price increase has been on the rise as a result of the new coronavirus (COVID-19) in some parts of the world and the conflict in Ukraine. It is continuing to reduce the population of those with accessible discretionary income. In Nigeria for instance, a quality loaf of bread that was N350 in 2020 is now over N1,000 which is a 300% increase in just three years. Similar percentage increases are in the cost of flight tickets, health care, rent and energy cost (fuel).

A bag of rice, a crate of eggs, a kilo of chicken or turkey and many other essentials have increased their prices due to inflation. Yet, income has remained the same or even less. Nothing is cheap, and everything is out of reach for the majority of people.

Given the country's current position, which is similar to that of many other African countries, and the fact that many individuals have not experienced an increase in their income, this has resulted in lower or no savings, increasing irritation, mental health difficulties, and unhappiness

These are drug stores that are stocked to the brim, giving an erroneous impression of a pharmacy, as people patronize them, thinking that these are registered pharmacies where they could get quality drugs and pharmaceutical services.

"We are currently addressing quackery on these two bases. The Pharmaceutical Society of Nigeria in collaboration with Pharmacy Council of Nigeria, through the Pharmaceutical Inspectorate Committee, established in all the 36 states of the federation including FCT, go out routinely for monitoring and inspection, to ensure that we tackle this problem of quackery we have in our society. You will agree with me that this will require a lot of resources.

When we go on routine monitoring and inspection, and we discover that a facility is existing illegally, it is outright shut down and sealing. Then those that are not existing illegally which are licensed by the Pharmacy Council

non-educated, presenting of Nigeria for the purpose of to the community, but are falling short of the standard they are expected to operate, those facilities will be given what we call "compliance directive" within a specific time frame for them to meet up.

"If they are unable to meet up, we shut them down too. These are measures that we put in place to ensure that we have sanity in healthcare delivery.

For individuals that are not pharmaceutical practice, they are made to face the full wrath of the law when they are caught. This is what led to shutting down of over 100 medicine stores operating illegally and also arresting those who are quacks in the system within the year".

# As lone away fan leads club to glory

TIAGO Rech has watched Santa Cruz for as long as he can remember, even when he was famously the only one. But right now, on the final day of the 2023 Campeonato Gaucho Serie A2, he can hardly bear to do

The Brazilian club's season has all come down to this: one kick, one penalty to settle a shootout and send the club back to the state top flight for the first time in a decade.

For Tiago, though, this is the culmination of something far greater - a lifelong love affair that has taken him in directions he could not possibly have imagined.

It has brought him a brief moment of global fame, a remarkable Football Manager-esque rise to becoming president of the club in his 20s before suffering near financial ruin and depression as they slipped to relegation and near oblivion.

But this is not a story that deserves an unhappy ending. All midfielder Mauricio has to do is score and the fairytale is complete. In the stands, Tiago Rech watches and waits.

It was an act of watching and waiting that brought Tiago the 15 minutes of fame to set this whole ball rolling 21 years ago.

Born just five blocks from the club's 5,000-capacity stadium in Santa Cruz do Sul, he was a regular on the concrete steps of Estadio dos online coverage and a YouTube clip Platanos from the age of 10, eating a hot dog and watching his team play with his father.

As he entered his teens, school, university and then a job on a campaign, Santa Cruz had just been newspaper eventually led him to a life in state capital Porto Alegre 120km away and a reduced diet of

"When I got to the stadium I went to the space reserved for our side and I went up to the ticket office and asked if any of the Santa Cruz fan base had arrived yet. This was 20 minutes before the game.

"The security said no, but I thought it's still early it takes two hours from Santa Cruz, maybe they were late so I went in and sat down, waiting for the game to start and for the rest of the fans to arrive.

"Then the game began and no one came. Five minutes went by, then 10 and then at 15 minutes in, Santa Cruz scores the first goal. And I'm there celebrating, I mean, slightly embarrassed because I'm the only one there.'

The television team watching the game soon noticed the lone figure in game soon noticed the lone figure in sponsors, just a general lack of the away end and picked him out. support." That was when Tiago's phone started buzzing with calls and texts Friday - a tradition since the 1980s from his parents and friends.

"The game went on and Gremio scored so then it was one all then 2-1 then 3-1 and in the end they won 4-1. And I'm just there on my own, the whole time," continues Tiago.

The next morning, an image of him sat alone in the stand, a half-drunk plastic cup next to him, was on the season and then starting all over front page of the paper at which he worked. "Don't Leave Me Alone" read the headline.

But a chance meeting with the then club president gave him the chance more. They got chatting, Tiago told him he was out of work and a job offer was made in return.

With players operating to seasonlong contracts, there were only four people employed by the club at that time - the president, manager, a supervisor and secretary. Tiago ostensibly as their communication and marketing man, but eager to branch out into every area possible.

"I would look for sponsors, I would talk to the fire brigade about security and to the police. So I did much more than just communications," he says. "I joke that that I would end up taking the corner, heading the ball in the box, and then racing to the back to defend."

This was a crash course in football administration, one that enabled Tiago to marry his passion-driven ideas to the practical reality of achieving them.

'When I was just a fan I would always be criticising from the stands," he says. "Why didn't the team grow? Why were we such a small club?

"But now I could see the difficulties of being a little football club, trying to survive - you're dealing with a lack of money, lack of resources, lack of

He attended club dinners on a to rub shoulders with directors and political figures of the city, including the mayor.

Relationships were built and ideas shared. Tiago's revolutionary plan was for the club to move away from the constant churn of contracting players and a manager for one short again the following year. He felt they should play all year round, with a more consistent playing staff.

It intrigued the Santa Cruz

time came to elect a new president there was only one man for the job the 27-year-old fan turned club employee.

"I had dreamed for a long time about the idea that one day I would be president of the club," admits

"I always say it's not an accident that I became president at 27. The club wasn't doing well, the directors were very old, we needed new people and they could see I wanted it so I got elected.'

His father took more convincing, having seen the negative impact the role had taken on friends of his, but ultimately backed his son's dream. It quickly became a nightmare.

"To begin with it was great, explains Tiago. "We got some good players, I got some new sponsors, we started winning but by the third month things were going wrong

"We started to run out of money, the games were happening in the winter and it gets very cold here, it rains, so there weren't so many fans coming to the matches which meant we were selling fewer tickets and in the end it got very hard.'

Debts began to pile up. Tiago asked his father for a loan to pay players, he maxed out credit cards

and put all of his savings into the club money his parents had helped him amass to use to buy an apartment.

Santa Cruz avoided relegation but Tiago's one year of presidency had taken a heavy toll.

"I got very depressed," he says. "When the championship was over I would stay in bed all day. I was just sad and so down, to the extent that I had to go to the doctor and get medication to try and get better.

"In the end the doctor and my dad came to the decision that I needed to stop running the club that I needed go back to my old life.

So that is what he did. He got treatment for his depression, moved back to Port Alegre, returned to journalism and became just a humble fan of Santa Cruz once more.

Unfortunately, the club's fortunes did not improve. After seasons of struggle, they were relegated to the third tier in 2018, prompting suggestions they may have to fold.

It was around this time that Tiago returned to his home town and bumped into an old friend, a local business owner, who made a crazy but desperate plea to him - that the club would close unless he came back as president.

Despite all that had gone before, he

decided to take up the challenge, but this time armed with lessons from the past. They built slowly, accrued sponsors, paid off debts.

"It really helped that our players came from the city, so the community supported us - families would come to the game so we had fans and an income and we started to be able to pay off our bills," says

It is a testament to the work done that even a global pandemic that interrupted two seasons was unable to halt their progress. In fact, it may even have helped the club to a

In September 2020, it was decided that a shortened championship season would take place, with only 10 teams participating. The absence of some of the bigger clubs enabled Santa Cruz to convince members of their squads to come and play for

With their help, three months later the club won their first-ever title the Copa Federacao Gaucha de


