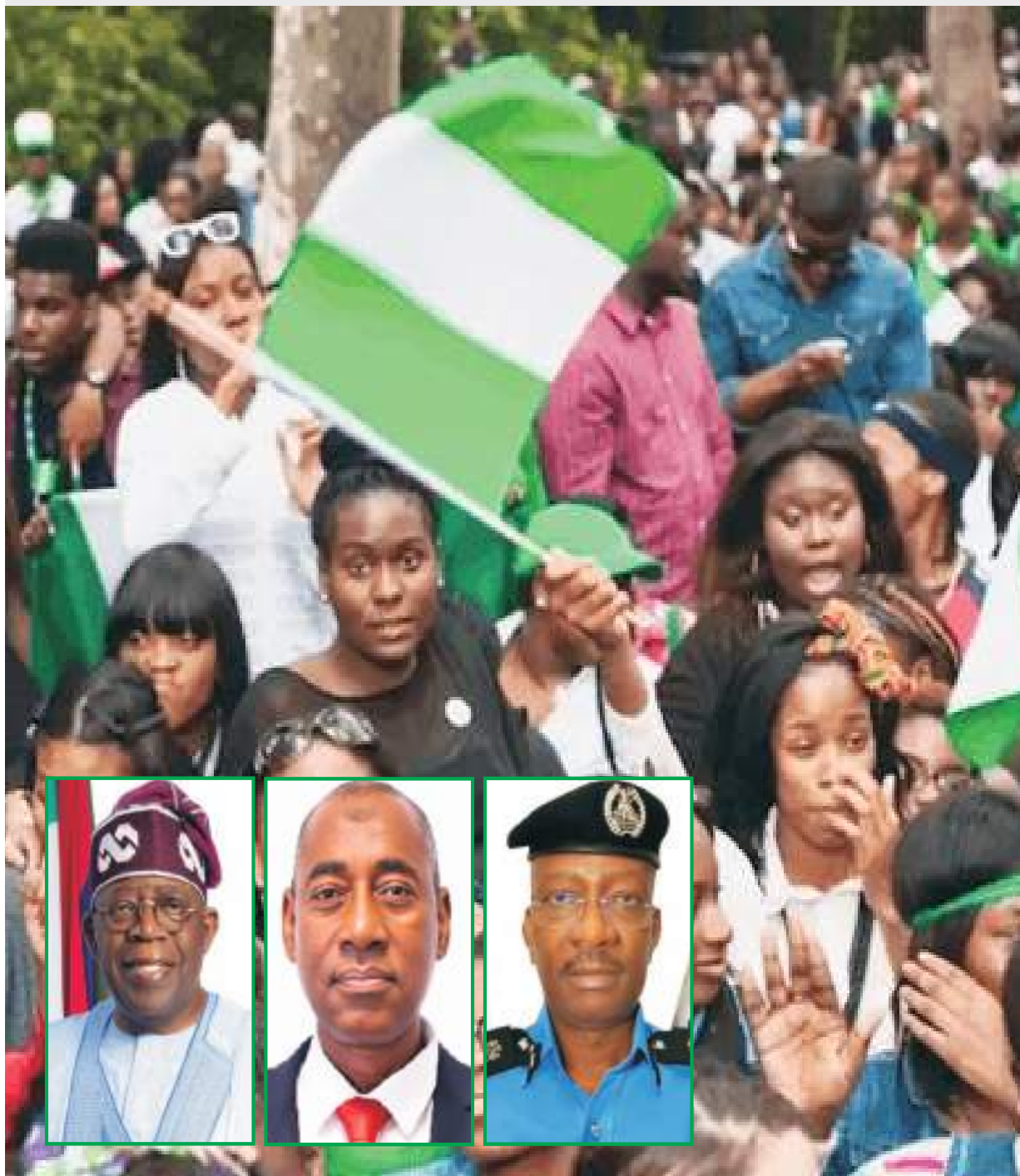

On FG to pay 500m for release of inmates

RECENTLY, the Minister of Interior, Dr. Olubunmi Tunde-Ojo said that the ministry intends to clear over N500 million fines slammed on inmates at the Correction Centres by judges and magistrates in various custodial centres nationwide.

ACCORDING to the Minister, a committee was setup with the aim of reviewing the situation of correctional centres, vis-à-vis the inmates as they are, and discovered that over 4,000 inmates are still in custody due to their inability to pay fines.

THE decision of the minister to decongest the correctional centres is quite commendable. We call for a review of the plan or alternative decongestion plans or policies are considered.

IT is on record that the federal government had released 7,813 inmates from the Nigeria Correctional Centres across the country during the outbreak of Covid-19 to curb the spread of the virus among the inmates. The convicts and awaiting trial were granted amnesty and released on the orders of former president Muhammadu Buhari as part of the prison decongestion policy of the federal government.

SPECIFICALLY, the minister should request the president and various governors to exercise their prerogative of mercy by granting pardon to the 4,000 convicts on ground of impecuniosities to facilitate their immediate release from custody.

ACCORDINGLY, the minister may also wish to request the Chief Justice of Nigeria and Chief Judges of all the states and the Federal Capital Territory to visit the correctional centres and exercise their powers under the criminal Justice Release from custody Special provision act by ordering the release of the inmates whose detention is either manifestly unlawful or who have been in custody, whether on remand or otherwise, for periods longer than the maximum period of imprisonment which they could have served had they been convicted.

ACCORDINGLY, using the N500m on improving the welfare of inmates, improving the structures of the centres, educating or training the inmates is a better way of judiciously spending the money.

HOWEVER, it is pertinent to draw the attention of the minister to the plight of the scores of inmates who are languishing in all Correctional Centres as their case files were burnt during the #EndSARS protest. The immediate release of such inmates since the state can no longer prosecute them as their cases have been burnt.

CONSEQUENTLY the mechanisms for reducing prison congestion should be considered. In order to reducing the number of offenders in prisons, shortening the time of offenders and increasing system capacity.

ALTERNATIVELY, inmates should, as part of punishment, be made to pay through community services instead of spending such amount of money to pay for their crimes.

A former Justice of the Supreme Court, Justice Muhammad Datijo, has called for the reduction of the powers of the Chief Justice of Nigeria (CJN)....This, he said, would prevent abuse of office.

Justice Datijo made the call at his valedictory court session held to mark his retirement from the apex court bench, having attained the statutory retirement age of 70 years.

He linked the negative perception of the judiciary to the appointment of judicial officers, claiming that appointments have been polluted by political, selfish and section

He said, "As presently structured, the CJN is Chairman of the National Judicial Commission which oversees both the appointment and discipline of judges. He is equally the chair of the Federal Judicial Service Commission, the National Judicial Institute, and the Legal Practitioners Privileges Committee that appoints Senior Advocates of Nigeria.

"My considered opinion: the oversight functions of these bodies should not rest on an individual alone. A person with absolute powers, it is said, corrupts easily and absolutely.

As chair of the NJC, FJSC, NJI, and LPPC, appointments as council, board, and committed members are at his pleasure. He either confers with fellow justices nor seeks their counsel or input on any matter related to these bodies; he has both the final and the only say.

"The CJN has the power to appoint 80 per cent of members of the council and 60 per cent of members of FJSC. The same applies to NJI and LPPC."

He said such enormous powers "are effortlessly abused".

"This needs to change. Continued denial of the existence of this threatening anomaly weakens effective judicial oversight in the country. Appropriate steps could have been taken earlier to fill outstanding vacancies in the apex court.

"Why have these steps not been timeously taken? It is evident that the decision not to fill the vacancies in the court is deliberate. It is all about the absolute powers vested in the office of the CJN and the responsible exercise of the same," he said.

He claimed that the judiciary he exited is far from the one he voluntarily joined and desired to serve and be identified with.

He said: "A couple of years ago, appointment to the bench was strictly on merit. Sound knowledge of the law, integrity, honour and hard work distinguished those who were elevated. Lobbying was unheard of. I never lobbied, not at any stage of my career, to secure any appointment or elevation. As much as possible, the most qualified men and women were appointed. That can no longer be said about appointments to

the bench.

The judiciary must be uniquely above board. Appointments should not be polluted by political, selfish and sectional interests. The place of merit, it must be urged, cannot be overemphasized

The Niger State-born jurist, who spent 43 years in the judiciary, noted that with his retirement, Justices on the bench of the apex court have reduced to 10, with two regions of the country not represented.

FG launches CNG buses initiative nationwide

THE Federal Government, on Friday, launched the Compressed Natural Gas, CNG, Initiative with the handing over of two CNG-fuelled buses to the management of the State House

At the official launch of the initiative at Presidential Villa, Abuja, Chairman of the Presidential Compressed Natural Gas Initiative (P-CNGI), Mr. Zacch Adedeji, performed the handing over ceremony.

He disclosed that the launch also involved the opening of seven pilot conversion centres nationwide.

Adedeji, who is also the Chairman of the Federal Inland Revenue Service, FIRS, further stated that the government had waived the Value Added Tax, VAT, on CNG purchases as well as seeking duty waivers for value-chain.

Adedeji was represented by the Chief Executive Officer of the Midstream and Downstream Petroleum Regulatory Authority, NMDPRA, Mr Farouk Ahmed.

He said that plans were underway for the government to establish multiple conversion centres across the country in the next two weeks.

According to him, "I'm pleased to announce that there are currently seven conversion centres in Nigeria. And the government is actively working to establish more of them. These plans will be rolled out, starting this afternoon, by the initiative.

"This project is not only about conversion of vehicles but also about generating employment opportunities.

"It demonstrates President Bola Tinubu's commitment to both environmental



"Queuing has become common place. Nigerians had thought the currency swap would be less problematic, even as our country men and women never thought it would get to the level that we have reached. The Central Bank of Nigeria is reported to have been prepared for it, yet I thought we should have seen the preparations come to place, but not in the sufferings that were meted on all of us."

WHAT stands out as Nigeria's major characteristic is our proclivity for long queues. Whether positively or negatively inclined, it is a dark spot for the country's development, and a need to ensure that we are worried for it.

Today, everywhere one turns to in Nigeria, such a one is sadly greeted with queues that have defied all known solution. If you want fuel, one must queue for hours to get it. Go to the pharmacy store or the hospital, if you are not ready to queue, you may return with nothing in your hand.

Nigerians in all states have had a raw deal concerning long fuel queues that have lasted for almost a year, while no one has suggested the reason for it. From refineries that have refused to work, to official theft and corruption; it does appear that nothing is needed to be done to stem the tide.

It is perhaps only in Nigeria that you must wake up at three am to go and queue for money. The queues increased as soon as the currency swap began. While it is understood that the new development is a good omen, whoever designed it must have expected Nigerians to suffer, otherwise, pray, why it is difficult to get the new naira notes despite assurances.

The way and manner it is being implemented, one would have thought that the government planned to make the people suffer. Everyone is feeling the pain in the land and it has affected almost all Nigerians who need money for their economic activities. But the politicians need it most to prosecute their campaigns.

It does appear that for some time, the Nigerian people will continue to be in pains, what with the fact that a lot of things are needed to fix the development. While the government wants to settle the excessive use of money in politics, there are people who are benefitting from the pains of lack of money. The banks with their various heads are reported to be in sync with the politicians that have tried to circumvent the new policy. Whether this is true or not, nothing can be far from it as the politicians, who often use money for campaigns are finding the waters so hot to handle without available cash in hand.

stopped. Many understand that the new policy is for the good of all, only a few Nigerians find it hard to reciprocate, and government says; the few are the ones antagonizing the policy.

No day passes without observing the preponderance of queues at banks in the local government headquarters. In the end, what came out from the experience was an eye opener, telling graphically the shape of things to come if the government did not get worried to nib it in the bud.

Characteristically of Nigerians, everything was left to chance; even government may have believed that the noise would be made for a time, and before long, it would subside and die naturally. That must have been the greatest mistake may have made, as the frustration of Nigerians soon became manifest; they lashed on that to become violent; dealing blows to people and institutions.

Many of us remember with nostalgia what happened during the End SARS protest. Government and the security agencies took the menacing frustration of Nigerians for granted. By the time it got to the point of assuring Nigerians that something would be done, it was late for the protesters to return home. However, the deed had been done by then; today, when the losses are recounted, many would have wished it didn't take place.

No doubt, it was a lesson for all. While we are saying this may not be like the SARS protest, the need to be circumspect is worth considering by all. Reports have it that many financial institutions were set ablaze in the last two weeks on account of the difficulties Nigerians are going through.

To think that government would wait until the situation got out of hand is to underestimate the tone of the problem; and the fighting power of the people. Get this clear: No government prays for crisis on its head. As such, on February 17, 2023, President Muhammadu Buhari addressed Nigerians on the

situation and appealed that government was also worried about what Nigerians were going through.

And as many had thought, an address by the President came in to douse the frustration. Whether it did or not is left to be seen in the next 60 days. Just three or more days after the presidential address, only a few understand the reason behind the new naira policy swap.

The fact that it is still difficult to get cash means that we have more harsh days ahead of us. The banks and POS are dry but with many waiting on the queues for what are not available for them. In this situation, it is expected that the banks should be given sufficient cash to dispense to their customers.

If this is not made possible, more Nigerians, in their desperation will cut the neck of the next available customer. Much has been seen done in this regard, even as it is regrettable that Nigerians have used the situation to make profits at the expense of their countrymen. While they have made more money derived from their charges, they have no regard for what their customers are made to go through.

It is true that several families do not have the new notes let alone the old. Feeding for many families has become a problem; business owners are lamenting the losses they have incurred in the last three weeks of going forth and back. The policy summersault, by all intents and purposes, should, according to the Central Bank of Nigeria meant to help fast track the economy that has been bastardized and it is hemorrhaging from all parts.

But of all known reason for the currency swap, the federal government is determined to stamp its feet on money politics in the 2023 general elections. In this part, money plays a big role in ensuring that a candidate is delivered with a mandate by all means, using money that is at the disposal, or rather in the hands of politicians, who are desperate to win elections by all means.

In the course of the weeks in which most Nigerians experienced hardships beyond measure, much

was expected from government, such that measures would have been taken to cushion the effects of the sufferings of Nigerians.

Gagdi and the new trajectory

On February 12, 2023, Rt Hon Yusuf Adamu Gagdi started a tour of some of the farthest parts of the Federal Wards of Kanam LGA.

Traversing through Dugub, Dogonruwa, Munbutbo, Garga, it was easy to make out what was ahead: Driving as if in a grandprix, that must be done to beat the heavy sand on the roads, but what lay ahead became a test of who was on the wheels.

But, Na Kankwana, an old hand in handling the wheels from Ungwan Gyero in Munbutbo, can give any driver a lesson on how to drive in the sand. He was part of the entourage, and knows every pothole from point of start to finish.

The casualties became pronounced: Some vehicles fell to function and were left to be attended to the next day, just as the fatigue that came through pushing some of them that got stuck in the sand took its toll on all.

At Munbotbo, Lugur and Tunga, Rt Hon Yusuf Adamu Gagdi would himself lead to push the vehicles stuck in the sand. Those who have stayed longer with him are quick to recall some of the days that he would challenge drivers who had problems and drive their vehicles to safety.

The moment night fell, the test became manifest from Ganjuwa, Birbyang, Tunga, Tukur, Yenla, Kantana, and Jom terminating at Jarmai. By the time the entourage arrived at the venues of meeting his constituents, the night was far spent.

At some point, and for a first-timer, it would appear no soul would be met at the venues. It would surprise those that doubted; they kept vigil by singing and dancing until he arrived at the venue.

But it was not the test that should make the headline: It was the sheer patience of supporters patiently waiting in the sun for

hours to receive their son. They knew he would turn up considering the terrain of their area.

They understand politics. Only the patient goes home happier. The orientation serves well to raise politically conscious actors that could be accommodated. That is the mold Rt Hon Yusuf Adamu Gagdi is made of. And suave as ever, he is the man to beat.

Only recently, Rt Hon Yusuf Adamu Gagdi just concluded a four-day tour of 36 Federal Wards that make up his constituency.

There are a few takeaways from the tour. The lessons are instructive, as they send signals of hope and commitment to political office seekers in the land.

To have involved a large number of constituents does not show that one is wealthy nor has the wherewithal to throw around. It shows that there is enough room for others to also participate in the process of electing their representative.

Visiting constituents constantly shows that they are valued. When one doesn't, it as an indication that they do not matter to them; but only during elections that they become relevant. They are witnesses to such treatment by different politicians in the past.

Such politicians come and go, without considering the constituents. They are treated with levity, to the extent that, there is no genuine commitment to the people they seek to represent.

Consider this: Rt Hon Yusuf Adamu Gagdi, has, since 2019 been in a different class. He has shown that he makes things happen as the people mean a lot to him on the journey.

He has visited the 36 Federal Wards about 8 to 10 times minimum. It is no doubt a commitment to service, and of his responsibility to them.

Gagdi has continued to Do Good, and that is why they say, he who does well always sees good from the people. This truism is replicated in the life of Rt Hon Yusuf Adamu Gagdi.

There is genuineness in the struggle by Gagdi. Those that are involved have been bitten by the same bug.

Perhaps, for good measure, his outings are a delight. Gagdi has never been a long ranger; he travels with his arsenals fully prepared to support other candidates.

In all the ward headquarters, he would appreciate and tell the crowd why supporting Tinubu/Shettima, Nentawe, Diket, and Assembly members should be a priority.

What better sacrifice could there be by Gagdi than to get everyone involved in the struggle? Those who cherish the struggles Gagdi has been engaged in know that it is good he has down so much good to reap there from.

Police recruitment : 288,000 youths apply

IN just one week since the start of the six-week application period for recruitment into the Constable cadre of the Nigeria Police Force, an impressive 288,266 Nigerian youths have already submitted their applications online.

A statement issued by Ikechukwu Ani, Head, Press and Public Relations recently stated that As of 7pm on Monday, October 23rd, 2023, the official recruitment portal, www.apply.police.recruitment.gov.ng, had received a total of 288,266 applications. The portal, which opened on Sunday, October 15th, 2023, will remain open until November 26th, 2023, in compliance with the Federal Character Commission's requirement of a six-week application period for government agency vacancies.

Out of the total applications received, 217,105 have met the basic requirements for further consideration in the subsequent stages of the recruitment process. Specifically, 217,300 Nigerian youths have applied for General Duty posts, while 70,676 have applied for

specialist posts.

Unfortunately, 69,426 applications have been rejected due to their inability to meet the required criteria. Among the rejections, 46,868 were due to exceeding the age limit, 51,213 were for General Duty positions, and 18,213 were for specialist positions.

The online application requirements include being of Nigerian origin and birth, possessing the National Identification Number (NIN), having a minimum of 5 credits in no more than 2 sittings in WAEC/NECO or its equivalent, with credit passes in English and Mathematics, and being between the ages of 18 to 25. Additionally, applicants must have a valid email address and phone number. It's important to note that SSCE statements of results or certificates relating to examinations taken before 2015 will not be accepted.

Applicants are advised that there are no monetary implications associated with the application process. Furthermore, Dr. Solomon Arase, the Chairman of the Federal Character Commission and retired

Inspector General of Police, commended the Nigerian youths for their keen interest in pursuing a career in the Nigeria Police Force.

FG to address humanitarian challenges faced by IDPs

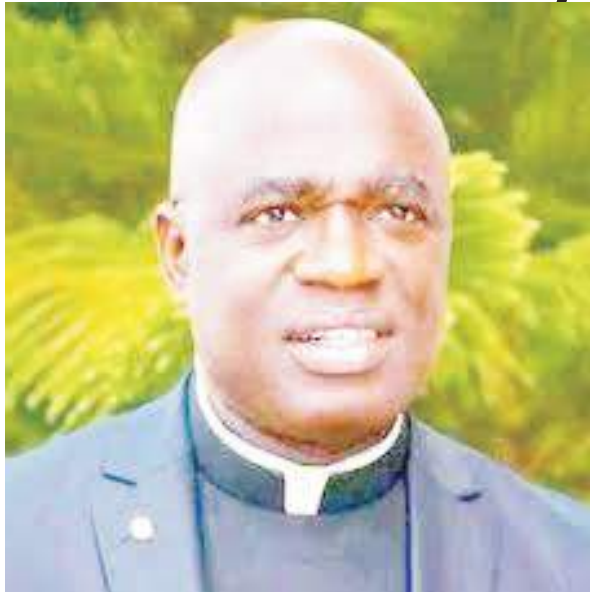
Tinubu, Shettima over victory

Senate Leader faults stampeding judiciary into partisan politics

THE Majority Leader of the Senate, Sen. Opeyemi Bamidele, has advised opposition political parties and their candidates against stampeding the judiciary into partisan politics through alleged disinformation, mal-information and misinformation.

Bamidele disclosed this on Thursday while reacting to the Supreme Court judgement which reaffirmed the election of President Bola Tinubu, according to a statement by his Directorate of Media and Public Affairs in Abuja.

Bamidele, who chaired the Senate Committee on Judiciary, Human Rights and Legal Matters in the ninth National Assembly, kicked against how the opposition unduly dragged the judiciary into partisan politics in pursuit of its selfish interests against collective interest of Nigerians.

While celebrating the victory of the president, Bamidele condemned what he described as "the undue blackmailing of the judiciary even before the petitions of the opposition parties and their candidates were decided.

He observed that the judiciary "is one of the most consistent, dependable and

reliable democratic institutions that still stand for and with the oppressed.

"It is therefore amoral and immoral for any political actor or party to subject the judiciary to media trial rather than abiding by the rules of law.

"Judiciary has never been vilified in the recent history of this federation by petitioners who at different times benefitted tremendously from the independence and neutrality of the judiciary."

Bamidele noted that the petitioners "claimed to have won the 2023 presidential elections during their separate world press conferences. But when they failed to prove their cases, they selfishly resorted to blackmailing the time-tested institutions, especially the judiciary."

He observed that the decisions of the appellate and apex courts "have clearly shown that the last elections are the most credible since the beginning of the Fourth Republic with the deployment of Bimodal Voter Accreditation System, which the Independent National Electoral Commission used for the conduct of the elections."

He, therefore, commended the apex court for standing for the truth and truth alone amid

the ferocious, needless and relentless intimidation of judicial officers by the petitioners, who has said trampled upon the national interest in pursuit of their self-centric political agenda.

"Now that Judiciary has concluded all the presidential election petitions in favour of President Tinubu, Bamidele warned all political actors, interests and parties "to henceforth stop playing politics with the rule of law and the integrity of the judiciary," he said.

Bamidele also warned "against the perverse culture of stampeding the judiciary into partisan politics.

"As far as Nigeria is concerned, judiciary remains an unbiased arbiter wholly committed to the dispensation of justice without regard to any ethnic, economic, political, religious consideration.

"It is therefore unfair and uncalled to paint the judiciary, the only source of hope for the oppressed, black in the eyes of the whole world. This does not harm the judiciary alone, but also portray all of us, Nigerians at home and in the diaspora, bad before the eyes of the whole world.

"This is completely unacceptable! And it must be stopped."

Senate passes Bill to reduce CBN Gov's power

THE Nigerian Senate has passed two bills for an Act to amend the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) Act and other related matters thereto, 2023, and an Act to amend the CBN (Establishment) Act 2007 to make the apex bank more transparent and accountable in its operations.

The bills aim to bar the governor and the deputy governor of the central bank from partisan politics; remove the governor as chairman of the CBN board; create an office of the chairman and expand the board members among others.

The bills were sponsored by Nwokocho Darlington, a senator representing Abia Central, and Karimi Sunday Steve, representing Kogi West.

The Senate, during plenary on Wednesday, agreed that the CBN laws have to be amended to reposition the apex bank to perform its role, especially as the country faces economic challenges, including the foreign exchange crisis.

Leading the debate, Steve explained that the bills seek to amend section 62 on the constitution of the board, to expand it to bring in other critical members, including the auditor-general of the federation and chairman of the Federal Inland Revenue Service and the Chartered Institute of Bankers of Nigeria.

He said the bills were also to amend section 9 to bar the CBN governor and deputy governor from participating in politics and Section 7 to stop the CBN governor from giving responsibility to any other staff member to act on his behalf, other than the most senior, the deputy governor.

The bills further propose to mandate the Salaries and

Wages Commission to determine the remuneration of CBN staff, although some lawmakers kicked against this amendment.

Also leading the debate, Nwokocho said his proposed bill seeks to amend Sections 6(1), (2); 8(1) (2) (3) (4) (5), 12 (1) (2) (3), 13 (1) (2) (3) (4) and paragraph 8 of the first schedule to the Act to strengthen the bank and make provision for the appointment of a chairman of the board, provide for responsibility to quicken and deepen execution of the bank's mandate.

"This bill seeks to provide for, among other things, separate the head of management from the head of the governing board in line with national and international good corporate governance practices, enshrine real-time controls and effective accountability in the conduct of central banking in Nigeria.

"It also seeks to establish the position of the chairman of the board of the CBN with cognate qualifications and experience suitable for achieving the renewed objectives of the bank", he said.

Contributing to the debate, Kaka Shehu Lawan, the senator representing Borno

Central, said the bill was timely, and the law needed to be amended. He decried that the CBN has given loans to the government of up to N27 trillion without the approval of the National Assembly.

Also contributing, Lola Ashiru representing Kwara South, decried that the naira was diminishing every day to the extent that respect was being lost. He urged that the amendment should be expanded to ban the use of dollars for trade.

Aminu Tambuwal, representing Sokoto South, said the bills would strengthen the institution of the CBN and address the lapses and lacuna that have been detected in the implementation of the Act, particularly on it being transparent and ensuring that it carries out its responsibility.

"The CBN governor came out unashamedly to campaign as president. More disappointing is that authorities of that time didn't caution him, and that was a bastardisation of the CBN office," he cried.

Barau Jibrin, the deputy Senate president, commanded the bills while emphasising the need to reposition the laws to put the apex bank in the best position to perform its roles.

CHAIRMAN Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) Prof. Mahmood Yakubu has expressed the commission's readiness to partner the National Population Commission (NPC) to clean up voter register.

Speaking Thursday in Abuja at a quarterly consultative meeting with media, the INEC chairman said the template for cleaning up of the register was being worked out.

"We are working with the NPC for the purpose of cleaning up the voter register. We are designing a template for that purpose," he said.

The INEC chairman also said there were outstanding bye elections resulting from the 2023 polls.

"Out of the 11 bye elections, the INEC chairman said five elected lawmakers died while the rest were as a result of resignations by those who secured political appointments," he said.

He however expressed the hope that in the next one month, all litigations would have been over to enable them commence the conduct of the bye elections.

"So far, we have 11 bye elections. Five members died and 11 resigned in eleven different states and 11 constituencies," Yakubu said.

He asked media practitioners in the country to form a bulwark against fake news in the country while strictly adhering to the ethics of journalism.

He said: "I wish to remind all media organisations to strictly adhere to the ethics of your profession. We welcome reports on the election. At the same time, you should form a bulwark against fake news.

"For the avoidance of doubt, the Commission does not believe in censorship. We have said repeatedly that the best antidote to fake news is greater openness and regular and consistent engagement with stakeholders. We will continue to work together in this regard."

Professor Yakubu disclosed present administration to bring the country out of the present challenges," the group appealed.

that about 94 media organisations deploying 1,255 personnel have been accredited to cover the off-cycle elections in the three states, adding that "in the next few days, the accredited media organisations will be notified of the date for the collection of the identity cards for their officials."

Giving further details on plans for the elections, he said: "About two weeks ago, the commission conducted a mock accreditation involving actual voters in designated polling units in the three states.

"By doing so, we tested the efficacy of the Bimodal Voter Accreditation System (BVAS) for both biometric authentication of voters and the upload of results to the INEC Result Viewing Portal (IREV).

"Some of you observed the mock accreditation exercise and viewed the results on the IREV portal. We have received no adverse report so far.

"By this, we are encouraged that the test was successful and we look forward to improved performance of the BVAS in voter accreditation and result upload in the forthcoming Governorship elections and beyond."

He further said: "Election is a multi-stakeholder activity. In discharging our responsibilities, we will continue to engage with all stakeholders. One of such engagements is with the security agencies.

"In previous elections, media organisations have expressed concern about the safety of journalists, technical staff and protection of the equipment you deploy on Election Day.

"Similarly, you have on several occasions urged the Commission to intercede with the security agencies to grant you unimpeded access to polling and collation locations. I want to reassure you that we will continue to do so as we engage with the security agencies both at the national level and in the three states."

The INEC chairman said the commission considered the elections in Bayelsa, Imo and Kogi governorship as critical, even as he disclosed that security and flooding were capable of militating against the governorship elections in some areas, especially in Kajana in the Ajaokuta area of Kogi State.

Can INEC deliver hitch-free in Kogi, Bayelsa, Imo?

On November 11, residents of Bayelsa, Imo and Kogi will return to the poll to elect new governors that will run the affairs of the states for the next four years in an off election circle exercise. The Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) is expected to conduct the election in 10, 510 polling units spread across the three states.

IN Bayelsa, the election will take place in 2,244 polling units, while it will hold in 3,508 polling units in Kogi. Imo has 4, 758 polling units where the election will hold. INEC has targeted about 5.4 million voters for the election, with Bayelsa having 1.05 million voters; while 2.4 million voters are expected in Imo. Kogi has about two million voters. INEC has been engaged in series of activities in the past few months toward ensuring the successful conduct of the election.

However, some stakeholders have expressed concerns over the ability of the electoral umpire to conduct hitch-free election in these states, going by the experiences of the 2023 general polls.

Although the umpire insists that it did a good job in the polls, many Nigerians, particularly those on the opposition side think otherwise.

They cite the some logistics challenges, especially late arrival of election materials and election officials in polling units as examples of areas that need improvement.

There is also the reoccurring problem of malfunctioning of the Bimodal Voters Accreditation System (BVAS) in polling units, leading to delay in the accreditation of voters and voting.

In some polling units, voting was delayed for many hours, as voters remain on queues to perform their civic rights of electing their leaders.

Although INEC has reassured of its resolve to address the challenges, stakeholders say the commission must buckle up, if it wants to conduct hitch-free, free, fair and credible election.

Mr Yabagi Sani, the National Chairman, Inter-Party Advisory Council (IPAC) tasked INEC to strengthen its capacities to ensure hitch-free election in the three states.

He expressed optimism that INEC would strive to rebuild trust between itself, political parties and the electorate by ensuring hitch-free poll.

"We in IPAC believe that INEC has learned some lessons and they know that there is a huge deficit of trust between the commission and Nigerians.

"This happened because INEC was over ambitious and wanted things to work very well during the presidential elections, but underlined conditions did not allow them to achieve the high standards they set for themselves.

"So INEC will have to go back to its drawing board and take a look at things that went wrong and correct them.

"And this doesn't mean that they should throw away their technological advancements because they served their purpose and there is nothing

wrong with the use of technology," he told the News Agency of Nigeria (NAN) during a recent interview.

Sani said that the use of technology was not the problem of INEC in the conduct of the 2023 general election but the conducts of its officials, political parties and their agents, as well as the conduct of Nigerians.

He advised the commission to improve on its technology usage in order to set a better standard for Nigeria in the global scene as the largest and strongest democratic country in Africa.

"INEC must show a good example in the Nov.11 off-cycle governorship election, it should show that we have technology and we can use them perfectly," he said.

Sani said that all hands must be on deck to ensure that electoral officers are not pressured by governors to falsify results in the election.

"As we approach the off-cycle election in Imo, Bayelsa and Kogi states in November, all hands must be on deck to ensure the resident electoral commissioners and returning officers are not pressured by some governors and INEC itself to falsify results in their states.

"The Adamawa state 2023 governorship election result declaration saga and the embarrassment caused INEC and

the nation at large is a case in point.

"The prosecution of the Adamawa REC in court by INEC is highly desirable and commendable.

"Equally desirable is action by all relevant security agencies to check the misuse of state resources in violation of the Electoral Act 2022," he said.

Mr Hamzat Lawal, the Chief Executive Officer, Connected Development (CODE), a Civil Society Organisation, corroborated Sani's claim, urging INEC to improve on its logistics management, ahead of the November election.

Lawal, also the founder, follow the money, said that INEC must strive hard to close the logistics gaps observed in the 2023 general election to achieve a successful off-cycle election.

"If we in CODE are saddled with the responsibility of undertaking electoral management, first, we will invest heavily in logistics, which is one impediment.

"The second is human capital development and training of ad hoc staff in time, not a few weeks to elections, this is because these are two major gaps we faced in the last election.

"This is an off circle election so there should be no pressure on the commission," he said.

Mr Emmanuel Njoku, the Director, Democracy and Governance, CODE, said there is a need for INEC to seek for more electoral reforms to tackle some issues in organising elections in

Nigeria.

Also, Mr Bayo Balogun, a member of the Yiaga Africa observer mission at the just concluded Liberia's election, urged INEC to take lessons from the smooth conduct of the election, toward improving on the Nov.11 off-cycle election.

Balogun, is also the Chairman, House of Representatives Committee on Electoral Matters.

He said that INEC needs to change the format of its ballot papers to include photographs and names of candidates to improve the quality of electoral preferences and reduce invalidated votes.

"We also noticed that the Liberian National Elections Commission (NEC) displayed high devotion to rules and procedures throughout the elections.

"Polling officials displayed excellent knowledge of the rules and enforced the guidelines at all election level," he said.

Balogun also urged National Assembly to strengthen the electoral laws by making electronic transmission of results mandatory in future elections in Nigeria.

He said this should include the upload of polling unit-level results and results sheets at different levels of results collation.

Balogun urged political stakeholders in Nigeria to demonstrate firm commitment to democracy and nation-building by upholding national values such as patriotism, integrity and public interest in electoral politics.

Prof. Mahmood Yakubu, INEC Chairman, acknowledged some challenges in the conduct of the last election as ass the commission is working hard to ensure that the election is free, fair and credible.

"We are giving our words to Nigerians that we must open polling units at 8.30a.m on the dot on the Election Day.

"Therefore, Registration Area Centres (RACs) must be activated for commencement of voting at 8.30a.m.," Yakubu said at the Kogi Local Government (LGA) office of the commission during INEC mock accreditation for the election in Lokoja on Oct.14.

He said one of the main concerns of the commission is the prevailing security challenge in the country.

Yakubu said that the commission is working with the security agencies to provide secured environment for peaceful and credible election.

"Wherever you go in Nigeria, you are sure to see two government offices. One is INEC. You will see an INEC office in the LGA headed by an electoral officer, an Electoral Officer (EO).

You will also see the police office headed by a Divisional Police Officer (DPO) for the local government.

"So, we are everywhere working together. And I'm happy that we are working together as we prepare for the elections," he said.

Yakubu said that INEC plans to deploy 46,084 officials comprising of both permanent and ad hoc staff for the conduct of the election in the three states.

"While we are leaving no stone unturned in other areas of preparation for the elections governorship elections the commission plans to deploy 46,084 regular and ad hoc staff for exercise.

"We are also finalising arrangements for vehicles and boats for land and maritime movement of personnel and materials," he said.

Yakubu said that such massive deployment requires a secured environment which he said was beyond the commission's immediate responsibility.

"On our part, we will continue to deepen our engagement with the security agencies and more meetings are planned in the next few days.

"Similarly, the commission will hold series of meetings with stakeholders at the national level in addition to ongoing engagements at the state levels," he said.

The INEC Chairman expressed confidence that the Bimodal Voter Accreditation System (BVAS) would perform better in the Nov.11 election.

"Last week, we conducted a mock accreditation involving actual voters in designated polling units in the three states; we had two objectives for the exercise.

"Firstly is to test the efficacy of the BVAS for biometric authentication of voters; secondly, to upload the result to the INEC Result Viewing Portal (IReV). Both tests were successful.

"We look forward to improved performance of the BVAS in voter accreditation and result uploading in the forthcoming elections," he said.

Yakubu said that all non-sensitive materials for the election had been delivered to the three states, so far.

He said that the election would involve 5,409,438 registered voters in 10,510 polling units spread across 649 electoral wards in 56 Local Government Areas (LGAs).

He said that other preparatory activities, including training, were on course, while valuable lessons learnt from the 2023 general election would be used to improve performance of the Nov.11 election.

As preparations for the elections hit top gears it is important that all INEC personnel, stakeholders and politicians in the affected states cooperate with INEC to ensure hitch-free polls. Failure should not be an option. (NANFeatures)

"However, some stakeholders have expressed concerns over the ability of the electoral umpire to conduct hitch-free election in these states, going by the experiences of the 2023 general polls. Although the umpire insists that it did a good job in the polls, many Nigerians, particularly those on the opposition side think otherwise. They cite the some logistics challenges, especially late arrival of election materials and election officials in polling units as examples of areas that need improvement".

APART from its role of making laws, the legislature is also mandated by law to perform oversight functions. These oversight powers are contained in Sections 83-89 of the Nigerian Constitution with regards to the National Assembly and Sections 120-128 with regards to the state Houses of Assembly.

This enables them supervise the activities of government to ensure that they are acting in accordance with laid down rules and procedures.

With the inauguration of the state tenth assembly came the quest to effectively manage its activities and ensure optimal performances for the good of the people of Plateau State. In line with this, the Rt. Hon Speaker Moses Thomas Sule on assumption of office immediately swung into action by constituting twenty four House Standing Committees who embarked on this functions to oversee ongoing projects in the various MDAs.

For the House Committee on Health, the Chairman Hon. Salome Wanglek who represents Pankshin South constituency led other members of the committee on the visit.

The MDAs visited include the Plateau Aids Control Agency (PLACA), College of Health Technology Zawan, College of Nursing and Midwifery Vom, Plateau State Contributory Health Emergency Management Agency (PLASHEMA), Plateau State Hospital Management Board and the Plateau State Primary Healthcare Development Board.

Heads of the MDAs did not mince words as they laid bare their myriad of challenges ranging from non releases of approved funds, shortage of manpower, facility and equipment decay, lack of operational vehicles, non completion of some medical facilities like the General Hospitals in Mabudi, Langtang South, Kanke and Riyom.

The committee on their part, however assured of the necessary legislative intervention towards helping them deliver on their mandate to serve the citizens.

For the Chairman House Committee on Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs Hon. Timothy Dantong who is the member representing Riyom constituency, said the state legislature is desirous of working to reclaim the lost glory of the local government system. This was brought to the fore, when he led other members of his Committee on a familiarization/oversight to the various establishments under his supervision.

The committee under Dantong undertook its first official assignment with visits to the Ministry of Local

Government and Chieftaincy Affairs, the Local Government Service Commission and the Local Government Staff Pension Board.

At the Local Government Pension Board, it was gathered that over eleven thousand (11,000) local government pensioners in the state are owed backlog of about 31 billion naira pension, gratuity and death benefits. Many of the pensioners wallow in pathetic situations caused by failure of relevant government agencies at all levels to remit their statutory contributions in order

to fund payment of retirees entitlements.

On its part, House Committee on Finance through the Chairman Hon. Cornelius Doeyok wants all Ministries, Departments and Agencies under its purview to work towards result delivery in the current dispensation. The committee visited the Ministry of Finance, Plateau State Internal Revenue Service, State Debt Management Office, Plateau State Microfinance Development Agency, (PLASMIDA), the State Pension Board and Bureau of Public Procurement. At the Plateau State Internal Revenue Service, the Chairman Jim Pam Ways expressed displeasure with the negative attitude people have towards payment of taxes. For the State Pension Board, the acting Executive Secretary

Kurnam Gambo said the arrears of unpaid pension, gratuity and death benefits have accumulated to over 20 billion naira. Heads of some of the MDAs also complained about understaffing, non releases of budgetary provisions, mobility, equipment and facility decay etc. The Plateau State House of Assembly Committee on Parastatals and World bank projects during its oversight and familiarization visit admonished the Jos Metropolitan Development Board (JMDB) to work out suitable template that would position it as the major revenue earner for the state. The committee led by its Chairman and member representing Qua'an Pan North constituency, Hon. Paul Datugun was also at the Plateau State Independent

Electoral Commission (PLASIEC), Muslim Welfare Pilgrims Board and the Christian Welfare Pilgrims Board. For the Muslim Welfare Pilgrim Board and that of Christian Welfare Pilgrims, the challenges were somehow similar. Acting Executive Secretaries of the two boards Aisha Ibrahim and Ruth Ngupar said pilgrimage operation in the state are often encumbered by late releases of funds and International passport delay among other things. The Appropriation Committee led by its Chairman Hon. Danjuma Azi, member representing Jos North West constituency were at the Government House Administration, Office of the Deputy Governor, that of the Secretary to Government of

the state and the Office of Head of Service. Other MDAs the committee also paid oversights to are the State Budget Office and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Hon. Danjuma Azi encouraged all MDAs under his oversight power to ensure that provisions in their budget reflects 'the time is now mantra'. He also charged the MDAs to brace up for the mandatory budget defence; an event he described as an offshoot for the familiarization visit the committee is out for.

The committee's visit was at its climax in the State Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning where questions about the status of the state economy ranging from budgeting system, world bank intervention programmes, fuel subsidy palliative and others were asked.

EFCC's new vista on anti-corruption war

The Federal Government's anti-graft war spearheaded by the Economic and Financial Crime Commission [EFCC], is one battle that has continued to rage the past decades with so many twists and turns. As it is; even the czars in charge of prosecuting the war on corruption had realized that the job is full of challenges and a no mean Job with some of them slipping on the banana peels that sometimes turned the agency to that of the hunter being hunted. KENNETH DARENG writes.

THE latest approach redesigning the architecture of the fight against corruption in the country is taking a shift from enforcement to proactive approach as a way of dismantling orts of corruption paving way for national progress.

This new strategy was announced by the new Chairman of the EFCC, Ola Olukoyede, after confirmation sitting by the Senate. According to him, this is a new paradigm shift that will consolidate prevention mechanism in the nation's unyielding battle against corruption.

"Without downplaying prosecution, the EFCC will be primarily concerned with prevention by embracing this wisdom, "Prevention is better than cure" underscores the significance of taking precautionary steps to avert problems before they arise instead of managing the consequences afterwards."

This new approach emphasizes the importance of proactive prevention actions which indicates that it is far more effective and efficient to prevent

an issue or challenge from occurring initially, rather than attempting to resolve it once it has manifested.

SUNDAY STANDARD sources gathered that the vision of the new EFCC boss is to address underlying causes of corrupt practices by implementing preventive measures to save time and resources which would have minimized efforts that expended on handling a particular case.

According to the EFCC Chairman, " emphasis must be placed on crime prevention. For instance, between 2018 and 2020, Nigeria lost approximately N2.9 trillion through contract fraud in 3 years. This was as a result of misappropriation by contractors for personal gain.

"I did a personal survey between 2018 and 2020 on 50 entities in Nigeria, both human and corporate entities. I picked just one scheme, one specie of fraud which is called contract and procurement fraud. I discovered that within 3 years, Nigeria had lost N2.9 trillion." Olukoyede said.

The new EFCC boss further stated that the funds pilfered

during the assessed period could have been allocated to valuable government initiatives had the past leadership of the anti-corruption agency taken measures to prevent its diversion.

"When I put my figures together, I discovered that if the country had prevented the money from being stolen, it would have given us 1,000 kilometres of road. It would have built more than 20 standard tertiary institutions. It would have also educated about 6,000 children from primary to tertiary levels at N16million per child. It would have delivered more than 20,000 units of 3 bedroom houses across the country. It would have given us a World-Class teaching hospital in each of the 36 states of the federation including the Federal Capital Territory. And this is where we are coming from." He stated.

He also canvassed for the review of the criminal Justice system, stressing that the review would not only reduce time spent on investigations and trials of suspects but will save the country money. Besides, he wants the federal , states and

local governments to establish a transactional credit system to discourage corrupt tendencies in the civil service.

Olukoyede, also called for collaborative effort in tackling corruption noting that, an average individual would steal if given the opportunity making reference to civil servants whom he accused of living in luxury homes and buying vehicles that their savings cannot afford.

He said, the time has come for all anti- corruption agencies to focus more on prevention than enforcement. He stated, enforcement is a very strong tool in our hands and we are going to use it very seriously. "The savings of an average civil servant in Nigeria all through his service years cannot build the type of house they are building and the type of cars they are riding.

"The problem we have is just like that of the proverbial monkey that was locked in a cage with a bunch of bananas as the owner stood outside with a cane. The monkey would either eat the banana get beaten and be alive, or allow the bananas to get rotten and die of hunger. Everyone wants to live a luxurious life and the incentives are all over the place. I will do more in the area of blocking leakages. We spent more money fighting corruption when we could have spent less to prevent it without down playing the importance of enforcement.

He pledged to implement a transactional credit system. This system aims to restrict the

purchase of luxurious properties with cash, enabling the monitoring of financial transactions while emphasizing the fact that over relying on enforcement would be insufficient without an effective credit system put in place.

"There is what we call a transactional credit system. If we continue to allow Nigerians to buy houses, cars and other luxurious properties by cash because we don't have an effective credit system, 1,000 anti-corruption agencies will not do us any good and that is the reality.

"We must create an atmosphere to make sure people have choices. If I don't steal money, I can't afford to train my children in school with good standard If I don't steal money, can I afford a car after I have worked for 20 years? An average Nigerian does not own a home. And when given the opportunity he would steal and even when he does not have the opportunity; he would create one."

The anti-graft Czar emphasized the importance of synergy with the Nigerian judiciary particularly in handling technical areas with a view to resolving corruption cases within a time frame from the High Court to the Supreme Court.

"In order to encourage our criminal justice system to work, the substance should be taken above technicalities. We must also ensure that prosecution of corruption cases should not be allowed to for a minimum of 5

Before Nyesom Wike is sacked as FCT minister

The Minister of the Federal Capital Territory (FCT), Abuja Ezenwo Nyesom Wike has of recent come under intensed persecution following some Nigerian Islamic clerics' demand against all odds for his head to be chopped off. Wike who stood firm against the intrigues of his political party, the People's Democratic Party (PDP), dared and overwhelmed the party hierarchy's maneuverings was able to survive its intriguing hurdles without any suspension till the end of his mandate as a two tenure Governor only to be dragged into another battle for his life. THIS time around, the conspiracy is incisively religiously motivated by a group of religious extremists and bigots who care-less about the corporate existence of a nation called Nigeria. By their unrepentant behavioral attitudes, one can vehemently conclude that their desire is to create a borderless Islamic state at all cost, not minding the colossal loss such an agitation could bring. These are a group of clerics' who are based on selfish and devilish agenda ready to pull down and destroy every sense of human civilization in our contemporary nation for no good of anyone but them.

In fact, Wike's thick skin, magnitude of boldness, both during and in the aftermath of the 2023 general elections till now makes one wonder what he has up his shelves. Even before the general elections which saw his party losing out at the presidential elections, the former Governor of Rivers State was able to prove the Ikwerre genetics in him. Through his remarkable sojourn in the precarious jungle of acrimonious political circumstances, as Governor of one of the most delicate states in the country, Wike was able to hold his ground and subdue his antagonists without much pains in Rivers State.

A few days ago, I had the privilege of going into a crucial discussion with a friend of mind. As we went deeper into sharing our thoughts, one thing which brought our thoughts into a definitive consensus was that, only 'mad' people and sick people Nigerians love to have as leaders. For Wike, his outstanding qualities as a "mad" man who is always fond of making trouble where there is none has helped him advanced his political career.

Just recently however, some Muslims clerics seem to have ganged-up in their thoughts and actions that Ezenwo must be removed from office as Minister of the Federal Capital Territory, Abuja. One of such clerics is none other than Sheik Abubakar Mahmud Gumi who recently asked President Tinubu to sack the minister without any further

delay.

While submitting reasons behind his agitations, Gumi in a sermon said "the minister of the FCT is a devilish man. When he was appointed, I told you he was devilish and some people were grumbling. He went and brought the Israeli ambassador. Someone sent it to me, but I am yet to see it and confirm."

Gumi continued in his outburst that "But what is confirmed is he (Wike) said he will collaborate with the Israelis to improve Abuja's security. Therefore, Abuja will now be like Tel Aviv where when they see anyone with beard like us, they will say it is Bin Laden and kill us... there is an agenda. All means of making money and economic power have been hijacked by them, they want to keep doing it for the next four or eight years, but they will not Insha Allah."

Another comments attributed to Gumi while delivering his sermon in the mosque was that "If Israelis enter this country, there will be clandestine operation against any outspoken Islamic cleric, we have seen the signs in the past. Why was Sheikh Jaafar killed? Why did they kill Sheikh Albany?"

Sheikh Gumi then demanded that "Tinubu should remove the minister of FCT or we will not be on the same page with him." Many other clerics also claimed that there is no way they will accept an infidel to be appointed as minister of the FCT in the person of Wike when the territory belongs to the core Arewa Muslims.

Interestingly, the Gbagyi people who are the real owners

of Abuja have responded that Abuja was never infiltrated by any jihad during the conquest and no part of the land belongs to the core northern oligarchy. They also warn all clerics touring these lines of thoughts to desist henceforth not to throw this country into an unprecedented crisis.

For the records however, in 1976, it is a known fact that their land was reclaimed from them to form the present seat of power. That year, the military had this idea of no-man's land in the geographical centre of the nation which no group should lay claim to. The purpose was that a place should be found where Nigerians could unite together.

Therefore, an 8,000 square kilometers where the flourishing city is built belongs to the Gbagyi who have for several years complained of deliberate marginalization of the highest order in the country. Interestingly, despite their predicaments, this ethnic group has never went violent while demanding for what is theirs to be actualised.

Come to think of all this however, it is fallacious for these Muslim clerics to lay claim to Abuja just because the military government of Murtala Mohammed initiated the establishment of the FTC. It is also outrageously fallacious for them to think so just because of successive appointments of Muslims as Ministers of the FCT in recent years.

Beyond all this however, I really find significant fault in the way and manner Sheikh Gumi kept on in an overwhelming animosity calling Wike an evil man when in

the real sense of it, as a religious leader, he ought to call our leaders to repentance. This intense degree of hate exhibited against Wike by Sheikh Gumi is beyond comprehension and sad in all its ramifications.

Of much concern however is the hatred some of these clerics have also exhibited against the State of Israel and Christians in this country. I cannot imagine that just because Wike hosted an Israeli ambassador in his office, the minister should out-rightly be sacked? The question we must ask ourselves then is, would the Christian population call for a Muslim minister's sack if he decides to host any official from Saudi Arabia and or from any Islamic nation of the world?

In the aftermath of Wike's ministerial appointment, some of these clerics have been unleashing derogatory and inflammatory remarks with impunity. Thus, some of them have forgotten the reality of the fact that Nigeria does not practice a one state religion while its multi-diversity should be reflected in all its administrative framework in the country.

Some of these clerics must be educated that whither this incumbent government was elected under the platform of their perceived Muslim-Muslim ticket, this does not mean that other non-Muslim citizens of this nation should be marginalised and traumatised in such an inhuman and barbaric manner.

Therefore, their call for the sack of the FTC minister is not only myopic, useless and baseless, this move is divisive, unimaginable, retrogressive and uncivilised in our contemporary

society. If Wike should be relieved of his ministerial appointment, these clerics should be able to convince Mr. President and the citizens of this country that as far as this administration's ideological philosophy is concern, Christians are not qualified to be appointed to serve in some specific offices in this country. This same divisive clerics must also advance a legislative change to specify lucrative positions which only Muslims must occupy and other less significant ones which would be settled for by non-Muslims. But again, it is no longer news that minority ethnic nationalities and Christians who are indigenes of states dominated by Muslims have for decades continued to suffer in silence in this country. 'Senseless attacks on soft targets'

THERE was complete pandemonium, last Friday, in the ancient town of Otukpo, the South District of Benue State town, nick-named "Texas" by residents. That day, daredevil armed men in a commando fashion stormed five commercial banks in the town in a manner never seen before by residents of the town.

The armed men who were said to have assailed the town on motorbikes, had earlier attacked Otukpo Police Station where they disarmed the personnel on duty and carted away arms and the two operational vehicles at the station.

After effectively taking charge of the police station, the invaders who could be well over 20, moved to the commercial banks which are all located within the heart of the town and a stone's throw from each other.

With the use of explosives and sophisticated weapons, all security barriers in the banks were ripped apart, allowing the armed men easy access to the banks and their vaults. Huge sums of money were reportedly carted away by the marauders who also seized a car from one of the banks.

The bloody attack also claimed the lives of some police personnel and bank customers who were trapped in the bank premises when the armed men struck. Among those who lost their lives in the bloody attack were Otukpo Divisional Police Officer, DPO, who was an indigene of the area, Superintendent John Adikwu and three other police personnel including a female police officer, Emmanuella Ankyov.

Also on the list of those who were felled by the bullets of the armed men were the Peoples Democratic Party, PDP, Township Ward 1 Chairman, Mr. George Uloko, a staff of UBA, Emmanuel Uche who recently joined the bank after having completed his Youth Service. After accomplishing their task, the armed men drove confidently through the town, heading towards the Otukpo-Aliade road with their loot.

However, police sources in Otukpo said the attack was not a surprise based on the prevailing security situation in the town before it happened. According to sources, the real cause of the attack was the lingering power play between the police in Otukpo and the Benue State government. "Members of the vigilante group in Otukpo are mainly made up of retired police personnel and retired but active criminals. They have been against each other, drawing bad blood in a supremacy battle.

There's no synergy between the vigilante men and the police. While the vigilante men don't consult the police, the police do not seek the input of the vigilante men in any way.

To worsen the matter, the police force in the state is banking on support from the state government. It has become the normal practice for the police to rely on state governors for operations in the state. This is because of the poor funding they face.

Security usually breaks down in any state where the government doesn't fully back the police. Police sources in



Benue say the new government has not invested in them.

It was, however, gathered that the gang had not gone far when the military and other security agencies gave them a hot chase and intercepted them before neighbouring Tarku in Gwer Local Government Area, LGA, where an exchange of gunfire ensued.

The security person successfully neutralized two members of the gang and recovered one of the snatched vehicles while other members of the gang escaped into the forests.

The State Police Command in a statement confirming how the armed men went berserk in Otukpo stated that "On October 20, 2023, at about 4:15 pm, armed robbers invaded Access bank, First bank, Zenith Bank, UBA and Stanbic Bank in Otukpo simultaneously.

The Divisional Police Officer in charge of Otukpo, CSP. John Adikwu and other Police teams in the area engaged them in a gun duel but were unable to prevent the attack on the banks.

More Police teams, in collaboration with other security agents, were deployed to Otukpo to assist in stabilizing the area and prevent these robbers from escaping.

"The robbers who were intercepted along Otukpo-Tarku road engaged officers in a gun duel and two of the robbers died in the process. Other gang members abandoned their vehicles and escaped into the forest area and are being chased by the police.

The DPO who sustained a gunshot injury on his stomach and three other police officers have been confirmed

dead at the hospital. Other persons who sustained injuries in the bank have been moved to hospital for treatment. Investigation is ongoing at the moment. The command also promised that the fleeing armed men would be apprehended and brought to justice."

While residents of the town are still in shock and are yet to come to terms with how the bandits sneaked into the town and audaciously operated and pulled out seamlessly, not a few have gone into fervent prayers to have them arrested.

One of the witnesses, identified as Ene who said she owned a shop close to Zenith Bank and saw how it happened, said that about 3:30pm "we suddenly started hearing sounds of gunfire and explosion.

"People started running in different directions. Nobody knew what was happening. It was like what we used to see in the movies. Young men numbering about 20, carrying guns marched into the bank and started shooting, ransacking the bank.

At this time, everyone started wailing and running. Even a customer who came to buy some goods in my shop that afternoon had his car badly damaged by the explosives. He ran and left his car in front of my shop.

"From that bank, they moved to another until they visited the five banks. The operation lasted about an hour. The people of Otukpo town were held hostage for an hour. There was no police or vigilante to come to their rescue.

We did not know that before the attack

on the banks, the gang had already demobilized the police. They earlier attacked Otukpo Police Station, disarmed them and locked up the gate of the station.

"Not knowing what happened, we thought that the police ran and locked their gate. We did not know that they were the first to be attacked by the criminals.

In the course of robbing the banks, they killed innocent people who were out trying to eke a living in this difficult time, leaving several families in mourning.

After successfully robbing the bank, we even learned that they threw some of the loot into the street as they confidently drove past and headed towards Tarku-Aliade Road.

"But shortly after, we learned that some military personnel and the police had gone after them and two of the robbers were gunned down while others escaped into the forests. Our prayer is for every one of them to be arrested and punished accordingly."

Traditional ruler of Otukpo reacts
The traditional ruler of Otukpo, Ochi Otukpo Odu, HRH John Eimonye who was also saddened by the attack on his domain, described the incident as highly condemnable and evil.

The royal father assured that security personnel are on the trail of the criminals, so they will certainly not escape.

He appealed to his subjects to be vigilant and security conscious and always report strange movements in their neighborhoods to law enforcement agencies.

My sister told me this story that made me livid. She told me about this woman who has eight children and is being abused by her husband. She told me that the church tried to intervene by reporting the case to the human rights radio. However, the pastor told the woman not to mention that he was the one who took the case to them.

When the woman sat down with the people from the human rights radio to tell her story, she asked them if she was still expected to go back to her husband's house after their intervention. Needless to say that the intervention did not take place.

This is 2023 and a man still beats his wife. He does not only beat her. He bites her as well. When my sister went to her house to see her, she did not only see the bite marks. She also saw one of her daughters who had a wound on her forehead. The child had tried to stop her father from beating her mother and the father hit her on the head with a tool that left a wound on her forehead.

I asked my sister if she was trying to help the woman and my sister hissed. She told me that when the woman had child number eight, she told her how she could empower herself economically and leave the marriage with the children. However, the woman took in again. Having a child and leaving a marriage do not go hand in hand. My sister tells me that the family is extremely poor and as early as 9:00am the husband would be drunk. She said that the man is extremely violent and would hurt anyone who got in the way. He beat her while she was carrying the baby on her back!

This story made me sad and angry at the same for many reasons. Please who goes and gives birth to eight children in this day and age? We have been struggling economically in this country for close to twenty years now. How can one be poor and have eight children in an abusive marriage and then go on to have a ninth child just when someone wanted to help her escape abuse?

How does a husband beat his wife? How does a man beat a woman not to mention one that has given him nine children? How does a man beat and bite his wife? How does that happen when she is carrying a baby. How does he hurt his child in the process of beating his wife? How do we mind our business?

My question is this: Where are the men in the community when a woman is getting beaten by her husband? Why do they go silent? Is this a form of conspiracy? I remember one day when my neighbour was beating his wife. Her sister kept on screaming that he was trying to kill her sister and that she would not let him do that. I was alarmed. In the entire neighbourhood, I did not see anyone come out of their houses and go to that house to stop the husband. Not even my husband. I asked him if we could call security. He told me that it was not our business. I told him that since I could hear her cries, it had become my business. After much pestering, he called the police and the estate security who came promptly on a bike.

The case was reported to the police and when investigations commenced, the police came to ask us some questions in the house and my husband told them that we were not aware of what happened. I wondered why. If abusers went to jail, it would discourage others from abuse. I wanted to talk to the police, but I was stopped.

I have come to a conclusion that I would like to share with our ministries of women affairs. That is, that women cannot stop abuse. We need men to be involved in this fight and take the lead for many reasons. Imagine a man who has daughters. Imagine how protective he can be towards his daughters. I believe that if we start a movement against abuse and we involve these fathers in the push against wife battering, we will make a lot of progress.

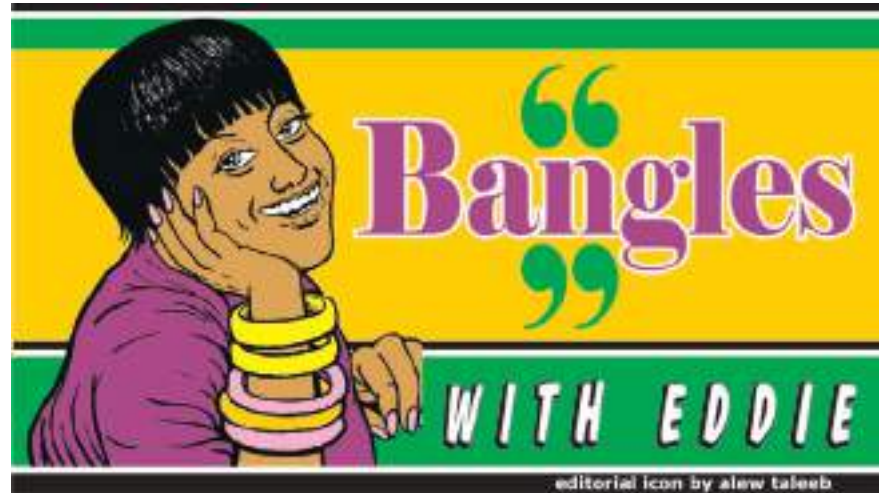
The case of the doctor who raped his niece is still fresh on our minds. He has been sentenced to life in jail. This is a move in the right direction. A deterrent. However, a lot still needs to be done to protect women and girls in the society.

I personally believe that before we put an end to abuse or reduce it to its barest minimum, abuse must become our collective business. It must become a source of worry to every man in every community. I go back to the day that my neighbour was getting a beat down by her husband. I imagine that if all the men on that street had come out to confront the husband, he would have promptly desisted. However, they did not. This was in the night on a weekday and most of the men on that street were home. How is it not their business? If it was their sister or their

daughter. It would be their business.

Women have tried and continue to try. We have raised our voices against abuse for quite a while now and we are getting heard. However, there is a strong challenge. There are men who are die hard abusers and I believe it will take the entire community to stop them. Women can talk and sue but most women who are being abused cannot be saved because the man would often attack those who try to do. Abroad, shelters are built to protect these women and somehow some of them still end up getting killed by their abusive spouses who would stalk them if they ever left the shelters.

If we intend to reduce and eventually erase abuse in our communities, we must start thinking communally. Where are the men in

the community? They can meet each month and make it clear to each other that violence against women will not be tolerated. They can also encourage the women in the community to report abuse to them. If any woman is getting beaten, it becomes their responsibility to break the door and go into the house to save the woman who is being abused, and then also take the man to the police station.

It is important for men to see abuse as their business and their responsibility. It is said that evil strives when good men say keep quiet. I have a different definition. A man is he who protects. A good man is he who goes out of his way to protect. A man also has the responsibility of defending his fellow brother from being beaten by any woman. Men who are abused are not less masculine. Any man who sees another beating a woman and minds his business cannot be a man. A man is a protector.

An abuser has a certain type of mentality towards the woman he is abusing, that will require the intervention of other men. Let us look at the mindset of an abuser or wife batterer to understand that unless men get involved in ending domestic violence against women, it is only going to get worse.

The following are the traits of a wife beater: Rude and verbally abusive during courtship; A guy who is verbally abusive and rude during the process of courtship is likely to carry on with this behaviour into the marriage, further escalating into violence.

Background of violence; One study established that 80% to 85% of men who end up physically assaulting their spouses witnessed their dad abusing their mother early in their lives.

Low self-esteem; their upbringing immensely contributed to their emotional development. That's the reason why the profile of a wife beater revolves around self-esteem.

Poor interpersonal skills play a big role in the abuser's regard for social relations. An abuser is likely to misinterpret his spouse's social interactions as love affairs. This is likely to send the wrong signals to his premeditated mind and violence will follow suit.

A man who comes from a culture that regards women as sexual objects is likely going to physically abuse the spouse when he fails to have his way sexually with her.

One who abuses alcohol or drugs lacks emotional balance and is likely to lose his temper when under the influence of alcohol or drugs and turn violent.

Feeling inadequate is another defining factor in the mind of an abuser which makes him turn violent the moment his wife threatens to leave him.

History of abuse in childhood is likely to make a man grow into adulthood nurturing those painful feelings into anger that will be misguided into reading negative messages or signals in the innocent behaviour of his partner. These imaginary faults will lead to violence.

Mood swings are one of the traits of a wife-beater which says a lot about a violent nature. It is highly unlikely for a man who experiences a sudden change of mood to end up friendly. Almost always, the mood ends in anger which is a good enough reason for an abuser to beat his wife.

Adoration of violence is a common trait in many males, especially those who regard violence as an appropriate method of settling scores. This is the kind of man who will only see the option of violence as the best one to employ in "punishing" his wife in the event of a minor altercation.

The history of domestic violence in an individual is a character that one can not easily live down. A man who abused his former wife or partner can not be trusted to keep off his habit for long. Sooner or later, he will abuse his next victim; his next partner or wife in this case.

Marriage for financial gain is a trait among some individuals who are not driven by love but by a desire for amassing gain. This only keeps them happy and sated as long as the bread and butter continue flowing. The moment their expectations are shattered, they turn to the object of their "love" and abuse them. This is the kind of man who first thinks of himself while others come after. With this kind of behaviour, the abuser abuses without reflection.

Ungodliness may be criticised and frowned upon, but it can never be condemned in our modern world where freedom of worship is safeguarded. Even those with no deity as their object of worship, are respected for having chosen their spiritual position. However, when a woman has an ungodly man, one who despises the word of God for a husband, most traditional values are likely to be stepped on. In a situation where such a man has nothing to check him, he's likely to turn violent on a

whim.

Mental issues in a partner or a husband, is a matter of life and death to the spouse. No, any other red signal needs to be raised. The fact that the husband or partner is mentally unstable, is enough to terminate the marriage or a relationship. Here is where your life and concerns take precedence over the sacred tenets of the marriage vows. Even the law will be on your side on this one.

In conclusion, all you ladies out there, be on the lookout for your potential abusers. Consider the value of your lives and use your heads; no time to be swayed by the heat of the moment and lose your head. What you may be misled to interpret as true love in your partner, may in a real sense be your death sentence. When in the movies, look out for that unmistakable love for either horror movies, or violent confrontations. I have not said that that guy who watches horror movies and violence is the culprit. No, I mean that individual who laughs with glee when someone is mauled or killed on the screen. He never looks disturbed even when you are hurt. That is your guy; avoid him like the plague.

Men with these type of behaviours cannot be managed or stopped by women. It will require a community domestic violence prevention unit to empower men within a community to protect women by standing up to and stopping these types of men from abusing their wives.

It would propose a domestic protection unit in every community. This unit would not only be instituted by social welfare but be linked to the ministry of women affairs. The job is to be watch dogs against domestic violence in their community. They also have a hot line and step in for the police before they arrive at the scent of the abuse.

For men who have daughters, sisters and cousins, the issue of abuse should be important to you because many women die in silence in their marriages due to the lack of effective structures in their immediate community to protect them. When they go to the police, they are told that the issue of abuse is domestic. In essence, they are sent back to the monsters at home. When they go home to their families, few are received and protected. Some families are so concerned with their reputation than they are with their children. Some families turn their daughters away because they say that they do not believe in divorce.

It is also very important for men to empower their daughters with skills and resources. If a woman can fend for herself and contributes her own quota in a marriage, she is in a good position to leave an abusive spouse. Some women cannot leave their abusive spouses because they have no resources of their own and no skills to sell. The idea that a woman should depend completely on her husband is weak thinking. In practical terms, how can a man be the only one fending for his family with no contribution from his wife? Sometimes, men become very burdened and frustrated and if a man has an abusive tendency, this very easily starts to rear its head. He starts to believe that the ornamental wife is actually his property.

In conclusion, men of good conscience should make it their business to fish out all abusive men in their community and be actively involved in their persecution. Knowing that there are domestic violence prevention units in every community and that these work with the police and the social welfare office, is a deterrent to all abusers. It will also be a practical tools for protecting women in every community. These should be considered community development services

Isaiah 8:13 goes on to say, Sanctify the LORD of hosts himself; and let him be your fear, and let him be your dread; do this and He the Lord of Host shall be a sanctuary for you. So you see, the Spirit of God is giving us very strong instruction: this is more than an exhortation. This is not a suggestion; this is an

be afraid".

Maybe it is a sickness or disease in your body that you are battling with; it may even seem to be swallowing you up. These create feelings in our lives which in turn move us to do and act in certain ways.

This means resisting the spirit of fear is resisting thoughts, ideas, suggestions and impressions that seek to stoke fear in the heart. Know that all of these thoughts, ideas, suggestions and impressions come from somewhere: thoughts do not just come from nowhere: they come from somewhere.

They come from what we see and hear. Satan's strategy is to use the things that we see, hear and experience to put thoughts, ideas, suggestions and impressions of fear into our minds.

Hence, if we are going to successfully resist the spirit of fear, we must learn to resist the thoughts, ideas, suggestions and impressions that come to us because of what we are seeing, hearing and experiencing that seek to generate fear.

"Fear not is a commandment; it is not a suggestion, because of how important it is for you to shut off the activity of the Spirit of fear in your life. Remember, Satan can do nothing in your life outside of the operation of the spirit of fear".

Jesus Christ.

No matter what the circumstance may be, remember the Lord is your helper. Insecurity will not consume you or your family because the Lord is your helper. The Lord will provide for you: the Lord will take care of you, he is your helper.

Israel conducts second ground raid into Gaza

THE Israeli army, backed by fighter jets and drones, has carried out a second limited ground raid into Gaza in as many days and struck targets on the outskirts of Gaza City, according to its military, as it prepares for a widely expected ground invasion.

The Israeli military said on Friday that ground forces entered Gaza overnight and struck dozens of Hamas targets during its raid in the Shujaiya area.

It said aircraft and artillery bombed targets in the neighbourhood on the outskirts of Gaza City, and that its soldiers exited the territory after several hours without suffering any casualties.

"The raid began yesterday in broad daylight ... it ended successfully in the hours of this morning," the Israeli army's spokesperson said.

Black-and-white footage released by the Israeli army showed a column of armoured vehicles as a thick cloud of dust billowed into the sky after the strikes.

Later on Friday, Hamas's military wing said Israeli forces at dawn attempted to carry out a landing operation on the Rafah beach in southern Gaza Strip.

"The attempt was discovered by our fighters, and they confronted it and clashed with the enemy. This required the intervention of the Zionist [Israeli] Air Force, which saved the force, so it fled towards the sea, leaving behind a quantity of ammunition," the Qassam Brigades said in a Telegram post.

The Israeli army had conducted another ground operation using tanks and infantry overnight on Thursday in the northern part of the Palestinian territory; it said its ground forces battled fighters and struck antitank missile firing positions in an operation that lasted hours.

Israeli military officials, on several occasions, have confirmed the army's readiness to conduct a large-scale ground operation in Gaza, but are awaiting a green light from the Israeli political leadership.

At the same time, Israel continues its relentless bombardment of Gaza, which has killed more than 7,000 Palestinians in three weeks. The strikes began following a Hamas attack inside Israel on October 7, in which more than 1,400 people were killed.

The air raids have flattened entire neighbourhoods, causing a level of death and destruction unseen in the last four wars between Israel and Hamas.

More than a million people have fled their homes in northern Gaza, with many heeding Israeli orders to evacuate to the south, despite continuing Israeli attacks across the sealed-off territory.

The damage to Gaza was shown in satellite photos of several locations taken before the war and again in recent days.

Entire rows of residential buildings simply disappear in the photos, reduced to smears of dust and rubble.

A complex of 13 high-rises

by the sea was pounded to dust near Gaza City's al-Shati refugee camp, leaving only a few tottering bits of facade.

Just down the street, hardly anything remained in what had been a neighbourhood of low-built homes on winding lanes, according to the photos by Maxar Technologies.

Benny Gantz, a retired general and member of Israel's war cabinet, said on Thursday that any possible ground offensive would be only "one stage in a long-term process that includes security, political and social aspects that will take years".

"The campaign will soon ramp up with greater force," he added.

The humanitarian crisis caused by the war and the Israeli siege, and concern for the fate of Gaza's 2.3 million people, has sparked protests across the region, and more demonstrations were expected later on Friday after weekly Muslim prayers.

The focus of Ukraine's efforts there have been around the village of Robotyne, which is some 56km (35 miles) south-east of the city of Zaporizhzhia, the regional capital.

THE United States has attacked two facilities in Syria used by Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps and Iran-backed groups, the Pentagon has said, following a series of attacks against US forces in Iraq and Syria.

The strikes came after President Joe Biden's administration pledged to respond to attacks on US personnel that Washington has blamed on armed groups backed by Iran.

"The United States does not seek conflict and has no intention nor desire to engage in further hostilities, but these Iranian-backed attacks against US forces are unacceptable and must stop," US Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin said in a statement on Thursday.

"Iran wants to hide its hand and deny its role in these attacks against our forces. We will not let them. If attacks by Iran's proxies against US forces continue, we will not hesitate to take further necessary measures to protect our people."

Austin said the "narrowly-tailored strikes" were in self-defence and were not connected to the Israel-Hamas war.

White House National Security Council spokesman had earlier warned that Washington would respond to the attacks at a "time of our choosing and a manner of our choosing".

Kirby's comments came as the US Department of Defense said on Thursday that US and allied forces in Iraq and Syria had been attacked at least 16 times this month by "Iranian-backed militia groups".

A total of 21 US personnel have been injured in the attacks, most of them suffering traumatic brain injuries, according to US officials.

Reports of attacks on US forces in the region have spiked since the outbreak of the Israel-Hamas war, which began earlier this month when the Palestinian group launched an unprecedented attack on Israel that Israeli officials say killed more than 1,400 people.

Palestinian authorities say more than 7,000 people have been killed in Israeli air strikes on Gaza carried out in response to Hamas's October 7 attacks.

On Wednesday, Biden said he

US attacks facilities in Syria

had directly warned Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei against targeting US troops in the Middle East.

Washington and Tehran do not have formal diplomatic relations, and Biden did not say how the message was communicated.

Mohammad Jamshidi, an aide to Iran's President Ebrahim Raisi, disputed Biden's account in a comment posted on social media.

US officials are concerned about the possibility of fighting between Israel and Hamas escalating into a broader regional conflict.

Iran backs both Hamas, which governs Gaza, and the Lebanese armed group Hezbollah, which Israel has clashed with in skirmishes along the Israel-Lebanon border.

On Thursday, Iran's Foreign Minister Hossein Amir-Abdollahian said at the United Nations that the US would "not be spared from this fire" if Israel's bombardment of Gaza did not end.

Saudi Arabia is a leader of the Arab and Islamic world. It has never formally recognised Israel since the creation of the state in

1948.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu talked up the possibility last month, claiming: "We're about to witness a pivot of history."

Any deal, though, would be deeply controversial.

In return for recognising Israel, Saudi Arabia is said to be demanding US guarantees for advanced American-made weapons and, most contentious of all, a civil nuclear programme including in-country uranium enrichment.

Israel for its part would benefit from trade and defence ties with the Gulf superpower and further historic integration it has always sought in the region, following on from other Arab state normalisation deals brokered in 2020.

For a deal to succeed it would have to be seen to involve significant Israeli concessions to the Palestinians.

Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, the kingdom's de facto ruler, needs to assuage his own public - historically opposed to Israel and deeply sympathetic to the Palestinian cause.

EU leaders call for 'humanitarian pauses', aid corridors in Israel-Gaza war

EUROPEAN Union leaders have called for humanitarian pauses in the fighting between Israel and the armed Palestinian group Hamas as the Gaza Strip

The summit on Thursday is the first in-person meeting since Hamas carried out attacks on October 7 on southern Israel, which killed more than 1,400 people, most of them civilians.

The assault by Hamas has been widely condemned with grim scenes emerging from towns in southern Israel where Palestinian gunmen massacred families and kidnapped more than 200 people.

The EU leaders reiterated previous calls for the immediate release of those held captive "without any precondition" and emphasised Israel's right to

defend itself "in line with international law".

But such statements, similar to others made by the United States, have rung hollow to some as Israel carries out devastating air strikes that have levelled entire neighbourhoods and killed more than 7,000 people in Gaza, some in zones where Israel had told Palestinians to move to seek safety.

In the Middle East, protesters have criticised Israel's allies as hypocritical.

Malaysian sultans choose new king way

MALAYSIA has announced that its next and 17th king will be Sultan Ibrahim Sultan Iskandar from the southern state

of Johor.

Sultan Ibrahim was chosen by the country's nine sultans at a session of the Conference of Rulers on Friday and will be

installed on January 31 next year.

"I hereby inform that the Conference of Rulers, during its 263rd (Special) Meeting, held at the National Palace on Friday, October 27, 2023, has agreed to declare that His Royal Highness Sultan Ibrahim, Sultan of Johor Darul Ta'zim, has been chosen as His Majesty the Yang di-Pertuan Agong XVII for a period of five years commencing from Jan 31, 2024," the keeper of the Royal Seal said in a statement.

The Yang di-Pertuan Agong or "King of Kings" is a constitutional monarch, but since the historic elections of 2018 and the revolving door of ruling coalitions that followed, the king has taken a more active role in politics.

King Al-Sultan Abdullah has used the monarch's discretionary powers to choose the country's last three prime ministers, including after the election in 2022 when no single party won a parliamentary majority.

Sultan Ibrahim, who is said to have a passion for fast cars and motorbikes and has extensive business interests, is also known for taking an annual road trip

Shifting politics make India hotbed for Israel-Hamas

Social media accounts spread pro-Israel content as Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi seeks closer ties with Israel. MEGHA BAHREE writes.

ON October 7, within hours of the armed group Hamas launching a surprise attack on Israel, social media platforms were rife with support for Israel – and also fake news.

What stood out in the clamour was the fact that a fair amount of it was produced and distributed by accounts from India.

In the days after Israel declared war on Hamas, a blue-tick-verified handle posted a video on the social media platform X of a Pakistani parliamentarian threatening to obliterate Israel with an “atom bomb” if it did not end its atrocities against Muslims. That video received more than 840,000 views. But it was from 2021 and is not related to the current war.

Similarly, Suresh Chavhanke, editor-in-chief of Sudarshan News, a right-wing channel, shared a clip on X of an Israeli representative tearing up a 20-page United Nations report documenting human rights violations. That too was from 2021.

Experts say the Israel-Hamas war has given a massive reach to social media accounts in India – both large and small – that have managed to ride a wave of anti-Muslim and pro-Israel fervour.

Apoorvanand, a Delhi University professor who goes by one name, perceives a link between current “anti-Muslim sentiment” and the rise of Hindu nationalist ideologies like Hindutva, particularly under the government of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Hindutva supporters, he said, “hold Muslims across countries responsible for all the ills and everything bad. They’ve started looking at Israel as an ideal, as a model to be followed because Israel does what it wants to do to Muslims”.

A “generational shift” has taken place in India, said Nicolas Blarel, an associate professor of international

relations at Leiden University in the Netherlands.

Over the last decade, Blarel has observed that the country has grown more fascinated with Israel, including how it defends itself against attacks from its neighbours.

That situation has particular resonance in India, according to Blarel. In addition to border incursions from China in the east, India has also been subject to attacks on its western flank by what it says are state-supported armed groups in Pakistan. The two nuclear-armed nations have been locked in an ongoing conflict for control of the disputed territory of Kashmir.

Those tense international relations have, in part, led Modi’s Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) to seek warmer relations with Israel.

“Terrorism is the thing that’s brought the BJP closer to Israel over the last few years – how to better deal with counterterrorism,” said Blarel.

As a result, India’s political sphere has transformed from “an exclusive pro-Palestine ecosystem to the complete opposite and to one that is completely empathetic with [the] Israeli position” today, he explained.

Indeed, India had supported Palestine’s right to statehood since 1947, when it gained independence from the United Kingdom.

At the time, the United Nations had proposed a “partition plan” to create separate Israeli and Palestinian states, something India objected to.

The plan never took effect, though. The very next year, Israel declared independence, sparking a conflict that would see the mass displacement of Palestinians.

Still, in 1974, India became the first non-Arab country to recognise the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO)

as the “sole and legitimate representative” of the Palestinian people, continuing its pattern of support.

And while New Delhi formally recognised Israel in 1950, it only normalised diplomatic relations in the early 1990s. Even then, it remained committed to the Palestinian cause and continued nurturing its relations with the Muslim-majority nations in the Middle East.

However, in the past few years, India and Israel have started inching closer. The attacks in India’s financial capital Mumbai on November 26, 2008, helped spur the shift.

More than 160 people were killed and over 300 injured. A Jewish centre, the Nariman House, was among the targets: An Israeli American rabbi and his wife were among the six gunned down there. India blamed the attacks on a Pakistan-based armed group.

Trade and innovation have also drawn the two countries together. When Modi was chief minister of Gujarat, he displayed his fascination for Israeli technologies including drip irrigation and water desalination, both useful for his state.

Israel has also been a supplier of arms to India, including during its 1999 skirmish with Pakistan in the Kashmiri region of Kargil. Israeli surveillance drones and mortar shells helped India emerge victorious in that conflict.

More recently, India was one of the countries accused of having bought Pegasus spyware from the Israeli cyber-intelligence firm NSO Group. Critics accuse the Modi government of deploying the spyware against judges, journalists, activists and political leaders, among others.

Experts agree that the biggest shift in India’s foreign policy towards Israel has happened since Modi came to power in

2014. He became the first Indian prime minister to visit Israel in 2017.

In the wake of the Hamas attack on October 7, Modi has issued strong declarations in support of Israel. He initially tweeted, “Our thoughts and prayers are with the innocent victims and their families. We stand in solidarity with Israel.”

In a follow-up statement later that day, Modi added that “India strongly and unequivocally condemns terrorism in all its forms and manifestations”.

But neither statement made any reference to the lives or plight of Palestinians. Only five days later did his government address the question of Palestinian relations: In response to a question during a routine media briefing, a spokesperson for the foreign minister said India’s stance on Palestine had not changed.

“I was struck by Modi’s response to express solidarity with Israel and say nothing about Palestine at all,” said Michael Kugelman, director of the South Asia Institute at the Wilson Center think tank in Washington, DC. “Because India’s policy has been balanced so far.”

The statements showed “total support for Israel to defend itself”, according to Ashok Swain, head of the department of peace and conflict research at Uppsala University in Sweden.

While New Delhi is now trying to maintain a more balanced position, those early statements showed that Modi is more interested in getting votes and appealing to his right-wing constituency, Swain added.

They send the message that Muslims are “the perpetrators of all sorts of crimes and less than human beings. They don’t talk about the Gaza situation or even who created Hamas”.

Swain also sees the statements as a demonstration of the common ground Modi shares with far-right politicians in

Israel.

“Hindu nationalists and Zionists have an ideological similarity: They want a strong state and a strong leader,” he explained. “They also have a common factor – Islamophobia – which also binds them together.”

Those tensions played out on social media in the immediate aftermath of the outbreak of the Israel-Hamas war.

At Al Jazeera’s request, the Narrative Research Lab in New Delhi scanned through trending hashtags and phrases in India on the social media platform X, to better understand how political narratives about the war were being shaped.

The phrase “We Indians” stood out partially because of the ongoing Cricket World Cup but also because of the conflict, said Sarabjot Singh, the lab’s co-founder.

“We Indians” is an expression often invoked to stir nationalist pride. Using it as a keyword, Singh’s co-founder Sundeep Narwani used artificial intelligence to analyse a total of 4,316 tweets, of which 2,200 included words about the Israel-Hamas war.

More than 1,250 were pro-Israel, and approximately 250 were pro-Palestine, indicating a five-to-one ratio in favour of Israel.

In an attempt to gauge social media chatter, the lab also analysed two hashtags: “#IstandwithIsrael” and “#IsraelPalestineWar”. The former was used globally, but the lab found a “substantial” number of Indian accounts using it.

“Issues that bring Modi and Netanyahu together are the same issues that make the Hindutva constituency in India gravitate towards Israel – admiring how Netanyahu has negotiated the neighbourhood with a strong stance,” said Kugelman.

The Judge, His Honour, Emmanuel Iyanna, gave the injunction on Wednesday, October 18, 2023, in the case with Motion No: MN/218/2023.

D'banj, through one of his lawyers, Toheeb Lawal from Abuja-based law firm, Law

Corridor, had filed an application at the court for an injunction restraining Do2dtun from making malicious and defamatory posts against him on social media.

In granting the application, which has D'banj as the complainant and Do2dtun as the respondent, Iyanna granted "an order restraining the defendant (Do2dtun) either by himself, servants, privies, cohorts, representatives, or any person deriving authority from him from further making any malicious, intimidating or defamatory post directing at the complainant (D'banj) on any social media platform (X, Instagram, etc) or news media pending the hearing and determination of the substantive case".

Also, the court ordered the Deputy Inspector of Police, Force Intelligence Bureau, to investigate a criminal complaint brought by D'banj against Do2dtun within two weeks and report back to court.

Do2dtun had for weeks embarked upon a social media onslaught against D'banj. The OAP was married to D'banj's sister, Taiwo, in 2013, and the union

Guide to Uterine Cancer

CANCER is a cancerous tumor in your uterus, the pear-shaped organ also known as your womb. Most cases happen in the lining of the uterus (endometrium), but you can get tumors in the muscles there, too. Over 60,000 women in the U.S. get this type of cancer each year. If you're past menopause, your chances are higher.

Your Genes Uterine can play a role in how likely you are to have uterine cancer. For example, Lynch syndrome is a genetic disorder that makes you more likely to get certain cancers. Women with it have much higher odds of getting uterine cancer. But having a problem gene doesn't mean you'll get it. It means you and your doctor should watch for signs so you can treat it early if you do. Most women who get uterine cancer don't have a known genetic cause.

There are early signs, if you haven't been through menopause and you have bleeding or spotting -- a red, pink, or white discharge -- between periods, see your doctor. The same is true if you've had menopause and have these symptoms any time. Bleeding can be a sign of uterine cancer, but it's also a symptom of other medical problems. Bleeding after menopause isn't normal, so it definitely needs to be checked out. Your doctor can help you find out what's going on. Other Symptoms, let your doctor know if you have: Pain in your pelvis (the area between your hips)

Lost weight without trying, pain during sex, a hard time peeing or it hurts to pee. It's best if you find uterine cancer before it grows or spreads, so don't put off your checkups or ignore symptoms.

How is it diagnosed? You may have an ultrasound so your doctor can see inside your



uterus. Your doctor may send a thin, lighted tube in through your vagina to get a closer look. But a biopsy is the best way to know if it's cancer. Your doctor will take a small amount of tissue from the endometrium and look for cancer

cells under a microscope.

If you have uterine cancer, your doctor will start with one of the following to see if it has spread to nearby areas, like your cervix, or to your lymph nodes (tiny glands in your neck, armpits, groin, and other parts of your body):

Ultrasound: MRI scan, which uses magnets and radio waves to make detailed images of parts of your body

CT scan, which takes X-rays from different angles and puts them together to make a complete picture. Your doctor probably will recommend that your uterus be taken out. They may surgically remove your fallopian tubes. The procedure is called a hysterectomy. Your ovaries and fallopian tubes will probably be removed, too. If your cancer has spread, your doctor also may take out nearby lymph nodes.

Radiation: Your doctor may recommend this after surgery, kill any cancer cells that may still be there. It may also be an option if surgery isn't a good idea for you. Your doctor may insert a cylinder containing radioactive material into your vagina, or use a machine to aim high-energy rays at harmful cells. New radiation treatment make a 3-dimensional beam that's the shape of the tumor, or

Therapy. Here, Estrogen and other hormones in your body can make uterine cancer grow or spread faster. Drugs like progestins, tamoxifen, LHRH agonists, and aromatase inhibitors are used to block these hormones to slow the tumor's growth. This can cause side effects that feel like menopause, including hot flashes, weight gain, or dryness in your vagina.

Immunotherapy too, These drugs help your own immune system find and attack cancer cells. To keep itself from fighting the body's normal cells, your immune system uses "checkpoints." These are parts of cells that need to be turned on or off to start the disease-fighting process. Drugs that target these checkpoints, called checkpoint inhibitors, may help treat some more serious types of endometrial cancer.

He may recommend Targeted Therapy, some newer drugs target changes that are seen in cancer cells. Several of them work by stopping new blood vessels from forming in tumors. This helps slow the spread of cancer. Clinical Trials could be done. You may be able to be part of a test for new and better drugs to treat uterine cancer. Ask your doctor if there are trials in your area and if one might be right

for you.

Your sex life: Side effects of uterine cancer treatment can change your sex life. Vaginal dryness or mood changes from hormone therapy may make sex painful or reduce your desire. If you've had surgery to remove both your ovaries and uterus, you may have the same issues. But lubricants can help with dryness, and some women say their sex lives actually get better after surgery because they have less pain and other symptoms.

While most women who get uterine cancer are past menopause, younger women can get it, too. If you hope to have children, talk to your doctor about your options, such as storing eggs, before you begin treatment -- surgery, radiation, and hormones can affect your fertility. Get regular women's health checkups so your doctor can spot any signs of cancer early. Your age, genes, and family history may raise your risk of uterine cancer. So can obesity. You can do some things to help prevent it, though, like staying at a healthy weight and getting plenty of exercise. Work closely with your doctor, who can help you control the risk factors that can be controlled.

Symptoms of peptic ulcers

PEPTIC ulcers are open sores that develop on the inside lining of your stomach and the upper portion of your small intestine. The most common symptom of a peptic ulcer is stomach pain.

They include:

Gastric ulcers that occur on the inside of the stomach, duodenal ulcers that occur on the inside of the upper portion of your small intestine (duodenum).

The most common causes of peptic ulcers are infection with the bacterium *Helicobacter pylori* (*H. pylori*) and long-term use of nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) such as ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin IB, others) and naproxen sodium (Aleve). Stress and spicy foods do not cause peptic ulcers. However, they can make your symptoms worse.

Symptoms of peptic ulcers include burning stomach pain, feeling of fullness, bloating or belching, intolerance to fatty foods, heartburn, nausea.

The most common peptic ulcer symptom is burning stomach pain. Stomach acid makes the pain worse, as does having an empty stomach. The pain can often be relieved by eating certain foods that buffer stomach acid or by taking an acid-reducing medication, but then it may come back. The pain may be worse between meals and at night.

Many people with peptic ulcers don't even have symptoms. Less often, ulcers may cause severe signs or symptoms such as:

Vomiting or vomiting blood — which may appear red or black, dark blood in stools, or stools that are black or tarry, trouble breathing, feeling faint, nausea or vomiting, unexplained weight loss, appetite changes.

See your doctor if you have returns.

the severe signs or symptoms listed above. Also see your doctor if over-the-counter antacids and acid blockers relieve your pain but the pain

Peptic ulcers occur when acid in the digestive tract eats away at the inner surface of the stomach or small intestine. The acid can create a painful open sore that may bleed.

Your digestive tract is coated with a mucous layer that normally protects against acid. But if the amount of acid is increased or the amount of mucus is decreased, you could develop an ulcer. Common causes include: A bacterium. *Helicobacter pylori* bacteria commonly live in the mucous layer that covers and protects tissues that line the stomach and small intestine. Often, the *H. pylori* bacterium causes no problems, but it can cause inflammation of the stomach's inner layer, producing an ulcer.

It's not clear how *H. pylori* infection spreads. It may be transmitted from person to person by close contact, such as kissing. People may also contract *H. pylori* through food and water. Regular use of

certain pain relievers. Taking aspirin, as well as certain over-the-counter and prescription pain medications called nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs), can irritate or inflame the lining of your stomach and small intestine. These medications include ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin IB, others), naproxen sodium (Aleve, Anaprox DS, others), ketoprofen and others. They do not include acetaminophen (Tylenol, others).

Other medications. Taking certain other medications along with NSAIDs, such as steroids, anticoagulants, low-dose aspirin, selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRIs), alendronate (Fosamax) and risedronate (Actonel), can greatly increase the chance of developing ulcers.

Risk factors. In addition to having risks related to taking NSAIDs, you may have an increased risk of peptic ulcers if you:

Smoking may increase the risk of peptic ulcers in people who are infected with *H. pylori*. Alcohol can irritate and erode the mucous lining of your stomach, and it increases the amount of stomach acid that's produced. Have untreated stress.

Eating spicy foods,

alone, these factors do not cause ulcers, but they can make ulcers worse and more difficult to heal.

Left untreated, peptic ulcers can result in: Internal bleeding. Bleeding can occur as slow blood loss that leads to anemia or as severe blood loss that may require hospitalization or a blood transfusion. Severe blood loss may cause black or bloody vomit or black or bloody stools.

A hole (perforation) in your stomach wall. Peptic ulcers can eat a hole through (perforate) the wall of your stomach or small intestine, putting you at risk of serious infection of your abdominal cavity (peritonitis). Peptic ulcers can block passage of food through the digestive tract, causing you to become full easily, to vomit and to lose weight either through swelling from inflammation or through scarring.

Studies have shown that people infected with *H. pylori* have an increased risk of gastric cancer. You may reduce your risk of peptic ulcer if you follow the same strategies recommended as home remedies to treat ulcers. It also may be helpful to:

Protect yourself from infections. It's not clear just how *H. pylori* spreads, but there's some evidence that it could be transmitted from person to person or through food and water.

You can take steps to protect yourself from infections, such as *H. pylori*, by frequently washing your hands with soap and water and by eating foods that have been cooked completely.

Use caution with pain relievers. If you regularly use pain relievers that increase your risk of peptic ulcer, take steps to reduce your risk of stomach problems. For instance, take your medication with meals. Work with your doctor to find the lowest dose possible that still gives you pain relief. Avoid drinking alcohol when taking your medication, since the two can combine to increase your risk of stomach upset.

How to recognize an Online Scammer



THE great thing about the internet is that there's room for everyone. The not-so-great part? There's plenty of room for cybercriminals who are hungry to get their hands on our personal information.

Fortunately, internet scams don't have to be a part of your online experience. In this article, we'll tell you about some of the most common internet schemes and how you can recognize them to keep your identity safe.

Scams are scary, but you can prevent yourself from falling for one by knowing what to look for. Here are a few tell-tale signs that you're dealing with a scammer.

They say you've won a huge prize

If you get a message that you've won a big sum of cash in a sweepstakes you don't remember entering, it's a scam. Scammers may tell you that all you need to do to claim your prize is send them a small fee or give them your banking information. When you enter a real sweepstakes or lottery, it's generally up to you to contact the organizer to claim your prize. Sweepstakes aren't likely to chase you down to give you money. They want you to pay in a certain way.

Scammers will often ask you to pay them using gift cards, money orders, cryptocurrency (like Bitcoin), or through a particular money transfer service. Scammers need payments in forms that don't give consumers protection.

Gift card payments, for example, are typically not reversible and hard to trace. Legitimate organizations will rarely, if ever, ask you to pay using a specific method, especially gift cards. When you have to make online payments, it's a good idea to use a secure service like PayPal. Secure payment systems can have features to keep you safe, like end-to-end encryption.

They say it's an emergency

Scammers may try to make you panic by saying you owe money to a government agency and you need to pay them immediately to avoid being arrested. Or the criminal might try to tug at your heartstrings by

pretending to be a family member in danger who needs money. Criminals want you to pay them or give them your information quickly — before you have a chance to think about it. If someone tries to tell you to pay them immediately in a text message, phone call, or email, they're likely a scammer.

They say they're from a government organization or company

Many scammers pretend to be part of government organizations like the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). They'll claim you owe them money. Criminals can even use technology to make their phone numbers appear legitimate on your caller ID. If someone claiming to be part of a government organization contacts you, go to that organization's official site and find an official support number or email. Contact them to verify the information in the initial message. Scammers may also pretend to be businesses, like your utility company. They'll likely say something to scare you, like your gas will be turned off if you don't pay them right away.

The email is littered with grammatical errors

Most legitimate organizations will thoroughly proofread any copy or information they send to consumers. Professional emails are well-written, clear, and error-free. On the other hand, scam emails will likely be full of grammar, spelling, and punctuation errors.

It might surprise you to know that scammers write sloppy emails on purpose. The idea is that if the reader is attentive enough to spot the grammatical mistakes, they likely won't fall for the scam.

There are certain scams that criminals try repeatedly because they've worked on so many people. Here are a few of the most common scams you should watch out for. Phishing scams:

A phishing scam can be a phone or email scam.

The criminal sends a message in which they pretend to represent an organization you know. It directs you to a fraud website that collects your sensitive information, like your passwords, Social Security

number (SSN), and bank account data. Once the scammer has your personal information, they can use it for personal gain. Phishing emails may try anything to get you to click on their fake link. They might claim to be your bank and ask you to log into your account to verify some suspicious activity. Or they could pretend to be a sweepstakes and say you need to fill out a form to claim a large reward. During the coronavirus pandemic, new phishing scams have emerged, with scammers claiming to be part of various charities and nonprofits. Sites like Charity Navigator can help you discern real groups from fake ones.

Travel insurance scams: These scams also became much more prominent during the pandemic. Let's say you're preparing to fly to Paris with your family. A scammer sends you a message offering you an insurance policy on any travel plans you might be making. They'll claim the policy will compensate you if your travel plans fall through for any reason without any extra charges. You think it might be a good idea to purchase this type of insurance. Right before leaving for your trip, you have to cancel your plans. You go to collect your insurance money only to realize the insurance company doesn't exist. Real travel insurance from a licensed business generally won't cover foreseeable events (like travel advisories, government turmoil, or pandemics) unless you buy a Cancel for Any Reason (CFAR) addendum for your policy.

Grandparent scams,

Prey on your instinct to protect your family. The scammer will call or send an email pretending to be a family member in some sort of emergency who needs you to wire them money. The scammer may beg you to act right away and avoid sharing their situation with any other family members. For example, the scammer might call and say they're your grandchild who's been arrested in Mexico and needs money to pay bail. They'll say they're in danger and need you to send funds now to save them. If you get a call or an email from an alleged family member requesting money, take the time to make sure

they're actually who they say they are. Never wire transfer money right away or over the phone. Ask them a question that only the family member would know and verify their story with the rest of your family.

Advance fee scam:

You get an email from a prince. They've recently inherited a huge fortune from a member of their royal family. Now, the prince needs to keep their money in an American bank account to keep it safe. If you let them store their money in your bank account, you'll be handsomely rewarded. You just need to send them a small fee to get the money. There are several versions of this scam, but the prince iteration is a pretty common one. If you get these types of emails, don't respond or give out your financial information.

Tech support scams:

Your online experience is rudely interrupted when a pop-up appears telling you there's a huge virus on your computer. You need to "act fast" and contact the support phone number on the screen. If you don't, all of your important data will be erased. When you call the number, a fake tech support worker asks you for remote access to your device to "fix" the problem. If you give the scammer access to your device, they may steal your personal and financial information or install malware. Worse yet, they'll probably charge you for it. These scams can be pretty elaborate. A scam pop-up may even appear to be from a reputable software company. If you see this type of pop-up, don't respond to it. Instead, try restarting or turning off your device. If the device doesn't start back up, search for the support number for the device manufacturer and contact them directly.

Formjacking and retail scams:

Scammers will often pose as popular e-commerce companies by creating fake websites. The fake webpages might offer huge deals on social media. They'll also likely have a URL close to the real business's URL but slightly different. Sometimes, a criminal is skilled enough to hack the website of a large online retailer. When a scammer infiltrates a retailer's website, they can redirect where the links on that site lead. This is called formjacking. For example, you might go to an e-commerce store to buy a jacket. You find the jacket and put it in your online shopping cart. You click "check out," and you're taken to a form that collects your credit card information. What you don't know is that the checkout form is fake. Your credit card number is going directly to the scammers.

Whenever you're redirected from a website to make a payment or enter in information, always check the URL. If the form is legitimate, it will have the same URL as the site you were on. A fake form will have a URL that's close to but not exactly the same as the original site.

Scareware scams (fake antivirus):

These scams are similar to tech support scams. However, instead of urging you to speak directly with a fake tech support person, their goal is to get you to download a fake antivirus software product (scareware). You'll see a pop-up that says your computer has a virus, malware, or some other problem. The only way to get rid of the problem is to install the security software the pop-up links to. You think you're downloading antivirus software that will save your computer. What you're actually downloading is malicious software. There are several types of malware. The program might be ransomware that locks up your information until you pay the scammers or spyware that tracks your online activity.

To avoid this scam, never download antivirus software from a pop-up. You'll be much better off visiting the website of a reputable company, like McAfee, to download antivirus software.

Credit repair scams:

Dealing with credit card debt can be extremely stressful. Scammers know this and try to capitalize off it. They'll send emails posing as credit experts and tell you they can help you fix your credit or relieve some of your debt. They might even claim they can hide harmful details on your credit report. All you have to do is pay a small fee. Of course, after you pay the fee, the "credit expert" disappears without helping you out with your credit at all. Generally, legitimate debt settlement firms won't charge you upfront. If a credit relief company charges you a fee upfront, that's a red flag. Before you enter into an agreement with any credit service, check out their reputation. Do an online search on the company to see what you can find. If there's nothing about the credit repair company online, it's probably fake.

What can you do if you get scammed online? Admitting that you've fallen for an online scam can be embarrassing. But reporting a scammer can help stop them from taking advantage of anyone else. If you've been the victim of an online scam, try contacting your local police department and other relevant authorities.

Physical symptoms of depression

DEPRESSION can affect your body as well as your mind. Trouble falling or staying asleep is common in people who are depressed. But some may find that they get too much shut-eye.

It can be a sign of heart, lung, or stomach problems, so see your doctor to rule out those causes. Sometimes, though, it's a symptom of depression. Depression can also raise your risk of heart disease. Plus, people who've had heart attacks are more likely to be depressed.

If you feel so tired that you don't have energy for everyday tasks -- even when you sleep or rest a lot -- it may be a sign that you're depressed. Depression and fatigue together tend to make both conditions seem worse. Aching muscles and joints too, when you live with ongoing pain it can raise your risk of depression. Depression may also lead to pain because the two conditions share chemical messengers in the brain. People who are depressed are three times as likely to get regular pain.

Depression can cause digestive problems, our brains and digestive systems are strongly connected, which is why many of us get stomachaches or nausea when we're stressed or worried.

It can get you in your gut too -- causing nausea, indigestion, diarrhea, or constipation or headaches. One study shows that people with major depression are three times more likely to have migraines, and people with migraines are five times more likely to get depressed.

Changes in appetite or weight loss is also a sign of depression,

some people feel less hungry when they get depressed. Others can't stop eating. The result can be weight gain or loss, along with lack of energy.

Depression has been linked to eating disorders like bulimia, anorexia, or binge eating. When you have back ache and it hurts you there on a regular basis, it may contribute to depression. And people who are depressed may be four times more likely to get intense, disabling neck or back pain. Agitation and restlessness, sleep problems or other depression symptoms can make you feel this way. Men are more likely than women to be irritable when they're depressed.

Sexual Problems:

If you're depressed, you might lose

your interest in sex. Some prescription drugs that treat depression can also take away your drive and affect performance. Talk to your doctor about your medicine options.

Find out what may be causing your symptoms. Exercise.

Research suggests that if you do it regularly, it releases chemicals in your brain that make you feel good, improve your mood, and reduce your sensitivity to pain. Although physical activity alone won't cure depression, it can help ease it over the long term.

If you're depressed, it can sometimes be hard to get the energy to exercise. But try to remember that it can ease fatigue and help you sleep better. Midlife can make you miserable. A 2008 study of data from 2 million people found that midlife depression spans the globe. In the U.S., it peaks at around age 40 for women and 50 for men, and usually starts to lift in the 50s. Why? People may learn to adapt to their strengths and weaknesses and value life more, the researchers say.

Squeezed between the demands of children, aging parents, marriage, and your job? Feeling sad, worthless, and guilty? Women tend to shoulder more of the "sandwich generation" burdens -- and up to half become depressed as a result.

Therefore, make sure you're caring for yourself, too. Exercise, get enough rest, eat healthy, see friends, and get help -- for caregiving demands and depression -- if you need it.

As men age, their bodies produce less of the important sex hormone testosterone. Low testosterone levels can cause depression, as well as erectile dysfunction (ED) -- trouble getting or keeping an erection -- and a decreased interest in sex. Ask your doctor to test the levels of testosterone in your blood. If it is low, ask your doctor about replacement therapy and other treatment options.

Hormone fluctuations, hot flashes, and life changes related to perimenopause and menopause can make your mood plummet. If you have trouble sleeping, a history of depression, or PMS, mood swings or depression may worsen during this transitional period. For mild depression, try self-calming skills such as yoga or deep breathing. Do things that make you feel better, such as exercise or going out with friends, or find a creative outlet. For more serious, long-lasting symptoms of depression, prescription medication or talk therapy can help.

If your child has left home, an "empty nest" can make you feel

empty. Going through menopause or retirement at the same time may make it harder. Try to see it as an opportunity. Reconnect with your spouse, other family members, and friends. Pursue hobbies and interests you didn't have time for before. Give yourself time to adjust. If your mood doesn't lift in a few months, talk to your doctor. Do you feel too listless to check your blood sugar regularly? Are unpredictable blood sugar levels making you feel out of control? Depression is a common and dangerous complication of many chronic conditions, including diabetes. Depression also may keep you from taking good care of your diabetes. Talk to your doctor if you've been depressed for more than two weeks. Talk therapy, medication, and better diabetes control can help you manage both conditions. Depression is serious and if left untreated can be life threatening.

About 1 in 4 older people who drink heavily has major depression. Some older people start drinking more because of stressful events, such as retirement or a spouse's death. Yet alcohol problems are often mistaken for other age-related issues. A combination of medications can treat both alcohol dependence and depression. Individual or group therapy can also help deal with issues that may trigger drinking.

Insomnia and other sleep disruptions, which are common as we age, are closely related to depression. Insomnia can be a sign that you are depressed, and if you have insomnia but aren't depressed, you're at higher risk of developing mood changes. Obstructive sleep apnea and restless legs syndrome also have been linked to depression. Talk to your doctor about possible reasons for your sleep problems and get treatment for them. Learn good sleep hygiene habits, such as regular bedtime hours. Exercise early regularly and avoid caffeine, alcohol, or nicotine, which interfere with sleep. Prescription medication may also help.

If you were forced into retirement -- because of poor health or other reasons -- you might very well be depressed. Factors such as financial insecurity or lack of social support can also make retirement a downer. Busy retirees tend to be happier retirees. Learn new skills, take classes, get exercise. Be

flexible: For example, if your health makes activities like travel difficult, take in museums and foreign films. It's common to feel depressed after a diagnosis of heart disease or having a heart attack or cardiac surgery. But many people with heart disease go on to experience severe, long-term depression. And that can worsen heart health. A healthy diet and sleep, mild exercise, relaxation techniques, and joining a support group can help you get through the blues. If depression lasts, antidepressants or talk therapy can help.

Social support can help prevent or ease depression. But some kinds of social support may be better than others. A study of people in a retirement community found that those who stayed connected with friends living elsewhere had less depression. Support from within the community didn't affect mood. Maintain ties with close friends and family members. Explore Internet technology that can give you virtual face-time with distant friends. Any chronic or serious condition -- such as Parkinson's disease or a stroke -- can lead to depression. A stroke can also affect the areas of the brain that control mood. Be realistic but positive. Learn how to cope with physical effects of your illness. Don't let them get in the way of taking care of yourself and having fun. If you have symptoms of depression, don't wait -- get help right away.

Feeling foggy and forgetful? It could be depression or dementia, a condition marked by memory loss. The signs and symptoms can be similar. Or it could be both -- depression is more common in older people who have dementia, especially Alzheimer's. If you don't know what's causing your symptoms, see your doctor so you can get the right treatment, if necessary. It's normal to grieve after losing a spouse or other loved one. But grief can grow into depression. Memory problems, confusion, and social withdrawal can be symptoms of depression in older people. Both grief and depression raise the risk for heart-related deaths. Let yourself grieve. Express your feelings to friends, in a support group, or to a grief counselor. For depression, medication and talk therapy can help.

To keep your mood up, it helps to have good emotional and social support. But who says social support needs to be human? Studies show that pets can help people have less depression and loneliness and more self-esteem and happiness. Pets are friends with other benefits, too. Walking a dog, for example, is good exercise and a great way to meet people. A good laugh can relax muscles, reduce stress, and relieve pain. And research suggests that a good sense of humor can take the bite out of depression. For humor on demand, create a laugh library of funny books, cartoons, and DVDs. Or try laughter yoga, which uses playful activities and breathing exercises to provoke giggles.

Helping others can help you forget your own problems. Volunteering feels good at any age, but it may hold special benefits for older people. If retirement has you adrift, for example, it can give your life a new sense of purpose and satisfaction. Recent research suggests that it may even prevent frailty in older people. Find a cause that has special importance to you and get involved.

Agric: Steady approach towards sustainable food security

***It is a known mantra that organisations are charged to think outside the box. We, at the Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security, have decided to think without the box if we are to achieve our mandate.* – Hon. Minister of Agriculture and Food Security, Senator Abubakar Kyari opines. IBRAHIM TAHIR Writes.**

THE Renewed Hope Agenda of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu, is set to launch the renewed hope wheat revolution initiative in November, through, of course, the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security; which is aimed at enhancing food security and achieving self-sufficiency in Nigeria.

This is to be kick-started in November with over 70,000 hectares to be cultivated across wheat production zones, with an aggressive expected yield of 875,000 metric tonnes. Presidential approval was sought by the Agric. Minister, for the blending of important fertilisers to support this year's dry season farming, while already making provisions for next year's farming season.

This approval has been expeditiously granted by President Tinubu, which includes the Train the Trainer program for extension agents involved in dry season farming in collaboration with wheat producing states and other partners. This was unveiled at a press conference on the 7th of October, 2023; by The Federal Ministry of Agric., under the leadership of the Hon.

Minister of Agric. Sen. Abu Kyari, and his counterpart, the Hon. Minister of State, Senator Aliyu Abdullahi.

The Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security has well over 43 agencies, with a huge number of development partners both foreign and domestic. This has necessitated the prudent approach of the new Leadership of the ministry, in taking it's time to receive briefings from all of these agencies and partners, to be able to properly assess what they have met on ground: before embarking on a new drive to implement Mr. President's Food Security initiative, with workable plans that can harness the structures and existing policies and plans on ground.

To this end, the ministry is in the process of carrying out a robust stakeholder analysis that will provide a working stakeholder map showing who

does what, where, when and how, while identifying mutually beneficial areas for Small Holder Farmers, Large Scale Farmers, Processors, Marketers and the Organised Private Sector.

This will largely enhance resource utility, thereby reducing duplication and wastage. The National Agricultural Technology and Innovation Policy, NATIP, 2022-2027, shall be a guide with lessons learnt from its implementation processes.

These were impressed upon in the Minister's presser on Friday, 7th October, 2023 at the Agric Ministry's Headquarters.

It was resolved that all the National Agricultural and Food Security Summit will be held in November 2023; to produce an Action Plan with an implementation and sustainability Strategy. The National Council for Agriculture and Food Security meeting in Cross River State to be held in November of 2023, would produce a strategic operational plan for Federal-State-Local Government joint implementation strategies.

There will be a new transparent regime for the mechanisms and processes for the distribution of fertiliser and Agro Pesticides along with other inputs to farmers across the country. Significant investments are to be made in Animal-Feed crops, fodder and pasture production as an antidote to the farmers/herders clashes by focusing on the development of paddocks, foliage and fodder estates equipped for all year round production.

Of utmost priority is the take-off of the National Agricultural Development Fund. Another is to have a collaboration with the Water Resources Ministry, to unlock the huge irrigation potentials of the River Basins Development Authorities and other flood plains in the country

to ensure all year round food production.

Most of these are contained in the short term plans and goals of the ministry. These include the establishment of Agricultural Marketing Incubation Centres (Agribusiness Development Centres) for youth and women in the six geo-political zones of the country.

Other midterm actions to be pursued by the food security ministry include: The development of Digital/ ICT Mobile-based agro industry system and E extension platforms to support farmers through the establishment of the national centres in the 6 agro-ecological zones of Nigeria with a command and control Office in Abuja.

There's also, meat, dairy eggs, fish and other protein from animal sources that would receive special Intervention to increase productivity and target a 10% year on year annual growth rate. Interesting long term plans detailed by the ministry include but not limited to: the repositioning of the Universities of Agriculture and Veterinary Medicines to play key roles in the nation's Agricultural Transformation processes by developing practical approaches to mechanisation and production.

Perhaps a second instalment of this piece would be necessary to fully capture the very diligent work that the Federal Government's Food Security initiatives team is putting together. The thirst for immediate or magical results towards ensuring Food Security is hardly a month or two's job. Not even a quarter of a year can detail a visible or tangible result dashboard.

The wet season is almost done and so therefore; the Minister and his counterpart have to concentrate on a dry season approach which in the long run, would be the main buffer to the traditional wet season farming which is usually dependent on very precarious and uncertain factors for its success.

Dry season and mechanised farming, alongside animal farming, are the most vital components of the agro-allied industries that thrive on the successes of a nation's agriculture and food security system.

I am optimistic that Mr. President's pick of Senator Kyari and Senator Aliyu, to head the Agriculture and Food Security Ministry is one desirous of assured results not just for political points or optics. It is a decision borne out of a desire to have them deliver real-time, long term results whereby self-sufficiency in food production in Nigeria will not only be achieved; but also be sustained.

FG to securitise NLNG dividends

THE Federal government has concluded plans to securitise about \$7 billion of the country's dividends from the Nigerian Liquefied Natural Gas (NLNG). This is part of the government's efforts to boost foreign currency liquidity in the economy and strengthen the embattled naira.

According to the Nigerian government, it expects to get \$7 billion from a consortium led by Standard Chartered Bank from next week.

This arrangement is being organised by the Federal Ministry of Finance Incorporated, which is the shareholder of the NLNG. The move aligns with the recent disclosure by Wale Edun, the minister of Finance and Coordinating Minister of the Economy that the country was expecting about \$10 billion in inflows in the nearest term, which would help to clear the FX backlog and stabilise the naira.

The naira closed at N1,300 to a dollar on the parallel market yesterday, higher than the N1,310 to a dollar which it closed with the previous day while on the official I&E FX

Window, it closed at N837.49 to a dollar, weaker than the N801.10 to a dollar it closed the previous day.

President Bola Tinubu, while speaking at the Nigerian Economic Summit which was held in Abuja on Monday, assured Nigerians and investors that there was an

ongoing plan to boost the country's foreign exchange liquidity.

Tinubu acknowledged the challenges faced by the business community in the financial markets and assured them of additional FX liquidity to restore market confidence.

THE British High Commissioner to Nigeria, Richard Montgomery has said Nigeria has the world's largest electricity deficit that affects 90 million of its population.

He spoke recently in Abuja, at the opening session of a two-day roundtable on the Electricity Act 2023 with the theme, "Implications and Opportunities for State Electricity Markets."

The two-day event organised by the Nigeria Governors' Forum (NGF) is funded by the Foreign Commonwealth Development Office (FCDO) and implemented by United Kingdom Nigeria Infrastructural Advisory Facility (UK-NIAF).

Montgomery who was represented by the Deputy British High Commissioner to Nigeria, Gill Atkinson said, "We have a new government here. It has embarked on important microeconomic reforms.

"The exchange rates and fuel subsidy are bringing short-term pain to the country and the people. But there are positive changes in the medium and long term that will help Nigeria fulfill its potential for the future.

"Part of this particularly

important moment is Nigeria's power sector. Unfortunately, the country has the world's largest electricity deficit. This affects 90 million people. Even those Nigerians who are connected to the grid, face frequent outages and hence don't get a reliable supply."

Montgomery who described the Electricity Act as an important component of the

current reforms noted that the most important feature of the Act is the provision to allow states to pass laws to govern the generation, transmission, and distribution of electricity.

In his remarks, the Chairman of NGF and Kwara State Governor, AbdulRahman AbdulRazaq said the forum believes in partnership and getting divergent views to boost electricity supply.

Why we can't sell BUA cement at N3,500

SOME cement retailers in Lagos and Ogun state have given reasons BUA Cement products are still sold above N5,000 per bag despite the company announcing a 36.4 percent cut in price on October 1.

BUA Cement had disclosed that the ex-factory price of its product will be reduced to N3,500 per bag from N5,500 – starting from October 2. The company made the decision after Abdul Samad Rabi, BUA Cement founder, met with President Bola Tinubu on September 16.

BUA Cement said its ongoing effort to increase production capacity to 17 million metric tonnes per annum (MTPA) before the end of 2023 made it possible for the company to reduce its ex-factory price for licenced dealers and end users.

However, three weeks later, the price of BUA's cement has remained above N5,000 in some retail stores in Lagos and Ogun state.

Speaking to Olubukola Oluwadare, a cement retailer in an area in Ikorodu, Lagos, she said BUA sells the cement at N3,500 at its factory in Benin, however, retailers will have to visit the production site to buy the product at that price.

According to Oluwadare, BUA Cement representative said the company does not have enough trucks to distribute its products, so retailers have to hire trucks to load the cement.

Oluwadare said that she partnered with another retailer to hire a truck, but the cost – N1,000 per bag – discouraged them, so she sells only the Dangote brand.

She said BUA does not have

enough lorries, "what they do is within their vicinity there. He even said if I have Dangote vehicle, that some of them are using it to bring their own down to here (Ikorodu)".

According to Oluwadare, engaging a truck that belongs to Dangote Cement to load BUA's products could create an issue.

Oluwadare, who was not comfortable with the suggestion, said hiring a truck meant she would bear the cost of the driver and the offloaders but "when we calculated all the money from that place to here, it is almost N5,050". Another retailer in Ikorodu, who spoke on condition of anonymity, corroborated Oluwadare's statement on purchasing the product directly from BUA's factory to get it at N3,500.

He said: "Transportation alone has covered the whole (discount), you will have to increase your money (price) to like N5,000 or so."

The retailer said Elephant brands cost N5,300 and Dangote is N5,400 – yet both brands are distributed to them – but they have to hire a truck, do the work of a distributor to stock BUA's products and eventually sell them above N5,000.

Abdullateef Abayomi, another cement retailer and block maker, in Alagbole, Ogun State, said the new price can't take effect immediately because many still have BUA's cement bought at the previous price.

"If you say it should take effect, people that have already buy their market, they will lose lot of money (sic). Imagine from N5,300 to N3,700," Abayomi said.

"That's about N2,000 of shortage. That is why it has not taken effect."

He said the new price would most likely take effect by December.

BUA Cement didn't respond to enquiries sent to the company.

Nigerians groan under weight of tomato prices

TOMATOES have become more expensive in Lagos in recent weeks, putting many Nigerian households under increasing pressure amid mounting economic headwinds.

"I used N6,500 worth of tomatoes to cook a pot of soup – the same quantity I used to get for N2,000,"

Temitayo Fadahunsi, a public servant in Lagos, said. "In March, I bought a medium-sized basket of tomatoes for N4,000; last weekend the same quantity was sold for N19,000-N24,000 at Ile-Epo market," the mother of one added.

BusinessDay findings show

that a big basket of tomatoes is sold for between N36,000 and N38,000 in Mile 12 Market, Lagos, as against N10,000 in April this year.

The price of a medium-sized basket of tomatoes has risen to N19,000-N23,000 from around N4,500 in April.

The surge in the prices of fresh fruits this year started much earlier in May after Tuta Absoluta invaded farms in major tomato-growing areas in the country.

Tomatoes in Nigeria are grown in the dry season (December-April). The rainy season, May to September,

is not conducive for growing tomatoes, as rainwater destroys the tomato crop, according to experts.

A tomato trader in Ajah market who buys from Mile 12 also confirmed that the price of this staple has been on an increase since May.

It was gathered that the high cost of transportation is also a major factor responsible for the surge in tomato prices.

"Some food sellers buy esha (almost rotten tomatoes) because they are cheaper and mix it with dry pepper and tomato paste since they can't afford the fresh ones," a tomato trader at Obalende market said.

In September, the headline inflation rate increased to 26.72 percent, with the food inflation rate at 30.64 percent, according to the National Bureau of Statistics.

"Unsurprisingly, food prices increased on the underlying factors such as the pass-through effect of elevated Premium Motor Spirit prices on food prices, higher input costs, and conflicts in the Northern region of the country remain intact," analysts at Cordros Securities said.

Little did they know that their initial venture, a microlending business targeting the underserved population, would evolve into the VFD Group—a conglomerate with diverse interests spanning finance, real estate, hospitality, energy, and more.

Entrepreneurship as a gamble

Reflecting on missed opportunities, one of the friends who did not invest observed that starting a business and becoming an entrepreneur can be likened to a gamble. A Chief District Court of the Federal Capital Territory at Wuse Zone 2, Abuja, has restrained on-air-personality, Kayode Oladotun, popularly known as Do2dtun, from posting defamatory posts against singer Oladapo



Oyebanjo, aka D'banj, on social media or any other platform.

The Judge, His Honour, Emmanuel Iyanna, gave the injunction on Wednesday, October 18, 2023, in the case with Motion No: MN/218/2023.

D'banj, through one of his lawyers, Toheeb Lawal from Abuja-based law firm, Law Corridor, had filed an application at the court for an injunction restraining Do2dtun from making malicious and defamatory posts against him on social media.

In granting the application, which has D'banj as the complainant and Do2dtun as the respondent, Iyanna granted "an order restraining the defendant (Do2dtun) either by himself, servants, privies, cohorts, representatives, or any person deriving authority from him from further making any malicious, intimidating or defamatory post directing at the complainant (D'banj) on any social media platform (X, Instagram, etc) or news media pending the hearing and determination of the substantive case".

Also, the court ordered the Deputy Inspector of Police, Force Intelligence Bureau, to investigate a criminal complaint brought by D'banj against Do2dtun within two weeks and report back to court.

Do2dtun had for weeks embarked upon a social media onslaught against D'banj. The OAP was married to D'banj's sister, Taiwo, in 2013, and the union produced two girls.

However, in November, 2021, Taiwo instituted a divorce proceeding before Justice A.I Akobi of Court 23, High Court of the Federal Capital Territory, in Suit Number: GWD/PET/25/2021, over alleged "unending reckless emotional abuse, forced abortion and vicious domestic violence," by Do2dtun, which she claimed has adversely affected her health and general well-being.

Of late, Do2dtun made allegations that he was not allowed to see his daughter, but Taiwo said the claim by her ex-husband was false.

She said contrary to the allegations by her ex-husband over the custody of their children, the entertainer has access to their kids.

Taiwo recounted her ordeal in the marriage, such as domestic violence and emotional abuse, narrating how Do2dtun drove her to a hospital to have a forced abortion of a five-month pregnancy.

Nigerians expecting much from an ineffective legislature

A legislature that is alive to its roles and responsibilities is a symbol of hope, a shield and a voice for the people. It is marked by robust debates, strict commitment to checks and balances, and deliberate accountability to the people. Also, it confers legitimacy on the government because governance is productive and the citizens are fulfilled. EGBO Writes.

HOWEVER, in developing nations, the legislature is defined by weak institutional capacity. It faces the challenges of executive dominance, public trust deficit, poor democratic culture manifesting as a weak electoral system and disrespect to democratic tenets and then disruptions through elections, leading to a high turnover of legislators.

And, central to all these issues are a weak constitution, a low level of morality in politics as well as poor knowledge of the duties of the parliament.

To begin with, Nigeria's situation validates the assertion that any constitution midwife by the military is as faulty as it is anti-democracy. It does not offer the legislature the necessary support for true independence and effective supervision of the executive.

For example, mere legislative refusal of consent cannot stop the executive from borrowing and or engaging in non-budgeted expenditures. Equally, the much-touted powers to override the Presidency on critical issues exist merely on paper in the same manner that executive appointees can hold offices without legislative confirmation. And again, legislative summons and resolutions are brazenly ignored because the legislature does not possess the instruments to effectively enforce compliance.

So, evidently, the executive is already empowered by the constitution to dominate the legislature. And as noted earlier, institutional capacity is the missing link between an effective parliament and the rest. It is a product of a trained and motivated workforce supported by a favourable operating environment, which in turn is a function of adequate funding.

But in Nigeria, the legislature is incapacitated and depends on the executive for operational existence. Beyond executive dominance and disrespect, lack of financial autonomy chiefly erodes overall legislative effectiveness. Among others, capacity building is stunted, the work environment is uncondusive, representation suffers and legislative committees majorly rely on MDAs for logistics in the discharge of oversight functions. Meanwhile, for over two years now, the National Assembly chambers are closed down for repairs, restricting the lawmakers to a temporary arrangement for plenary.

Similarly, most bills passed by the legislature, especially the ones it originates, are not accented to and the resolutions arising from motions are utterly disregarded. Even the legislative agenda, despite how fantastic, would always remain a dream except the executive offers the needed impetus. Yes, the executive determines the dimension of budget



implementation, which explains the perceived lop-sidedness in infrastructural development across the country.

Additionally, there are interferences in the affairs of the legislature by the political party. Either by way of promises of reward or threats of sanction, the legislators are readily blackmailed to influence their actions and conduct.

Buoyed by the weak electoral system, the State Governors decide the political fates of the legislators using the party structures and deployment of mob rule. Any lawmaker whom the Governor does not endorse is as good as gone because the party will not nominate them as candidates for future elections. Re-election tickets, developmental project locations as well as appointment of relatives and loyalists into positions are employed as bait to keep the legislators in line. Also, despite the popularity of laws made by the National Assembly regarding the matters on the concurrent list, the Governors railroad the State Assemblies into undermining the federal legislature, for political expediency.

Hence, when a legislator is confronted with the grim prospects of political extinction, they helplessly 'play along' to survive. And inferentially, the executive influences the choices of legislative leadership through this strategy. Now with these, why would ineffective parliaments not thrive?

Then again, the withholding of public support and cooperation, which also undermines the effectiveness of the legislature, is traced to two major factors. While one is the personality of some lawmakers, the other is misplaced public expectations sequel to limited understanding of the preserves of the parliament.

Whereas legislators are expected to be morally upright

and beyond reproach, the actions and conducts of some account for the huge public trust deficit plaguing the legislature. There are those lacking in character, the ones reputed for underperformance and the others who embody politics with bitterness or bad-loser syndrome. This last category adopts desperation in their quest for power and would always seek to undermine every electoral outcome that does not suit their expectations, despite established credibility. In political contests, they 'must' either have their way or rock the boat.

Yet, unfortunately, the legislature is corporately subjected to collective labelling and the individual liberties of the entire legislators are serially violated, thus deepening the institutional ineffectiveness.

Furthermore, and exploiting the limited public knowledge of the workings of the legislature, the vulnerable are manipulated against the legislators. Driven by a self-seeking agenda, including a narrow political mentality, the elites orchestrate subjective narratives aimed at lowering the public esteem of the parliament. The impression roundly created is that the legislature does little or nothing to justify its expenditure. Also, smear campaigns are sponsored against the legislative leadership of which the executive arm is principally complicit. Because they control the media, they determine what the people know. The media is made to focus mainly on the downsides to generate negative perceptions of the legislature. Again, the parliamentarians are visited with varied demands that are motivated by the sense of entitlement wherein the constituents assume that their personal needs must be met by the representatives irrespective of the magnitude. And instructively, this is sustained because the less informed masses rate the legislators based on projects or contracts attracted

and the amount of money doled out among other direct socio-economic benefits.

Equally, there are assessments informed by the quantity of legislation rather than the quality, but factually, the advent of the internet has had a diminishing effect on legislative outputs. It has drastically affected policy formulation processes such that the core legislative duties are now shaped by external dynamics. Global trends, rather than the legislature, now determine governance policies. What happens in one country affects other countries. Borrowing and international trade agreements today dictate the pace of development. Consequently, there is a prevailing dearth of home-grown socio-economic legislation, especially for a country like Nigeria that 'must' borrow to fund its budget. And by this again, the legislature is unarguably anything but effective.

Therefore, in building our expectations, convinced that an effective parliament is fundamental to the legitimacy of government, we have to recognise the peculiar challenges confronting the fledgling legislatures. In our craving for a democratic institution that truly represents the interests of all citizens, there should be a corresponding clamour for a viable constitution drafted through an all-inclusive process. Again, there should be a reawakened consciousness for a long-term commitment to building a culture of democracy and political tolerance. We should acknowledge that past mistakes occasioned by bad leadership account for our present socio-economic and political predicaments. The problem of Nigeria is certainly not the legislature alone. Particularly, we should realise that a fair assessment of the overall performance of the legislature is achieved only when one considers the rate at which the

executive respects legislative resolution and summons. A legislature that is roundly disparaged cannot be effective or deliver optimally.

Then importantly, if we cannot resist the temptation to compare, we should be objective by always acknowledging that the human and financial resources available to the executive far exceed those of the legislature. We should also admit that for each arm of government, there are statutory allowances, including vehicles, yet there is always an orchestrated public outcry trailing that of the legislature. We should be persuaded that de-marketing the legislature hurts the country and again that sensational reportage is a threat to democracy the world over. Rather, we should cultivate good relationships with our representatives to truly guide them towards serving the national interest.

And now specifically, the legislators should be seen to be above board by truly representing the people and also shunning every unethical conduct notably traits of politics with bitterness. They should not take the people's mandate for granted. They should purge themselves of mutual suspicions and divisive tendencies. Every lawmaker should think of Nigeria first. Above all, they should realise that one does not need to hold a leadership position or be on a particular committee before one can make an impact in governance. It is not about ego or special recognition but about sacrifice and contributions to national development.

Thankfully and verifiably, the President of the Senate, Godswill Akpabio, by his blueprint and actions so far, has made firm statements of covenant about his passion for a regenerated Nigeria that works for all. A diligent review shows his clear understanding of Nigeria's immediate challenge. By his agenda, the arms of government should collaborate in the overall interest of the citizenry. Beyond his age-long sense of humour and friendly disposition, Akpabio demonstrates that it takes a united and bipartisan legislature to heal the country and oversight the executive without feeling that the government is being undermined.

Hence, with open minds, may we accept his extended hands of fellowship by giving him the right opportunities to walk the talk. May we champion strong institutional capacity in favour of the parliament and through our representatives, consciously shield it against any form of derailment. Otherwise, it is the height of hypocrisy to expect much from this 10th National Assembly.

Good governance without protection of citizens' rights, deceptive

A High Court in Lokoja recently discharged and acquitted two suspected kidnappers over contradictory evidence provided by the prosecution counsel.

The trial Judge, Justice I.A. Jamil, while delivering judgment on the suit of alleged kidnapping labelled against Harrison Orubabe and Justice Yakubu, blamed the prosecution counsels for creating doubt in the mind of the court hence the discharge and acquittal of the suspects.

Our correspondent reports that the prosecution counsels led by P.B. Daudu had arraigned Orubabe and Yakubu on Jan 19 before Justice Jamil on three count charges of conspiracy, kidnapping and robbery contrary to sections 97(1), 48(a)(b) and 298(a) of Kogi Penal Code Law 2019 respectively.

Daudu had presented confessional statements made by the accused through the Police IPO (PW2), who told the court that investigation revealed that the suspects kidnapped their victim, Prosper Obanla, on February 28, 2022 at Obajana in Kogi and took him to Warri in Delta State.

He claimed that the suspects also asked for a ransom of one million Naira

from the victim's father, Chief Olusegun Obanla (PW1), who must pay or have his son killed.

But through the objection and cross examinations of the prosecution witnesses including the victim ((PW3) by the Defense Counsels, Barrister Martin Otojoko and Philip Idiok, the victim claimed he had never been to Warri as claimed by the police IPO (PW2)

Otojoko had also pointed out to the court another contradiction, where the confessional statements of the two accused clearly showed that the alleged victim sought the assistance of the accused to stage his kidnap into getting some money from his rich father to buy a good phone.

The police claimed that in their confessional statements, Yakubu claimed that he and the victim went to Itope Train Station in Kogi, where he (Victim) boarded a train to Warri, Delta.

He said that the victim gave him N1,000 to return to Obajana.

The planned kidnap, he said, indeed paid off as they got N200,000 ransom paid by the supposed kidnap victims (Prosper's) father, Chief Olusegun Obanla.

Justice Jamil held that there was a conflict or contradiction of evidence in relation to the consent or otherwise of the victim (PW3) in relation to the kidnap.

"The absence and consent of the victim is a material ingredient in proving an offense of kidnap, when properly defined.

"This court is in serious doubt as to whether PW3

(victim) was taken away into confinement by the accused persons without his consent or with his consent.

"Where a court is in doubt of a material fact necessary to establish a commission of a crime by the defendant, the court can't convict or same.

"Similarly, where PW: (victim) refused to agree to have gone to Warri just as the IPO PW2) in his witness statement said Investigations revealed that the two defendants took him to Warri, it's difficult for this court to accept one version of the evidence.

"Again, the victim himself said that it wasn't a kidnapping case as it was staged in order for him to get some money from his father. This set of evidence came from the prosecution.

"You, the prosecution, have put this court in doubt of what you are claiming, such that I can't accept one version and refuse the other.

"The implementation is that the prosecution has succeeded in creating doubt in the minds of the court therefore found that there's contradiction in their evidence and have caused the court to determine the case in favour of the accused

"This is so because the prosecution could not prove what actually happened or Feb. 28, 2022 beyond reasonable doubt.

"On the whole, the prosecution has failed to prove beyond reasonable doubt any or all of the count charges labeled against the two suspects.

"Consequently, the two defendants are hereby discharged and acquitted," the judge declared.

Kaduna, Adamawa, and Borno lead Police recruitment

AS the ongoing recruitment exercise for General Duty Constables into the Nigeria Police Force progresses, Kaduna State has emerged as the frontrunner in terms of the number of applications received.

Within the first nine days, a total of 20,259 youths from Kaduna State have successfully completed their online applications, placing the state at the top of the list. On the other hand, Anambra State currently has the lowest number of applications, with only 541 received so far.

Following closely behind Kaduna State are Adamawa State with 18,933 applications, Borno State with 18,305, Bauchi State with 16,554, Katsina State with 16,232, and Kano State with 15,888.

Conversely, after Anambra State, the states with the fewest applications are Ebonyi with 737, Abia with 966, and Imo with 999. Bayelsa has 1,020 applications, Enugu has 1,036, Lagos has 1,259,

Delta has 1,338, and Edo has 1,526.

Out of the total applicants, 242,391 are male, while only 35,405 are female.

Dr. Solomon Arase, the

Chairman of the Commission and retired Inspector General of Police, expressed concern over the lack of interest among South East youths in pursuing a career in the Nigeria Police Force. He emphasized that the South East, currently facing challenges with non-state

actors' rebellion, should actively participate in the recruitment process to contribute indigenous solutions to these issues.

Dr. Arase called on the leadership of the zone to encourage and convince its youths to seize the opportunity provided by the ongoing recruitment.

years from the court of first instance to the Supreme Court. The Senate can work out modalities as well."

However, analyzing and evaluating Nigeria's anti-corruption campaign indicates that it is still, work in progress considering the endemic nature of the problems which had eaten deep into every fabric of its society with severe and negative consequences.

The Nigerian political class, its law enforcement agencies and the civil service are common ground for corrupt players where recent reports have shown the level of moral decay in all the nation's Institutions. It is now at an alarming stage as alluded in the 2 previous reports published by Transparency International's Anti-Corruption Index where Nigeria has continued to maintain a top spot as one of the most corrupt nations on the planet.

Lack of political will to tackle the problem by successive administrations coupled with selective prosecution of both perceived and known critics of government have often been hunted or used by the EFCC to hunt down their enemies.

As one of the nation's institutions, the EFCC as the signature of the Federal Government's crusade on corruption had found itself in the recent past in a messy situation

with those at its helm of affairs also bitten by this bug of corruption. At a certain period, they were allegedly accused of re-looting loots seized from some corrupt Nigerians which had to a large extent eroded public confidence on the anti-graft agency and the government's war on corruption in its entirety.

However, with the appointment of a new Chairman of the agency, SUNDAY STANDARD gathered based on Senate's confirmation hearing of Ola Olukoyede plans for the organization, suggests that a new paradigm shift in fighting corruption could yield fruitful results this time around.

And to achieve these set goals, Olukoyede has emphasized the need for a change in policy direction and ability to enhance efficiency with reasonable cost within a time frame. This means that Nigeria's anti-corruption campaign now is aiming to a large extent at making headway with the support of the nation's leadership and that of the citizens to implement those plans.

Regrettably, research focusing on anti-corruption in Africa has revealed persistent challenges often referred to as, "The seven sins." These includes economic limitations, political reluctance, legal inefficiency, organizational weakness, government gaps,

performance issues and public skepticism.

Therefore, public commentators have agreed with the notion that, the effectiveness or success of an anti-corruption agency like the EFCC, requires substantial long term resources, a skilled and motivated workforce, robust legal and administrative authority, solid backing, possibly even from the President, adequate accountability and transparency, a supportive institutional environment especially within related sectors such as the Police and Judiciary including access to financial records.

The anti-graft war had over the last 15 years lost its steam either due to insufficient administrative capacity including limited powers as well as lack of human and material resources coupled with an inefficient legal system.

In Nigeria, there is a pressing demand to establish

internationally recognized legislation to tackle possession of unexplained wealth and assets. Yet, lack of widespread support and commitment from major political figures have always been a frustration for the agency.

Similarly, the larger society is complicit in the failure of the agency to make significant gains due to factors arising from the "Get-rich syndrome" among some communities which promotes the culture of affluence with so much premium placed on the wealthy irrespective of whether it is ill gotten or not, is pushing corruption to a precipice. While lack of love for the country and lack of moral latitude among many people across the country has further confined laudable effort of the agency to a mere lip service.

Although these narratives can be changed, expert opinions also prescribed the need for a holistic approach of tackling issues

relating to corruption by implementing a comprehensive ant-corruption education programme from the primary education to the tertiary levels that would nurture both present and future generations with ethical values by also providing our society with a strong moral compass. And to succeed in this direction, there is need for Nigerians to overcome cultural acceptance of corrupt practices which also requires a gradual shift through awareness campaign, by highlighting societal benefits of integrity and ethical behaviour.

The new strategy of corruption prevention will in the coming weeks or months provide Nigerians with a clue as to whether the road map being ascribed by Ola Olukoyede, the new Czar of the anti-corruption war would raise the bar of hope for millions of the citizens watching with high expectations.

Curbing indiscriminate parking of trucks in Jos metropolis

THE increasing numbers of erected warehouses by some business people within residential areas in some suburbs of Jos and Bukuru metropolis have become too rampant. It does not consider the problems that it causes residents, when it comes to the issue of movements of heavy duty trucks that convey goods to such locations for off-loading.

What seems to be difficult for those residents where warehouses have been erected is no other thing but the way such long-vehicles maneuver their way into the residential areas, especially when they are searching for a place to park so as to enable them off-load whatever types of goods they have with ease.

It is true that accidents sometimes occur when some of these long-vehicles are trying to find a place to park before off-loading the goods.

Other negative sides of this menace of trucks when coming into the residential areas with goods to off-load, is the issue that affects residents, who are either coming in or going out of the area. It causes serious inconvenience to the people. In fact, the worse things in this regard is the fact that the long-vehicles sometimes close-up the main road that leads into the residential areas for hours before it is opened for the residents.

What has equally been observed with the rampant case of erections of warehouses in the residential areas is that even those with small cars that come to the warehouses to buy whatever type of goods are not left out when it comes to the issue of creating unnecessary



congestion for the residents who ordinarily are not supposed to have been part of such unbearable experience.

However, other issue that are very disturbing and cannot be forgotten is that some of the roads that connect with the warehouses within the residential areas have either become an eye-sore or are dead-traps. These types of bad roads have become dilapidated as a result of the movements of heavy duty

trucks that convey goods to such locations.

It therefore, behooves on government to as a matter of urgent public importance, come up with laws that would put a stop to erection of warehouses within residential areas in order to avoid any form of challenges that may cause problems to residents.

Speaking with METRO FOCUS in Jos, some residents who barred their minds on the issue of erecting warehouses

in the residential areas described such buildings as illegal structures, looking at the inconveniences that they cause to the residents when it comes to the movements of the heavy duty trucks. They stressed the need for the Plateau State House of Assembly to enact laws that would stop people from erecting warehouses in residential areas.

They expressed concern about indiscriminate parking of long-vehicles, both on the main roads side and also within the residential places, viewing it as very unpleasant as far as the issue of blocking roads into residential areas is concerned.

The residents were also of the opinions that government on its part, should find a place in the outskirts of the town, and build it for big trucks saying that doing so would go a long way in addressing or reducing the rate of accidents caused by the long-vehicles within the town.

They also called on the Plateau State government to

as a matter of ensuring safety of lives of the people living in the heart of Jos and Bukuru metropolis make a law that would ban the movements of all long-vehicles that convey goods during the day.

The residents advised government not to allow petroleum marketers to build fuel stations close to residential areas because of the danger it may pose on the residents once there is any incident of fire outbreak.

They maintained that some fuel stations have gutted fire in the course of off-loading fuel, saying that such unfortunate incidents have resulted to loss of lives and properties in some parts of the country.

They also called on Plateau State government to enact a law that would ban tankers from moving with the said products during day time into Jos and Bukuru metropolis, saying that doing so would help in saving the lives of citizens.

Imbibing effective maintenance culture

Both the public and private sectors of the economy in any country have machinery and infrastructural facilities that require effective maintenance to enable them to function properly. Some maintenance actions have to be executed periodically to prevent failures, malfunction and damage. When equipment and machinery are not maintained, there is frequent breakdown and the cost of maintenance or replacement as the case may be is high due to neglect.

NOTHING, tangible or intangible, is to serve humanity for infinite life. The railway system, dams, buildings, bridges and road networks we have built today will serve us as long as we keep maintaining them. We want to have functional refineries. Then, we must be able, willing and ready to maintain them. We want good roads. We must maintain existing roads.

Policy decision makers at all levels of government should always ask: What is the cost of maintaining an infrastructure before it fails and the cost of maintaining the same after it has failed?

Our inability to maintain critical infrastructure across the length and breadth of the country is reflected in the words of a prominent politician:

"I cannot believe what I saw here. This is simply unacceptable. I was here when this complex served as a Governor's Lodge. when you leave a specialised structure for 19 years without maintenance?"

"It is a 51-year-old structure for crying out loud. 19 years of neglect. That is what we are trying to correct, but people think other sectors and buildings need money but sports facilities do not need money. Every building suffers wear and tear and so also a stadium," he said.

Third Mainland Bridge now a death trap, motorists lament, Punch, October 17, 2023

Motorists have again raised concerns over what they described as the deplorable state of the Third Mainland Bridge. They have called on the government to immediately fix the bridge which is the longest among the three bridges that connect Lagos Island with Mainland.

The about 11.8km bridge starts from the Oworonshoki end of the Mainland and ends at the Adeniji Adele Interchange on Lagos Island.

Before experts were talking about Preventive maintenance but let's start considering Predictive maintenance in order to have economic benefits and ultimately to avert total breakdown of infrastructural facilities.

But you need data to enable you to switch from preventive to predictive maintenance. I am talking about operational and maintenance-related data. When was the infrastructure built, for how long has it been used and when will it be due for the first, second and third maintenance activities, and so on? When is the infrastructure

to undergo life-extended maintenance or replacement? For how long are we expected to use the facility before replacing it? We should not think that once an infrastructure is installed, it will serve us for eternity. We should ask our friends from nations where critical infrastructure doesn't break down before maintenance.

We need regular maintenance of infrastructure with data to back it up. There must be data. You need this data for analysing the overall performance and identifying areas for improvement as well as ensuring compliance with regulatory requirements and optimizing operational and maintenance costs.

When it comes to the overall assessment, it is crucial to show appreciation and respect towards a few individuals burdened with the crucial task of keeping our vital infrastructure. Without their diligent efforts, the maintenance of roads, bridges, and other national assets would have undoubtedly turned into a nightmarish ordeal. While we may sometimes overlook the significance of our policymakers and politicians, life continues to move forward. However, if we disregard the maintenance of our infrastructure, the entire system is bound to crumble and collapse. Thank you.

One win, 17,000 defeats - life as Washington General

ON 5 January 1971, Louis Herman Klotz did something that no basketballer has dared repeat. In front of a disbelieving audience in the city of Martin, Tennessee, the man known as Red broke one of the most sacred unwritten rules in sport. As player-coach for the Washington Generals, Klotz shot the winning basket against the Harlem Globetrotters. Everybody knows the Generals aren't supposed to beat the Globetrotters. "They looked at us like we'd just killed Santa," Klotz would claim, as jeers rang around the university gymnasium. Over more than 50 years since, the Globetrotters have been ruthless in meting out their revenge. To the unmistakable melody of Sweet Georgia Brown, they've showboated their way to victory at the expense of hapless Generals who've never again beaten their illustrious

opponents. In contrast to the universal adulation enjoyed by the Globetrotters, those wearing the Generals' infamously unsuccessful green jerseys are booed, ridiculed, and dunked on during defeat, after defeat, after defeat. They are the rarest of sporting commodities: the underdogs you're not supposed to root for. So why would anyone want to play for the Washington Generals? "I had the time of my life playing with this team," recalls Antoine Maddox, a Generals shooting guard between 2007 and 2010. "You're travelling with one of the most famous teams in the world. That's pretty awesome." Maddox's first memory of the Washington Generals was on a career placement day at his high school in LaGrange, Georgia. Having told his teachers he wanted to be a basketballer, Maddox was

given the opportunity to shadow 'Sweet' Lou Dunbar, the legendary Harlem Globetrotter. Before long, chasing Globetrotters shadows would be the eager schoolboy's day job. "I went to a game and I remember looking at the Washington Generals and thinking: 'Man, I wonder how those guys got that job,'" Maddox says. He'd find out soon enough when he was recruited at a post-college combine. The next NBA stars are often discovered at these open trials, though many players attend with more modest hopes of a professional career overseas. Those left behind are prime targets for Generals scouts. "I still had some aspirations of going to play pro somewhere," says Maddox, who now works for a Californian tech company. "I figured at least I would be travelling and maybe there'd be some opportunity to get seen in front of some other teams."

Chelsea FC stung by Bees as Stamford Bridge woes continue

CHELSEA FC were stung 0-2 by Brentford FC Bee's to extend their Stamford Bridge woes in the English Premier League. SportsRation reports. Second half goals from Ethan Pinnock and Bryan Mbuemo ensured the visiting Bee's took maximum points at Stamford Bridge for a second straight fixture. This means, Chelsea FC have won only one of their last 13 English Premier League games at Stamford Bridge. Criminal case against Fifa president dropped

PROSECUTORS have closed a criminal case against Gianni Infantino - a decision the Fifa president called a "victory" for him and the organisation.

BBC SPORT said that, proceedings were opened against Infantino in July 2020 over an alleged secret meeting with Swiss attorney general Michael Lauber.

Swiss prosecutors confirmed on Thursday their investigations "invalidated" suspicions against Infantino.

Infantino said the allegations were made to "attack his reputation".

"This is a full and clear victory for me, for the new Fifa and for justice," Infantino added in a Fifa statement.

"It is now clear that the accusations against me were mere attempts by poor, envious and corrupt people to attack my reputation. If these people have some dignity left, they should at least have the decency and apologise for their actions and the damage caused.

"Indeed and with no surprise, the investigation fully and clearly confirms that I have always acted in a lawful and correct way, always defending exclusively the interests of Fifa and football."

Proceedings against Infantino were opened on suspicions of secrecy violations, abuse of office and aiding and abetting related to meetings he held with Lauber.

Prosecutors said their investigations had found no evidence that Infantino had "instrumentalised" the Office of the Attorney General of Switzerland "into unusual, inexplicable, erroneous or even criminal acts or omissions".

Fifa said: "Now it is official: Fifa President Gianni Infantino has always acted absolutely correctly and lawfully in his relations with the Swiss public prosecutors who were investigating the 'old Fifa'."

"The new Fifa is today a clean, well run and robust organisation which operates in accordance with the highest ethical and governance standards."

Prosecutor Stefan Keller, who was appointed in June 2020 to review criminal complaints against Infantino and Lauber, was removed from the case in May 2021 following a successful

complaint from Fifa, which said he demonstrated "extreme bias".

Federal prosecutors Hans Maurer and Ulrich Weder took the case on and Fifa said on Thursday it took note of their decision to "dismiss and definitively" close proceedings against Infantino.

"The outcome of this investigation is obviously entirely unsurprising. The only surprising element is only the long time taken to reach such an obvious conclusion," Fifa's statement

Murray loses in Basel, as Norrie beaten by Zverev

ANDY Murray was unable to reach his first ATP Tour quarter-final since February after Argentina's Tomas Martin Etcheverry fought back to win a gruelling contest in Basel.

Murray, 36, recovered from a slow start to win the first set in 76 minutes.

But the Briton ended up losing 6-7 (5-7) 6-3 6-2 to the world number 32, who secured victory in over three hours.

Meanwhile, Cameron Norrie lost 6-2 6-4 against fifth seed Alexander Zverev in his second-round match in Vienna.

Former world number one Murray has made a habit this season of being involved in some marathon matches - and the scrap against Etcheverry was another example.

Having stopped Etcheverry going 3-0 ahead, the Scot showed all of his trademark tenacity and endurance to keep his opponent locked in long rallies during a tight opening set which could have swung either way.

Murray trailed in the tie-break before creating a set point with a superb crosscourt forehand winner and converting his chance with a deft volley.

After falling a break down early in the second set, Murray was unable to take three break points as Etcheverry held on in a 16-minute seventh game - which proved key in taking the match to a decider.

"I love playing here, I've always loved playing here. I wish I could have played better but Belinda played so well today. It's been an interesting 24 hours.

"As I said in the article, I'm terrible at goodbyes. But,

goodbye Toronto." Williams said she was moving towards "other things that are important to me", adding she did not like the word "retirement".

she wrote that "the countdown has begun".

Following the match, a tearful Williams was presented with jerseys of basketball team the Toronto Raptors and ice hockey team the Toronto Maple Leafs for her and daughter Olympia.

"I was really happy to be out here today and play in front of you guys," she said. "Thanks for the support. Thank you."

Williams won her first Grand Slam title at the 1999 US Open, aged 17. Her last Grand Slam title was at the 2017 Australian Open when she was eight weeks pregnant with Olympia. She has confirmed she will

play at the Western and Southern Open in Cincinnati, Ohio next week as well as at the US Open later this month.

World number one Iga Swiatek will join Switzerland's Bencic in the third round after comfortably beating Ajla Tomljanovic 6-1 6-2.

BRTAIN'S Jack Draper and Dan Evans are through to the Canadian Open quarter-finals but Cameron Norrie was knocked out.

BBC SPORT said that, Draper, 20, led Gael Monfils 6-0 0-2 in their last-16 match when the Frenchman had to withdraw with a suspected ankle injury in Montreal.

Swiatek, who had a run of 37 straight wins halted in the third round at Wimbledon last month, said: "Next time maybe I'm going to be able to find, even though the conditions are going to be bad, more solutions and just play more solid. Because I did a lot of mistakes that I kind of don't accept."

American 10th seed Coco Gauff is also into the last eight after beating Belarusian world number six Aryna Sabalenka 7-5 4-6 7-6 (7-4).

Gauff will now play former world number one Simona Halep, who defeated Switzerland's Jil Teichmann 6-2 7-5.

FedEx Cup Play-offs: McIlroy eight behind leader

RORY McIlroy carded a level-par opening round of 70 at the FedEx St Jude Championship to sit eight behind leaders Kim Si-Woo and JJ Spaun.

BBC SPORT said that, McIlroy had an inconsistent day with four bogeys, including two in the first six holes, and four birdies.

England's Tyrrell Hatton is three shots back following a bogey-free opening round of five under in Memphis.

South Korea's Kim landed an eagle on the final hole to go into the lead alongside bogey-free American Spaun.

Northern Ireland's McIlroy, who had earlier welcomed the decision to ban three

players from the Saudi-backed LIV Golf Series from competing in the play-offs following a court bid, struggled from the off and bogeyed the first.

A second bogey followed on the sixth and, despite a birdie on the following hole, the 33-year-old dropped another shot on the 11th.

Three birdies and another bogey in the final six holes completed the world number three's up and down opening round.

It is McIlroy's first tournament since he finished third at The Open, having led going into the final round - his fourth top-10 major finish this year.

World number one Scottie Scheffler struggled to a 71, while Australia's Cameron Smith, who won The Open last month, is at three under.

American Tony Finau, who won twice on the PGA Tour last month, is with a group of players on six under.

Scotland's Martin Laird is on four under, with compatriot Russell Knox at level par.

PGA Championship winner Justin Thomas sits at three under alongside Spain's Jon Rahm, with England's US Open champion Matt Fitzpatrick and Ireland's Shane Lowry a shot back.

This week's event at TPC Southwind is the first of three tournaments to decide the Tour champion, with the winner picking up \$18m (£14.8m).

Fraser-Pryce runs fourth-fastest women's 100m ever

SHELLY-ANN Fraser-Pryce ran the fourth-fastest ever women's 100m, 10.62 seconds, to win at the Diamond League in Monaco.

BBC SPORT said that, the five-time world 100m champion, 35, bettered her

own mark for the fastest 100m of the year, having clocked 10.66 seconds in Poland on Saturday.

She has now run the third and fourth-fastest women's 100m times ever.

Fellow world champion Jake Wightman of Britain won the 1,000m with the fastest time this year.

Fraser-Pryce's fellow Jamaican Shericka Jackson came second in Monaco with

a personal best of 10.71 seconds, while Marie-Josée Ta Lou of Ivory Coast set an African record in third and Britain's Daryll Neita finished sixth.

"I did what I needed to and we had fun and let the clock do the talking. To be able to run 10.60 consistently means a lot. It's remarkable. It's hard to keep up the speed at this high level," said Fraser-Pryce.

"I'm in my late thirties and I feel I have more to give. I look forward to doing my personal best [10.60 run in August 2021] during the rest of the season."

It was a third sub-10.70 run within a week for Fraser-Pryce, who missed the Commonwealth Games, as all seven starters went below 11 seconds.

She becomes the first woman in history to break 10.70 six times in the same season, having also won a record fifth women's 100m world title [last month in Oregon](#).

Wightman bounced back from disappointment at the Commonwealth Games, where he was unable to back up his 1500m world title in Oregon.

The 28-year-old took 1500m bronze in Birmingham on Saturday but posted a time of two minutes 13.88 seconds in Monaco, the ninth fastest 1,000m of all time, ahead of

Nigeria-eligible goalkeeper, Jonathan Rasheed, has declared his readiness to solve Nigeria's goalkeeping crisis that have been rocking the Super Eagles, BSNSports.com.ng reports.

IFK Varnamos's goaltender was born to a Nigerian father and Norwegian mother, Rasheed is eligible to play for the national teams of Sweden, Norway and Nigeria, but he has yet to win a senior cap for any of the aforementioned countries.

"It started a week ago. I was tagged in several posts on Twitter (now X) and Instagram, and yes. It was friends who wrote that it had started to be talked about and so on," Rasheed said to Fotbollskanalen.

"I don't know what it is or where it comes from, but there have been people who have written to me about it. It is fun. It probably means that you have done something good.

"I personally have had no contact with anyone. But I hope it might come."

"It would have been awesome. My father is from there and I have always been aware of Nigeria, Norway and Sweden.

"I would have been proud if given the chance. It's basically the biggest thing you can do as a player", he stated.

However, barely three months after the conclusion of the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup in Australia and New Zealand, the World Soccer ruling body has confirmed release of player's monetary incentive to the federations of the participating

countries, BSNSports.com.ng reports. This report was revealed by an online journalist SHE Score Banger, who is purely a women's football reporter. The journalist revealed its discussion with FIFA and the response it received from the football body.

"When I asked FIFA about the World Cup money, this is what the spokesperson said:

"Following the conclusion of the Women's World Cup, FIFA is in contact with the participating member associations (PMAs) regarding the distribution

of payments for the tournament, including the record prize money that will be provided by FIFA"

As part of this, FIFA is providing tailored support to PMAs regarding the distribution of payments that are being made, including to the member association and subsequently to players", the statement read.

Nigeria's Super Falcons, Atlas Lioness of Morocco, Bayana Bayana of South Africa and Shepolopolo of Zambia represented Africa at the global competition.

Meanwhile, in Serie A, Chukwubuike Ikwemesi was on the losing as Salernitana lost by the slimmest of margins to Genoa.

Abiama scored one and assisted another as Greuther Fürth made it four wins in their first 11 league games.

OGC Nice provisionally returned to the top of the French Ligue 1 table after their hard-fought 0-1 away win at Clermont Foot.

Terem Moffi came off the bench for the winners in the 58th minute before Algerian midfielder Hicham Boudaoui netted the game's

sole goal in the 74th minute.

In the Czech Republic FNL, Emmanuel Anih netted a stoppage-time consolation goal for Příbram in their 2-1 defeat away to Viktoria Žižkov.

Ahmed Adebayo was the only shining light for Tammeka as he scored both of their goals in their 2-7 home loss to Tallinna Kalev in the Estonian Meistriliiga.

In the Russian First League, 20-year-old Jonathan Okoronkwo netted his tenth goal of the season to open the scoring for Arsenal Tula in their 1-1 draw at Alaniya Vladikavkaz.

Super Eagles defender Olisa Ndah's contribution could not power Orlando Pirates to a clean sheet as the Bucs played out a thrilling 1-1 home draw with Polokwane City in their PSL fixture.

In Turkey, new Super Eagles star Fisayo Dele-Bashiru did his bit, but it was not enough for Hatayspor as they stumbled to a 1-2 defeat at home to Kayserispor.

2013 Africa Cup of Nations winner Kenneth Omeruo had a better story to tell as he stood strong in defence for Kasımpaşa during their 3-1 triumph over İstanbulspor.

'Falcons need Nigerians' support to beat Ethiopia'

SENSING danger ahead of Tuesday's make or mar Paris 2014 Olympic Games qualifier against Ethiopia, President of Nigeria Football Federation (NFF), Ibrahim Gusau, has pleaded with Nigerians to come out in large number to support the Super Falcons.

The match will at the MKO Abiola Stadium, Abuja. The Super Falcons forced the Ethiopian to a 1-1 draw in Addis Ababa on Wednesday, and will now have to defeat the East Africans in the return leg on Tuesday to move a step closer to the Olympics Games.

The Falcons will hope to carry their fine form from the FIFA Women's World Cup in Australia and New Zealand to the Olympic Games by qualifying for the sports fiesta.

Gusau stated that his board is determined to build on the success of the World Cup, adding that qualifying for Paris 2024 Olympics will be another major boost for the team.

He, however, said NFF and the team cannot do it alone, and Nigerians must show their support by coming to the stadium to cheer the girls.

"These girls need the support of everybody, and one of the ways Nigerians must show they support to the team is by coming out to watch and cheer them. This kind of support cannot be quantified, and it helps the team to give their all in front of their home crowd," Gusau stated.

The Nigeria women team last qualified for the Olympic Games 15 years ago in 2008, and the Gusau-led board is keen to break the jinx this time around. A win for the Falcons in Abuja against the Ethiopians will see them take on either Cameroun or Uganda in the next stage of the qualifiers.

Meanwhile, Nigeria's prospects at the 2023 CAF Africa Cup of Nations have been highlighted by former Super Eagles captain John Obi Mikel, who anticipates a challenging journey for the

team, Soccernet.ng reports.

For the AFCON, the Super Eagles have been drawn in Group A together with hosts Ivory Coast, Equatorial Guinea, and Guinea-Bissau.

There are five AFCON titles between Nigeria and Ivory Coast, and Mikel has tipped both nations to make it past the group

stage.

The former Chelsea midfielder, however, remains wary of the other Group A teams.

Equatorial Guinea, who have only made four appearances at the AFCON but finished fourth in 2015, are capable of causing a major upset.

While Guinea-Bissau have never made it past

the group phase of the continental championship since making their debut in 2017, the Djurtus stunned Nigeria in March, defeating the Eagles 0-1 at the Abuja National Stadium.

Mikel expects the Eagles to possess enough quality to advance past the first round of the competition.
