# Naira to stabilise if announced \$10bn flows into economy

IGERIA'S currency will stabilise in the short-term if the expected \$10 billion flows through the economy, analysts said on Monday.

Naira on Monday strengthened against the dollar, gaining 1.85 percent at the Nigerian Autonomous Foreign Exchange Market (NAFEM).

Naira appreciation comes after Wale Edun, the finance minister said Monday that Nigeria is expecting as much as \$10 billion in new foreign currency inflows in the next few weeks to ease acute dollar shortages in the foreign exchange market.

# Failed start-ups and the Nigerian business environment IN recent times, there has been an increase in major news platform capturing seemingly promising start-ups who arguably started out

somewhat well or so it seems but would turn around to join the long list of failed starts up. Even more worrisome is that some of those startups would end raising considerable amount of capital to not only stay afloat but shore up through venture capital and private equity firms. Rather unfortunately and barely had such start-ups 'broken through' with the new capital infuse from investors, than such start-ups start to lose touch what makes business profitable, not only for the short run, but also to remain in the business game for years, decades and even much longer.BUKKY TAILOR and JOSEPH ONELE writes

WhHILE existing literature on this topic has attempted to explain away what could have accounted for this rather disturbing occurrence and though not unaware of the challenges posed by the unsustainable foreign exchange rates and Naira depreciation as well as the seeming hostile business environment in Nigeria, this article seeks to narrow down on an aspect of business often overlooked or neglected in the rush to float a new venture - particularly one that is largely consumer driven.

In a 2011 Harvard Business School publication by Carmen Nobel on 'Why Companies Fail - and How Their Founders Can Bounce Back'. Nobel notes that while it is not news that a good number of relatively new companies fail, experience gotten from running a company that failed could actually come in handy to help one in better advancing one's entrepreneurial journey, provided such persons "are willing to view failure as a potential for improvement." Failure, as used in this context could mean all assets of the start-ups being liquidated and investors losing most, or all the funds put into the company.

Carmen Nobel (in the 2011 Harvard Business School publication) would go on to cite Shikhar Ghosh, a senior lecturer at Harvard Business School who is credited to have made the point that "Very few companies achieve their initial projections...Failure is the norm." While the assertion that only few companies go on to actualise their initial projections and failure being common among start-ups might not be farfetched given the statistics in this regard, the present writers are largely concerned with how best to reasonably reduce the number of failed start-ups, particularly, in a society like ours.

Perhaps, a good start in fixing the problem of why a good number of start-ups fail in this clime is to examine first why Start-ups fail generally. Writing on this, Carmen Nobel notes that most "Start-ups often fail because founders and investors neglect to look before they leap, surging forward with plans without taking the time to realize that the base assumption of the business is wrong." Further highlighting the problem with most entrepreneurs and a good number of them fail, Nobel writes: "They believe they can predict the future, rather than try to create a future with their customers." The point made by the need for entrepreneurs to ensure goods and/or services they are offering customers are customer friendly or client-centric cannot be over emphasised. The ultimate test of any successful venture is not about how much of investors funds can be raked in but rather how much of customers patronage and turnover is secured from sales be it of goods or services. Better put, the success of any business enterprise would largely rely how much of customers or clients can repeat patronage and perhaps also go on to make referrals, further to excellent



customer service enjoyed.

It would appear a good number of entrepreneurs jump into the execution stage of a business idea properly tested through initial test phase While a good number of

minded with their strategies' as Harvard Business School publication, the popular saying that consumer/client/customer is king could not be more right as such the customer/client can make or mar a business. Put differently, a truly happy and satisfied customer would make a successful business as such business stands a lot to gain in referrals. On the other, a dissatisfied customer or disgruntled client is unlikely to repeat patronage of such good or service and would likely go on to make negative remarks about which expectation was below that expected. Hence, why it is critical that when opening any profitable business enterprise, the target customers must be decided on, carefully studied, and well understood.

What the present writers have sectors and industries alongside some specific industry centred investors or private equity firms deciding to float and fund the idea of a business enterprise before a seasoned and highly pragmatic business feasibility audit phased plan capturing: (a) the execution of the business idea through carefully thought and customer-centric phases; (b) understanding of the patronage culture of the target customers or clients alongside long

Less can be done to save the brand at such time as the first impression a customer gets from such experience is likely to account for whether the customer comes back or makes referral. Riding on the back of some of the

points made by Timi Olubivi in the 2022 Business Day publication, the present writers could not help but assert that the failure of start-ups and SMEs (running into millions) might have been best saved by a sustainable business or ensuring business continuity, good customer relations and a customer-centric product or service innovations that is built on a solid foundation of a properly researched market need as well as sound understanding of customers behaviour. Lending credence to the above stated position, Bernard Marr, in a 2022 Forbes publication on "The Top 10 Reasons Why Businesses Will Fail Over The Next 10 Years" notes that some of the reasons explored businesses fail include: Not prioritizing sustainability'; Not putting Customers first; Not relentlessly innovating and; Not treating data as a key business asset and realising that data is the lifeblood of successful companies as 'data helps to make better business decisions, understand customers and market trends, create smarter products and services... improve...business processes.

While Nigeria may indeed be a volatile business environment to float a successful start-up on account of the uncertainties permeating the foreign exchange market, galloping inflation as well as recent Naira depreciation, quite a lot can still be done with smart entrepreneurs and investors who are keen to thrive in Nigeria by floating start-ups that can stand the test of time and add value to stakeholders. For one, engaging the services of seasoned market research experts who understand the Nigerian business terrain well enough and able to help conduct an impartial study of the customers behaviour in the specific industry or sector will go a long way. Beyond the cutting-edge market research will be having in place a management team that understands the need to prioritize sustainability, putting customers first, pragmatically pursuing innovating and interpreting relevant data to day-to-day operations, with the understanding that satisfying customers continuously through great value offerings is the lifeline of a sustainable business in a business climate like ours.

# FG to achieve N24.54 trn revenue inflow

Revenue accruals to Federation Account is projected to rise to N24.54 trillion in 2024 from N11.86 projected in 2023.

Of this figure, revenue from the main pool is projected to be N20.70 trillion while Value Added Tax ( VAT) pool and Electronic Money Transfer Levy ( EMTL) are projected at N3.66 trillion, N174.26 billion respectively.

Director General of Budget Office of the Federation, Mr. Ben Akabueze, said this at the ongoing Nigeria Economic Summit in Abuja.

Giving insights into the on the 2024-2026 Medium Term Framework and Fiscal Strategy document, Akabueze said the draft 2024-2026 paper was prepared against the backdrop of domocratic transition to reflect current realities and new direction of the President Tinubu administration in addressing key policy and fiscal challenges.

The document showed key parameters to drive the medium-term revenue and expenditure framework for Nigeria in 2014 include: Oil benchmark:2024- \$73.96; 2025- \$73.76; 2026-\$69.90. The projected exchange rates for the Nigerian Naira (N) against the U.S. Dollar (\$) are 700 Naira to 1 Dollar in 2024, 665.61 Naira to 1 Dollar in 2025, and 669.79 Naira to 1 Dollar in 2026. These rates reflect the assumed values used for currency conversion in economic calculations.

# Business & Economy Sustaining agric-related value chains in Kogi

It is obvious that man has three basic essential needs like food, clothing and shelte; hence, government at all levels prioritise food productio. OYIBO SALIHU writes

NIGERIA'S initial greatness was hinged on agriculture when the country was renowned for mass production of cash crops such as cocoa, kolanut, palm oil and

However, the country's story changed with the discovery of crude oil in the 1950s and agriculture experienced a nosedive but even at that, subsistence farming became a major vocation for many communities in the country.

In spite of the place that oil came to occupy in Nigeria's national life, agriculture still remains the most reliable and sustainable avenue of income for many Nigerians. Food security is deemed as one of the surest ways to gauge the strength of any country.

Need to accord agriculture a priority

In recognising this fact, government at all levels have in diverse ways through wellthought-out programmes and policies, continued to accord the agricultural sector topmost priority, introducing one programme after the other to stimulate and sustain the interest of citizens in agriculture.

Till date, an estimated 70 to 75 percent of Nigerians still live in the rural areas and agriculture has remained a viable alternative to crude oil and a major source of employment, income and survival.

In terms of arable land, Nigeria is a blessed country and to sustain and effectively tap the vast agricultural potentials of the country, successive administrations at one point or the other, initiated agricultural programmes to enhance the livelihoods of the people.

IFAD intervention

Following the steps of successive administrations, few years ago, the federal government in collaboration with International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) introduced Value Chain Development Programme (VCDP) in several states of Nigeria, including Kogi

Kogi, given its vast arable land, remains Nigeria's food basket. This fact is not lost on the present administration which has made agriculture one of its areas of concentration.

It is interesting to note that the hiective of VCDP other things reduce rural poverty using the instrumentality of agriculture; increase food security and accelerate economic growth on a sustainable basis.

For more specifics, the programme is designed to improve the incomes and food security of rural households who are engaged in production, processing and marketing of rice and cassava in targeted pilot local government areas.

In implementing the programme, the respective



benefiting states are to adopt holistic and demand-driven approach to address constraints along the cassava and rice value chains; hence, the need for inclusive strategy to strengthen actors along the chain i.e producers, processors, marketers and their respective organisations.

Given the fact that upon assumption of office in 2016, agriculture was accorded a front burner position by the government of Alhaji Yahaya Bello as one of the thematic areas of the New Direction Development Blueprint, IFAD VCDP and Kogi state government entered a partnership that would change the ugly narrative in the agricultural sector in the state. It is a partnership that has paid off and it is still paying off.

There is no denying the facts that Kogi IFAD/VCDP has demonstrated unequal feat with arrays and galaxies of positive impacts on VCDP farmers and the state in general. These are intended to stem the tides of poverty in the system.

How it works

Explaining how the VCDP-IFAD works, the programme coordinator in the state, Dr Stella Adejoh said strong emphasis is placed on developing commodity-specific value chain action plans at the local government levels and this, she explained, serves as the basis for rolling out relevant and sustainable activities.

Adejoh further explained that the programme strategy is anchored on a long-term vision of value chain development for poverty reduction and accelerated economic growth and setting the fulcrum for fundamental organisation and functional capacity of key actors in the agricultural sector.

The overall aim, she enthused further is to enhance food security, increased production and productivity, as well as expand income-generating activities and

create larger employment opportunities

To achieve this objective, Kogi VCDP has consistently kept its eves on the ball and has through its activities put smiles on the faces of farmers in the state.

The programme which started in Kogi fully barely over two years ago has, with the support of His Excellency Governor Bello, made tremendous impacts on the lives of rural families with testimonies following.

The programme has become a dependable burden-bearer for farmers across the state with the farmers seeing it as a friend in times of dire need. This is understandable given the fact that between 70 and 75 percent of the total farming population in the state is made up of small-holder farmers.

Against this backdrop and the fact that poverty has remained a rural phenomenon, with at least two-third of the rural population captured in the poverty net, the programme has come at a very crucial time and making impacts in the lives of people who are in dire need of help in terms of funding and technical know-how on how to improve their yields and enhance their livelihoods.

IFAD/VCDP programme is a success story in Kogi given the testimonies of beneficiaries spread across the benefiting pilot local government areas of the

Speaking on some of the completed and ongoing projects of the IFAD/VCDP programme, Dr Adeioh identified the provision of rice processing centre with a drying slab located at Kungbani cluster also provided with solar powered borehole and a transformer for the community.

Others include the construction of a market stall/store and crèche for the marketers where passersby and travellers can easily stop over to purchase agricultural increasing production, Kogi VCDP products and items at the Gaskiya Rice Processing Centre at Kungbani Lokoja local government area.

Similarly, the programme also constructed a market store for Ejule-Ojebe community, drying slab at Ichalla Ajode, solarpowered borehole at Ayeke, market stall at Egah and a solarpowered borehole and drying slab for rice farmers at Aluko-Ina in Ibaji local government area of the

Like other benefiting pilot LGAs, market stall and solar powered boreholes were also constructed for farmers in Oke-Dayo and Bolorunduro communities as well as a cassava processing centre with a solar-powered borehole and a creche for Agalupa community in Kabba/Bunu local government area. Also in Okebuku, a creche and solarpowered borehole as well as a processing centre were constructed for the community.

Continuing in its drive to lift rural residents out of poverty by helping them create sustainable livelihoods, Kogi VCDP built a rice processing centre, aggregation centre, solar powered borehole, with a drying slab and 30KVA others. transformer at ASCO Camp while a creche was built for Geregu community in Ajaokuta local government.

The Dr Adejoh-led VCDP through the poverty alleviation strategies of the present administration in the state, installed solar powered borehole for garri processors at Igah-Ikeie and Oququ communities as well as a market stall, solar powered borehole and a processing centre at Imane in Olamaboro local government area of the state.

# **Ganduje wants constitutional** roles for Deputy Governors

Dr Abdullahi Ganduje, the National Chairman of the All Progressives Congress (APC), has called for specific constitutional roles for deputy governors in Nigeria to keep them busy.

Ganduje said this at an annual conference of the Forum of Former Deputy Governors of Nigeria (FFDGN) with the Partnering in the theme: shared vision for good governance and sustainable development" in Abuja.

Ganduje, represented by Mr Emma Eneukwu, the APC Deputy National Chairman, South, said that assigning constitutional roles would prevent unnecessary clash between governors and their deputies.

He said that nothing was wrong with the Nigeria Constitution, but the inability to observe it.

There are some of us who feel that the constitution is an invalid document, it is illegitimate, it is a product of the military. Even if it is a broken down vehicle it is the vehicle.

"It is a good constitution; there is nothing wrong with it. However good a constitution is, it is not a self-executing document, it doesn't enforce itself. It requires good people to enforce it.

"Of course it is not intended to be a perfect document, but this nation must begin to respect the

"We must begin to respect the nation's history and not go on describing it as an artificial creation. As we hear so many people doing. There is no nation that is not artificial. All nations are artificial," he said.

Agabi, who was the chairman of the occasion, appealed to people in power to come to terms with those who agreed with them.

He appealed to the Federal Government to make the nation self-reliance, tackle corrupt and released dissidents in prison to allow them contribute their quota to national development.

"I appeal to the federal government to release all those dissidents who are in detention so that they can come out to unite the state and move it forward.

release them, let them recognise that we can teach them unity and peace.

"For ever since we became an independent nation, we have been living in peace," and also urged Nigerians to come together and be united as a country.

''Once a nation adopts presidential system of government, unity is not optional."

The Secretary to the Government of the Federation (SGF), Sen. George Akume, appealed to the governors to find it expedient to delegate

some relevant and key roles to their deputies.

Represented by a Director in SGF office, Mr Simon Tyungu, said such would give them a sense of belonging.

"Nigeria is presently facing a lot of very demanding challenges and this is because the effect of governance is not being felt by the majority of Nigerians as should be.

`To this end, I want to use this platform to advocate for a shared national vision between the federal government, state government and local government to be implemented within four years.

'This will be in form of the three tiers agreeing on very critical projects, that is the food and development centre," he said.

Gov. AbdulRahman AbdulRazaq of Kwara and the Chairman, Nigeria Governors' Forum (NGF) urged all serving and former governors and their deputies to continue to work together for nation building.

a roundtable organised by Yiaga Africa and the Kofi Annan Foundation themed "Unpacking Nigeria's 2023 General Elections and Prospects for Electoral Reform" in Abuja on Monday.

Speaking at the event, Mr Samson Itodo, the Executive Director, Yiaga Africa, said that the roundtable was convened to conduct a post mortem of the 2023 General Elections and to seek priority areas for reforms.

Itodo said that INEC needed to be unbundled adding that the current arrangements where the appointment of the chairman and national commissioners were vested in the executive, needed to be reviewed.

He said that the Justice Uwais committee recommended that the president should not appoint the Chairman commissioners into INEC rather the power should be vested in another institution.

"You cannot have an electoral commission that is composed of persons who are appointed by the President and in some cases you have the incumbents as part of a political party or leading a political party.

"So in line with Justice Uwais, one of the recommendations is to review the appointment rocess of commissioners and RECs into INEC.

"In fact, one of the proposals is that the President should not appoint RECs.

"INEC when properly constituted with individuals that have impeccable character, competence and capacity should appoint its own resident electoral commissioners or directors of elections to manage elections," he said.

"This is it just a way of protecting the independence of the commission to prevent it from any form of political interference or manipulation,'

### 'Remove powers to appoint **INEC RECs, Commissioners** from president'



Itodo said that the legal framework for Nigeria's elections needed to be reformed because they revealed that there were inconsistencies and ambiguities in the law.

He however, said that elections were not just about laws because Nigeria could have the best of laws but if politicians do not change their attitude towards politics, toward elections and towards democracy citizens, it would not inspire confidence in citizens.

He said that there were also issues around the ambiguities in the results coalition process adding that both the law and the guidelines issued by INEC had some inconsistencies and there was need to strengthen the law to make it compulsory for electronic transmission of results.

Sen. Abdulaziz Yaradu'a, the Deputy Chairman, Senate Committee on INEC, said that the National Assembly (NASS) was working on plans to build the election process to global standards for the benefit of Nigeria's democracy.

Yaradu'a however, said that one of the issues being faced by NASS was that while elections had been conducted and completed ,most of the nembers of the assembly were

still in court trying to protect their mandate.

Mr Sebastian Brack, a member the Kofi Annan Foundation, said that Nigeria was not just a key country for West Africa, but Africa as a whole and given all the pressures on democracy facing the world, Nigeria's successful democratic experiment was a priority.

'This particular roundtable is looking at how we can improve the situation for the next elections in a constructive and forward looking way.

Brack said that different stakeholders from the parliament , civil society, security forces, media and others were brought together to agree on a consensus or list of key recommendations that would come out at the end of the

Prof. Mohammed Kuna , the Special Adviser to INEC Chairman, said that although elections were important, they were not enough in terms of deepening and consolidating democracy.

Kuna said that there was need to focus also on governance, political accountability, conducting elections among others saying that the the commission had noted them.

The take home for us and for Dewan in these words on marbel is that each of us has a dream, the only sure way to find it is to be lost in the service of others. The present age belongs to those who serve others at the wow level, that is,

the act of service to be rated above excellent performance! May we together be committed to this gospel of service as by Bush Still: "We must not and will not rest until every man and woman with a dream has the means to achieve it".

If any of us are doing well, encourage him or her; even those that are doing badly can be encouraged in love to do better. There is always room for improvement! The journey has just begun. I have no comment on Dewan's private life but his public service.

I can see the parliamentarian building network across board and deepening consultations to mobilising opportunities and attracting the dividends of democracy for his people. He is always in touch with the activities of his constituents and doing his utmost best to support them. That is the way leadership should be. However, because he is dealing with people whose morality cannot be predicted or legislate upon, I prayed to God to bless him with extended intellectual capacity, social and emotional intelligence to serve with even greater distinction. He must not lose sight of his commitment which is to put "a smile on, at least, someone's face"!

Leadership is not a title but an opportunity to serve. It is a sacred responsibility which cannot be delegated; trust that goes with the demand transparency and accountability. Whom have I cheated? Whom have I oppressed? From whose hand have I accepted a bribe to make me shut my eyes? If I have done any of these things, I will make it right." and the people will reply: 'You have not cheated or oppressed us; you have not taken anything from anyone's hand.' # **ABU student stabs 17** year old to death

THE Bauchi State Office of the Nigeria Security and Civil Defence Corps (NSCDC) has confirmed the arrest of Abdullahi Ibrahim, a 500-level student of Veterinary Medicine of Ahmadu Bello University (ABU) Zaria, for killing 17-year-old boy, Umar Usman in Misau Local Government Area of Bauchi

This was confirmed to journalists in Bauchi recently by Mr. Ilelaboye Oyejide, the NSCDC Commander in Bauchi State. He disclosed that the suspect was arrested in Misau Local Government Area of the state.

He explained that the command received information that 17-year-old secondary school student, Umar Usman in Misau was found wrapped in a cloth and dumped at Misau bypass.

"This is a case of culpable homicide. On the 20th of October 2023, the lifeless body of Umar Usman was found wrapped in a white cloth and dumped in Misau bypass.

"He was quickly taken to General Hospital Misau, where he was certified dead and handed over to the family for burial," Oyejide said.

"When we received the tragic report, without delay, we raised high-powered intelligence officers to go to Misau, investigate and bring the perpetrators to book.





Sunak supports Israel but demands run crisis-wracked Argentina aid for Gaza

The British prime minister met with Benjamin Netanyahu and Isaac Herzog on Thursday and emphasized the need to get food, water and medicine to the 2.4 million people blocked in GazaBritain's Prime Minister Rishi Sunak on Thursday, October 19, pressed Israel to let more humanitarian aid into Gaza as he stepped up a campaign by Western leaders to reinforce support for Israel after attacks by Hamas. Sunak, following visits this week by US President Joe Biden and Germany's Chancellor Olaf Scholz, expressed strong backing for Israeli action after the October 7 raids in which at least 1,400 died and more SUNAK than 200 people were taken hostage. But he said after talks with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and President Isaac Herzog that it was also important to get food, water and medicine to an armed campaign for the blockaded Gaza's 2.4 million

# Insurgency: Ribadu should think out-of-the-box

In truth, the challenge in Nigeria is not absence of patriotic Nigerians to offer information on insecurity, but HOW their safety can be guaranteed after supplying intelligence on crime; thus Anonymous Mail-in Crime Report (AMICAR) intend to provide answer to this HOW? Nowhere in the history has insurgency been defeated by only force of arm; it has always been by carrot and stick. Often, people mistake separatist agitation for insurgency. EMEKA ORAETOKA writes.

MORE often than not, separatist agitation starts after complaint of marginalization by usually an organic group within a country, was ignored, by usually the dominant ruling group; while insurgency, particularly asymmetric variant in a multi-ethnic setting like Nigeria, is caused by combination of factors, like feeling of being "cheated" by ethnic group(s) within a geographical space. Political marginalization of a group within sub-nationals could also trigger insurgency within that enclave. Power struggle by political blocks within sub-national spaces, is another causative factor. Nigeria can easily contain the current asymmetric insurgency by strategic mobilization and deployment of the Collective Will of Nigerians to do so. The big question here is HOW?

It is hard to defeat known separatist group within a country, and even harder to crush asymmetric insurgency in multiethnic setting like Nigeria. Example will suffice here. In Sri-Lanka, for instance, the Sinhalese ethnic group-led government was able to defeat Tamil Tiger separatist agitation after more than 30 years of fighting. Initially, authorities in Philippines thought it could defeat Hukbalahap gorilla insurgent movement with only force of arm. but discovered it was losing the war and sought help. The assistance came when the then President, Ramon Magsaysay was advised by General Edward Lansdale, to adopt a simple counter insurgency measures, this led to the death of Hukbalahap insurgent movement. What Nigeria needs to defeat the current asymmetric insurgency is the Philippines option, and that is, Strategic Mobilization and Deployment of the Collective Will of Nigerians to fight insecurity in the country. This is without prejudice to current effort of government in the fight against insecurity. In a nutshell, direct and indirect community based intelligence gathering system is solution to defeating insecurity in the country.

It appears to this writer that lack of understanding of the correlation between Insecurity and Insurgency, and how to go about it, is largely responsible for festering of insurgency in Nigeria. A simple dictionary definition of both words will suffice. Insurgency is defined as: "an organised rebellion aimed at overthrowing a constituted government through the use of subversion and armed conflict". On the other hand: Insecurity is: "the state of being subject to danger or iniurv". A careful look at the two because the setting is not the same. definitions shows insecurity as being a by- product of the first leg of insurgency, which is subversion. From the definition of insurgency, it has two components, (a) Subversion (b) Armed Conflict. It follows therefore that organised insecurity in Nigeria, is a product of successful subversion of the nation's security system. For clarity, organised insecurity takes the shape of kidnapping, banditry, unknown gunmen killing, organized armed robbery and any other crime involving conceptualisation and planning, and involves more than one person.

A brief interrogation of insurgency in the Philippines and separatist agitation in Sri Lanka will enhance understanding of insecurity in Nigeria and colution that may

complement the effort of security agencies in fighting the menace in the country. Bring his government near to the people. President Magsasay followed Lansdale's advice and achieved result. The situation was the opposite in Sri-Lanka. There are two main social groups in Sri-Lanka: Sinhalese ethnic group 75% and Tamil ethnic group 18%. The official language in the country is Sinhala. In a nutshell, what happened in Sri-Lanka was ethnic cleansing, but it took Sinhalese-led government more than 30 years to defeat Tamil Tigers. So, the argument in some quarters in Nigeria that Sri-Lanka option can be used to defeat insurgency, is at best, narrow

The point this writer is trying to make is, though in Philippines, the then insurgent group was Huk gorilla only, but in Nigeria, the insurgent groups are amorphous in nature, worst still, they are working for different purposes. While it was easy for Philippines to localize Huk guerilla movement, it is difficult to realistically pinpoint insurgent groups' leadership in Nigeria. This writer believes Philippines approach can be adopted with modification in Nigeria. One of the advices General Edward Lansdale gave to President Ramon Magsasay was to bring government nearer to the people. The question here is how will

President Bola Tinubu bring his government nearer to Nigerians in terms of preventing and fighting insurgency induced insecurity? IF you're someone who gets a regular period, it can be confusing and a little concerning when the day you expect menstruation to begin comes and goes without any sign of bleeding.

The definition of a "late period" varies by individual—some people get their period at the exact same time every month, while others see more variation—but Raquel Dardik, M.D., clinical associate professor in the department of obstetrics and gynecology at NYU Langone Health, says, "a late period is the lack of bleeding at the expected time for your menstrual cycle to start. A person who has 28 day cycles would have a late period after 28 days, while someone whose cycles vary between 26 to 31 days would not be late until after 31 days have passed."

The general rule in gynecology is that a period is not really considered late until a full week has passed, adds Dr. Dardik. So, what are some possible reasons for a late period? Here's everything you need to know.

There are a handful of reasons as to why your period might be late. These can include:

Pregnancy.

This is because when pregnancy occurs, the body needs its thick uterine lining, and stops shedding it every month. Pregnancy tests are typically most accurate after you miss your period, and experts recommend taking a pregnancy test as soon as possible if your period is late. If your period is irregular, consider taking a pregnancy test three weeks after sex for the most accurate results. A Hormone Imbalance

Hormone imbalances occur when there is too much or too little of a hormone in your bloodstream. They can happen for a variety of reasons, but when they do, it can cause a delayed or missed period. "Sometimes abnormalities with your hormones can make you miss your period, whether it's from lack of ovulation, or an imbalance of the gynecologic hormones," says Dr. Dardik. Medication

Medications can impact your period in different ways. "For example, many birth control pill users find that they occasionally skip their cycle, even when they have not missed pills or changed their medication," says Dr. Dardik.

Mostafa Borahay, Ph.D., director of the division of general gynecology and obstetrics at Johns Hopkins in Baltimore, adds that certain medications, such as Whether you're a seasoned antidepressants, can elevate expert or total beginner, prolactin levels (a hormone made by the pituitary gland), which can

have an impact on the menstrual cycle and lead to a late period.

If your period is late and you've been more stressed than usual, that could be the culprit, as the gland responsible for hormones in your ovaries is linked to the part of your brain that regulates emotions.

"The inner lining of the uterus itself is controlled by estrogen and progesterone, which come from the ovaries," Dr. Borahay says. "The ovaries are under control of another gland that sits right beneath the brain called the pituitary gland. This is controlled by the hypothalamus, which is connected to the limbic system and the other parts of the brain that control emotions and other processes in the brain."

"So now we can easily understand that changes that happen in the brain—like more stress than usual—can easily affect the menstrual cycle," he

The years leading up to menopause, called perimenopause, typically begin in your 30s and 40s. During this time, estrogen levels in the ovaries start to fluctuate, and both Dr. Borahay and Dr. Dardik say late or irregular periods can be a symptom of nerimenopause.

Being Overweight

Being overweight can impact your period in a number of ways, according to Dr. Borahay. "We don't understand the whole picture just yet, but most female sex hormones, estrogen and progesterone, are fat soluble," he says. "These hormones can be stored in fat, which can affect the rhythm that happens in these ovarian hormones."

Essentially, fat cells (along with ovaries) produce estrogen. Weight gain can lead to your fat cells growing and releasing more estrogen, which in turn, can cause your body to stop ovulating, leading to a missed period. Additionally, being overweight is associated with polycystic ovary syndrome

(PCOS), in which the main symptom is irregular or missed periods due to irregular

Just as being overweight can impact your hormones, being underweight can be correlated with late or irregular periods as well, and can lead your body to stop producing estrogen altogether. "The easiest way to think about it is that when a woman is underweight or malnourished, reproduction is no longer a priority," Dr. Borahay says. "When someone is malnourished, the body uses the resources it does have to prioritize survival."



Thyroid disorders are a common one, as is PCOS. "If a woman is of reproductive age and her period is usually regular, the first thing to do is take an at-home pregnancy test," he says. "If someone has a delayed period and a negative pregnancy test, I usually ask if there are other symptoms, and if there's not, I tell them to wait. If a woman is healthy and doing her annual exams, I think a week is reasonable. If a week passes and her period hasn't arrived, it makes sense to see a doctor." In general, a slightly late period isn't something to worry about. But if you have any questions about your period, you should always feel comfortable checking in with vour doctor.

# Strategies for controlling your anger

Uncontrolled anger can be problematic for your personal relationships and for your health. Fortunately, there are tools you can learn to help you keep your anger in check.

There are strategies to take control of your anger, wrath, fury, rage whatever you call it, anger is a powerful emotion. Unfortunately, it's often an unhelpful one.

Anger is a natural human experience, and sometimes there are valid reasons to get mad like feeling hurt by something someone said or did or experiencing frustration over a situation at work or home. But uncontrolled anger can be problematic for your personal relationships and for your health.

Fortunately, there are tools you can learn to help you keep your anger in check. Understanding

Anger can take different forms. Some people feel angry much of the time, or can't stop dwelling on an event that made them mad. Others get angry less often, but when they do it comes out as explosive bouts of

Whatever shape it takes, uncontrolled anger can negatively affect physical health and emotional wellbeing. Research shows that anger and hostility can increase people's chances of developing coronary heart disease, and lead to worse outcomes in people who already have heart disease. Anger can also lead to stress-related problems including insomnia, digestive problems and headaches.

Anger can also contribute to violent and risky behaviors, including drug and alcohol use. And on top of all that, anger can significantly damage relationships with family, friends and colleagues.

You need to keep anger at bay. Anger can be caused by internal and external events. You might feel mad at a person, an entity like the company you work for, or an event like a traffic jam or a political election. Wherever the feelings come from, you don't have to let your anger get the better of vou. Here are some techniques to help you stay calm.

Check yourself. It's hard to make smart choices when vou're in the grips of a powerful negative emotion. Rather than trying to talk yourself down from a cliff, avoid climbing it in the first place. Try to identify warning signs that you're starting to get annoyed. When you recognize the signs, step away from the situation or try relaxation



techniques to prevent your irritation from escalating.

Don't dwell. Some people have a

tendency to keep rehashing the incident that made them mad. That's an unproductive strategy, especially if vou have already resolved the issue that angered you in the first place. Instead, try to let go of the past incident. One way to do that is to focus instead on things you appreciate about the person or the situation that made you angry.

Change the way you think. When you're angry, it's easy to feel like things are worse than they really are. Through a technique known as cognitive restructuring, you can replace unhelpful negative thoughts with more reasonable ones. Instead of thinking "Everything is ruined," for example, tell yourself "This is frustrating, but it's not the end of the world."

Try these strategies to reframe your thinking: Avoid words like "never" or "always" when talking about yourself or others. Statements like "This never works" or "You're always forgetting things" make you feel your anger is justified. Such statements also alienate

people who might otherwise be willing to work with you on a solution. Use logic. Even when it's justified, anger can quickly become irrational. Remind yourself that the world is not out to get you. Do this each time you start feeling angry, and you'll get a more balanced perspective. Translate expectations into desires. Angry people tend to demand things, whether it's fairness, appreciation, agreement or willingness to do things their way. Try to change your demands into requests. And if things don't go your way, try not to let your disappointment turn into anger.

Relax. Simple relaxation strategies, such as deep breathing and relaxing imagery, can help soothe angry make a promise to come back feelings. If you practice one or more later to finish the discussion. of these strategies often, it will be easier to apply them when angry exercise can help you feelings strike.

How can a psychologist help?

If you continue to feel overwhelmed, consult with a psychologist or other licensed mental health professional who can help you learn how to control your anger. He or she can help you identify problem areas and then develop an action plan for change in emotions.

Helping children articulate their feelings without acting on them and providing consistent consequences can help them regulate emotions.

Control anger before it controls vou. Anger is a completely normal, usually healthy, human emotion. But when it gets out of control and turns destructive, it can lead to problems.

Psychologists can help people recognize and avoid the triggers that make them angry. They can also provide ways to help people manage the inevitable anger that sometimes flares without warning.

# Otupo bank robbery: Lessons we must learn

THE Police in Benue State recently confirmed the gruesome killing of Otukpo Divisional Police Officer (DPO), CSP John Adikwu and three other policemen in a gun battle with robbers while robbing several banks along Otupo Taraku Federal Highway. According to the Police, many innocent pedestrians, bank customers including two of the robbers were killed with many of the criminals scooting into the forest. Though the Otupo robbery attack was not the first experienced in the country, the sophisticated nature of the operation and the casualties number have continued to generate heated debates in public domains. More significantly, questions are being asked as to how these armed robbers acquired their weapons and chose their targets without the security getting a tipoff of these operations.

CERTAINLY, the increasing rate of crimes and its global implications is becoming a source of concern and worry to many stakeholders. As it is, the average statistics of criminal gangsterism as of 2017 reveals about 105 robberies per 100,000 people unabatedly takes place around the world. 

Based on the World Bank updated report in September 2022, the new international poverty line is \$2.15 using 2017 prices. This means that anyone living on less than \$2.15 a day is considered to be living in extreme poverty. This shows that the increment of N-Power volunteers' monthly stipends is overdue if truly the aim of the federal government is to alleviate poverty and reduce unemployment.

In fact, increasing the stipend will motivate the participants to be regular at their PPA, increase their service delivery and in the long run make them employers of labour. Most of the participants disengaged from the platform in 2020 would have become employers of labour if they were given start up packages after their service. This would have directly or indirectly accelerated the quest for selfsufficiency, reduced the number of people at the "colony of unemployment," and tame insecurity.

Most of the funds earmarked for the war against terrorism in the country would have been used to build schools, hospitals, construct more road networks and other social amenities begging for attention in the country if unemployment and poverty are properly addressed.

That is why government needs to increase the monthly stipends of N-Power volunteers, create an exit start up packages for them, and subject them to two or three weeks training at the end of their service so that their business ideas can be fine-tuned to fit in the realities at the world of business.





# How 'misinvoicing' hinders trade growth in Africa

Trade misinvoicing, or deliberately falsifying import and export invoices, facilitates billions in illicit financial outflows annually across Africa. This endemic issue acts as a major barrier to unlocking the continent's immense trade potential. What is it then? Writes Tami Koroye

It mostly involves exporters and importers deliberately manipulating invoices to disguise capital flows. Under-invoicing exports lower declared value to illegally move foreign exchange earnings elsewhere while avoiding taxes and capital controls. On the other hand, overinvoicing imports enables bringing additional capital into countries informally. The African Development Bank estimates trade misinvoicing drains over \$50 billion in revenues yearly from the continent. In 2014, the Nigerian economy lost over \$2.2 billion in revenue due to misinvoicing. This was also the sentiment shared in Kenya and South Africa, by their respective national agencies. Not only does trade-misinvoicing starve these nations of incomes needed for necessary development and liquidation of the economy, but it also undermines the State's policy effectiveness and economic management. Trade misinvoicing has a significant impact on tax revenue in sub-Saharan Africa, reducing it by a considerable amount. Tax holidays and regulatory quality also strengthen the effect of trade misinvoicing, especially in African countries.

It is important to state that the issue of trade misinvoicing is not limited to Africa but is a global problem. The global shadow financial system, propped up by tax havens and financial secrecy, is equally responsible for the propagation of trade misinvoicing in Africa. However, this has more dilapidating effects on African countries like Nigeria that need the facilitation of trade to rejig and public economic activities.



# Negotiating multifaceted identities for development in Nigeria

Apart from saying your name, if you were asked, "who are you?" What would be your answer? Would it be about your tribe (e.g. "I am Zaar, Igbo, Fulani"), religion (e.g. "I am a Christian, Muslim, Traditionalist"), region ("I am a Northerner, Southerner, Middle-Belter"), profession ("I am a teacher, nurse, politician"), social status ("I am a king, a governor, a leader"), or nationality ("I am a Nigerian")? As simple as this question may sound, therein lies the root cause of most cases of terrorism, ethno-religious conflicts, favoritism, and nepotism in Nigeria, write Dogara Ishaya Manomi

THE is a question of social identity. Social identity or group identity simply refers to how you define who you are in relation to your membership of a particular group and the value (e.g. selfesteem, sense of belonging) and emotion (e.g. happiness, hope, comfort) you derive from belonging to that group (Tafjel, 1978). For example, if you are asked, "who are you?" and you say, "I am a Christian," or "I am a Muslim," or "I am Zaar by tribe," you are stating your social identity as opposed to individual identity which would be mainly your name, your gender, or anything peculiar to you alone. Being a communal culture mainly, social identity normally overrides personal identity. This is why a sense of honor and shame (social) rather than guilt and innocence (personal) are the major determinants of people's actions, attitudes, and assessment of right or wrong. It accounts for why people feel less guilty if they can get away with corruption without being caught. Depending on the situation and place, we answer the social identity question "who are you (we)?" differently, since we belong to different social groups. But if you were to re-arrange these multiple social identities, which one would be first and which one would be last?

Is there a "nigerian national identity?"

Is there such a thing as "Nigerian National Identity?" An average Nigerian, in my estimation, has at least five significant multifaceted yet intertwined (but unequal)identities that play out more in communal or societal life, and which have significant impact on national solidarity, peace, and development. Those five multifaceted identities include: clan identity (e.g. Nghasiti and Morass among the Zaar people of Tafawa Balewa, Bauchi state), tribal identity (e.g. Ngas, Alago, Ibibio), religious identity (e.g. Christian, Muslim), regional identity (e.g. Northerner, Southerner, Middle-Belter), and national identity (e.g. Nigerian). However, two of

these identities seem to be more prominent and salient to many, if not majority, of Nigerians, namely, religious and tribal identities. A simple indicator to this fact is that, most cases of terrorism and violent conflicts in Nigeria are religious and/or ethnic motivated. For example, the case of Boko Haram and the violent conflicts between Fulani herdsmen and farming tribes like the Tiv, Berom, etc. trope

Hence, it is accountable to argue that terrorism and ethnoreligious conflicts in Nigeria are primarily a function of "negative solidarity" that results from a sense of ethnic and religious social identity at the expense of national identity. In such a case, people regard their religious, sectorial, or ethnic identity as the most salient identity which deserves their absolute loyalty at all costs. As a result, any perceived disrespect or threat to that social group from outsiders is treated with extreme force, leading to terrorism and ethnoreligious conflicts.

Negotiating a tapestry of

identities: salience and trope of national identity For a multi-religious, multi-

cultural, and secular nation (as Nigeria self-identifies constitutionally) to foster peaceful co-existence, national solidarity, and national development, it is time we renegotiate and promote a national identity above any other identity, at least in public domains. The good news is, promoting national identity in public domains above any other sense of social identity does not diminish the value of other social identities that we hold dearly. Instead, it places them in their rightful contexts, where they will find utmost expression without negatively affecting "the other" nor disrupting peace and stability. Promoting national identity as the salient social identity would imply conscious efforts in making national symbols more conspicuous and religious and cultural symbol less conspicuous in public spheres. While both Christians and Muslims in Nigeria are

actively trying to outdo each other in public visibility, evident in the way churches and Mosques are situated in strategic locations in cities and towns, worship in public spaces are promoted, and church worship and Sallah programs are done using loud speakers that compete to out-loud others, it is time to pause and ask ourselves: have our competing religious externalities contributed more to mutual understanding or rivalry, mutual trust or distrust, peaceful co-existence or conflicts? The answer seems obvious, right? The more religious and ethnicconscious Nigeria becomes, the more we experience religious extremism and ethnic bigotry that promote violence in forms of terrorism and ethno-religious conflicts. This calls for a renegotiation of our sense of identity.

Way forward: Developing a moral vision for "the Nigerian identity"

From my stay, study, and interactions with people in different developed countries (Germany, UK, USA, Belgium, among others), I have observed that a sense of national identity has been entrenched in their thought-pattern such that majority of the citizens regard their national identity as their salient identity, and every other sense of social identity contributes or functions in the service of national identity. National identity is unmistakably the only umbrella identity that can promote peace, cross-body solidarity, and national development.

National cardinal virtues: A case for a virtue-oriented Nigerian identity

Developing a national identity, however, requires articulating national "cardinal virtues." To develop national cardinal virtues, we can glean wisdom from ancient Greek philosophers (e.g. Plato, Aristotle, and the Stoics) who articulated four cardinal virtues that would summarize all other virtues: wisdom, courage, self-control, justice. These virtues were considered necessary for human flourishing. Those cardinal virtues provided the moral compass that would guide every unit of society to contribute to peaceful co-existence. The Greek cardinal virtues, however, quandaries of the Nigerian state.

control. The National Orientation Agency and relevant governmental and nongovernmental organizations can champion the course of a virtueoriented national identity and engage in public awareness campaign. Parents and teachers are to complement the effort by integrating and inculcating these virtues in children at home and in school. Religious leaders are to preach and teach it to their congregations. Musicians, media personalities, artists, film makers and actors, etc. to integrate these virtues and a vision of national identity in their acts, and so on. In this way, we can imagine and emerge an overarching Nigerian national identity that trumps any negative solidarity" Durkheim) and fosters peace, patriotism, national solidarity, and development. In this way, Nigerians will learn to be more in solidarity with virtue and their nation than with any other sense of identity. For example, if any office holder acts unjustly in giving most political appointments to people from his tribe, religion, or region at the expense of the "federal character," his own people will not stand in solidarity with him, but with the virtue of justice, and would also lend their voices in protesting and calling him to distribute political appointments justly, in the interest of national peace and development. This may sound like some utopian imagination, but it is possible. Rwanda is a good example of a nation that (a)rose from the ashes of a deadly ethnicidentity-motivated genocide and promoted national identity above all other identities, which has resulted in sustainable national peace, stability, solidarity, and development. Nigeria can do the same.

In conclusion, it is time to stop taking pride (and actually be ashamed) in being described as one of "the most religious countries in the world," if our religious identity marker does not promote peace and development. Instead, it is time to renegotiate the multifaceted identities and their resultant "negative solidarity," leading to a `Nigerian national identity,' which is to be encapsulated in a "national cardinal virtues" of tolerance, peace, justice, and need to be contextualized to self-control, which will promote address the peculiarities and human flourishing. In this way, we can truly imagine and In view of the current emerge a Nigeria of our dream, multifaceted and competing such that, when you are asked "who are you?" you would be proud to say, first, "I am a Nigerian," or better still, "I am Nigeria"(without relegating your "national cardinal virtues" that religious and ethnic identities), can find expression in each because a nation is its people, and the people are the nation!

### Police investigate assassination of 58 year old woman From Willie Attah,

Police in Gombe State has launched investigation into the gruellsome hacking to death of a 58 year old woman in her residence in Jeka-dafari quarters of the State capital.

Information reaching our correspondent says Aishatu Abdullahi, a mother of eight (8), was slaughtered like a ram around 09:00 pm Friday (20/10/2023) night by suspected hired assassins who stormed the residence and escaped with the victim's mobile phone after the act.

It was also gathered that Police operatives visited the scene shortly after the incident and rushed the victim

The Command also urged residents to remain calm and vigilant and to report any suspicious activities or individuals to the police. He added that "without the support of the public, we may not get to the root of these problems because some of these criminals are from within the community being terrorized".

# Hojlund from Copenhagen struggles to Man U star

Manchester United have a point to prove when they face Copenhagen on Tuesday, and so does Rasmus Hojlund. After making their worst-ever start to a Champions League group stage by losing to both Bayern Munich and Galatasaray, Erik ten Hag's side's future in Europe's elite competition is on the line.Victory is a must if they want to stand a decent chance of staying in a competition in which they have barely made a dent since Sir Alex Ferguson's retirement. And Hojlund could hold the key to getting those crucial three points. RICHARD MARTIN writes

THE 20-year-old has made a flying start in the Champions League, scoring three goals in his first two games and doing his best Ruud van Nistelrooy impression against Galatasaray. Hojlund seems to come alive on the biggest stage, and he will be even more motivated on Tuesday as he comes face-to-face with his boyhood club, who broke his heart less than two years ago.

Hojlund would have seemed a natural fit to take the baton from Wind as first-choice striker, but the club were not ready to put all their faith in the then-18-year-old and signed Senegal international Khouma Babacar instead on a free transfer from Sassuolo.

UTHENTIC transformational leadership provides a reasonable and realistic concept of self - a self that is connected to friends, family, and community, whose welfare may be more important to them than their own.


Their moral obligations are grounded in a broader conception of individuals within community and related social norms and cultural beliefs. Transformational leadership is consistent with Judaic-Christian philosophical traditions and discourses on the leadership of the moral sage that presuppose a trusting community as the central life context.

In leadership, character matters. This is not to deny that evil people can bring about good things or that good people can lead the way to moral ruin. Rather, leadership provides a moral compass and, over the long term, both personal development and the common good are best served by a moral compass that reads true.

Here some lessons can be drawn from the traditions of the moral sage and social prophet that have enjoyed prominence in a wide variety of cultures. Whether visionary or ascetic, the moral sage and social prophet have also widely been perceived as agents of change, as well as people to be emulated and as leaders of others, political organisations and of moral principles, they must not followers.
