She cleared air while in an interview with THE NIGERIA STANDARD recently in Jos, the state capital, following speculations making the rounds in some quarters that October Plateau civil servants.

The commissioner said, " want to state clearly here that Governor Caleb Mutfwang's administration is an administration that values human resource. When he came, he met a huge backlog of salaries, pensions and the workers were on strike for that reason.
" February salary was not fully paid because there were more than $80 \%$ of unpaid salaries in February. So, from March upward, there were no salaries. But I am glad to tell you that this government has cleared the entire backlog of salaries and pensions.
"As at last weekend, salary for the month of October was paid. You know, the salaries come in batches. For us the appointees, they say we are the parents and so, ours came in last, but I can tell you that I have received my October salary in October.
"So, we are up-to-date in payment of salaries and pensions. If there is someone who is yet to receive his October salary, well, we are yet to receive that complaint from any Ministry, Department and Agency (MDA)", Dongkum cleared air.

She, however, expressed concern that deductions were made from Cooperative Societies, Agencies and Taxes in the past, but there were no remittances. Pointing out that "those complaints came up, but we were able to sit down and sort out all of that and it is a plus to this administration.
"That tells you that if there was nothing else that we have, we are proud to have a leader who knows where he is going to and where he is coming from, for the betterment of Plateau State citizens.
"So, if you are unable to say your achievement, somebody out there will downplay it and say other things that cover whatever you have achieved. That is why we are collaborating with you, the media for you to project what we are doing", the Commissioner enthused.
Hon. Grace Shwarta Dongkum, however, expressed joy that two additional heads of trains have been procured by Governor Caleb Mutfwang's administration as part of measures to help cushion the transport problems of citizens in spite of negative stories surrounding it.


The president, while emphasising the need to reinforce collaboration on both political and economic fronts, welcomed the growing cooperation between the two countries in areas of shared interest, such as climate change, economic integration, education, and culture.
On the situation in Niger Republic, President Tinubu, who is the Chairman of the ECOWAS Authority of Heads of State and Government, said Nigeria is monitoring the situation in the neighbouring country, and avoid bloodshed.

I am deploying all appropriate back-channel strategies to avoid bloodshed in Niger Republic. We recognise the wishes of our people; they do not want war, but that does not mean we can not take bold and decisive action," the president affirmed.
President Tinubu said Nigeria will continue to galvanise international partners in the determined pursuit of a peaceful resolution to the situation in Niger Republic.
The French Minister of Europe and Foreign Affairs conveyed the goodwill of President Emmanuel Macron and expressed the
readiness of France to expand mutually beneficial collaboration with Nigeria across multiple sectors.
She proceeded to extend a formal invitation to President Tinubu to attend the forthcoming Paris Peace Forum
Speaking on the Abacha loot, the French Presidential Envoy said the repatriation followed the completion of legal processes.
"It was a long process, but we are glad that it was concluded. Sometimes, justice may be slow, but this is a very good achievement," she said.
Ms. Colonna also commended President Tinubu's leadership in ECOWAS, saying: "We support your efforts at ECOWAS. We are behind you because we believe that Constitutional order is a treasure for all countries, and democracy must be a reality."

IT is rather difficult to say the

It is difficult to forget the 2023 World Teachers' Day, particularly as Nigerian workers are in the struggle for better pay owing to the removal of fuel subsidy by the federal government on May 29, 2023.
This year's (2023) World Teachers' Day is difficult to be forgotten. There are reasons not to skip this day, given what workers in Nigeria have gone through lately. The Day which was observed last Thursday globally should become our responsibility to fight the war of the Nigerian teacher, who for long has been forgotten and neglected by government and indeed the society.
For the Nigerian teacher, we are aware that so much has happened regarding his predicament and the constant assurance that government is doing enough to change the station of the Teacher. Nothing seems to be happening to the teacher even with consistent rhetoric to the contrary for his development and the future of the sector.
Nothing has changed, rather, the Nigerian teacher's position as we have come to know of it has not improved and nothing appears to be done to change it. It is not as if government has not committed resources to the welfare of the teacher, yet the much that government has said it has done has not been able to address their predicamentand settling those contentious issues that have aggravated the minds of the teachers to the point that we have witnessed so many strikes declared by their mother union, Nigeria Union of Teachers.
The World Teachers' Day offers the teacher the opportunity for soul searching and addressing those areas that have been neglected by government and drawing peoples' attention to those critical areas that have been refused attention; but more importantly allow people as well as teachers themselves the opportunity to justify their calling.
Has that been done? Have the teachers critically assessed themselves on the day with a view to changing their attitude to their calling since the activities for the day were started? If they have, could we say with all sincerity that some changes have been noticed in what they do? If nothing has been noticed by the society what have they done to address them, and to be able to change the perception of the society?
The man on the street does no appreciate the worth of the teacher, very few do. They do not see the teacher of today deserving respect and honour that the teacher of yester years would have been given. You and I know that the teacher used to be every thing that was found in society except the bad.
Therefore, if it has changed, and by every inch it has, we have every reason not to see the teacher as an example that he used to be some years back. It is only through the realization of this precarious

position that we can begin to have failed to do in regard to address thes daily.
Right from the beginning, let's gree that education has let's gotten the right treatment from gotten the from government. It therefore means that whatever is done, it can just serve as a palliative measure and cannot translate into concrete solutions. Butthat is what

There is so
There is so much deception and lack of faith in all the efforts that are continuously been put in place to salvage the education sector from the decay that it has gone through in the last couple of years. I doubt if we can rise from the current decay. It is surmountable, given the fact that on a daily basis the number of students you see wanting to gain admission to read in the country's universities colleges of education and polytechnics is alarming and it gives credence to the fact that there are some serious ones out there yet. But several others are not prepared to go the right way to pursue their educational careers through the right channels.
It is for this category of students that we need to ask certain pertinent questions regarding the education of our children. We will do so because there is the need to ascertain where we have gone wrong and better still, find avenue through which we can retrace our
steps and make the future of our children conducive. Yet, in doing so we cannot forget easily what we al

Talking about sanitation of the sector, in the last couple of years, governments have continued to pay lip service to making sure that education is given its rightly place through adequate budgetary infrastructure and on the who the teachers and on the whole pay the teachers their rightful dues. And talking about the teachers dues, we are not talking about paying them pittance and leaving them.
We are saying that government must be able to compensate them with a remuneration that they would die before they get their reward in heaven. Teachers don't want to receive their rewards only in heaven, they want to be paid righ here on earth.
Some Nigerian teachers in some states have been shabbily treated and not given what they deserve he given The outcome of such treatment is yearly noticed in the treatment is yearly noticed in the utcome of the products that are churned out of these schools. Bu th most annoying of all the impediments to quality education is the fact that some states are today battling to settle scores with th Teachers' union.
You will recall that only last yea the Nigerian Union of Teachers declared a strike to press home th need to implement the much sought new Teachers Salary Scale.
It took several weeks before it was resolved in favour of the NUT. Since then, it has been one strike after the ther from the different stat chapters of the union. In some ases, some of the states teachers have spent months at home waiting for a negotiation of the demands by for a neg
the NUT.
Nothing, for now appears to b happening in most of those state that the teachers are on strike, and our children are still at home waiting for the resolution of the crisis.

In some cases there has been outright condemnation of the union as not being progressive but only out to take away what should be used to develop the state given the current state of the nation's economy. This has further infuriated the teachers who think that the politicians are playing politics with their stomach and are not interested in solving the problem, which has continued to be the bane of our development.
That we are thinking of catching the industrial world with this attitude is ridiculous and laughable as it is an indictment of the efforts that are made for us to be among the twenty most developed economies in the year 2020 .
Teachers we need for the education we want: The global imperative to reverse the teacher shortage' is this year's theme of the event. It is apt and instructive given the continued neglect the teacher has been put through. It is instructive that his theme was chosen ahead of others. We have agreed that government has not given the right support for wanting to go into teaching as a profession.
Elsewhere, once you choose to go into teaching you are given special encouragement through grants above others who are under going other courses in the same institution. This, they believe should spur such students into accepting the fact that teaching has a special place in the development of their people.
They will also reciprocate by rightly doing what they are paid to do: impacting knowledge to the young ones. They do so because they are paid wages that are commensurate with the labour they put their work as teachers.
That is the last thing that we expect here in Nigeria, and they always say, why would the teacher expect his reward here on earth? He
deserves to get it in heaven when he would have suffered so much his quest for equitable compensation of his services.

Federal Government on the strike is very unfortunate. The general expectation is that such a hard-line posture has gone with the military era. In a democratic setting, a very diplomatic and sensitive government would have prevented it from getting out of hand. The use of might and naked power in matters of conflict certainly does not produce good results. It cannot do the country any good'.

In Nigeria, even budgetary allocations are not followed. Astory was told of a prisoner who scaped from prison in one of the northern states in Nigeria. As he wondered about in the bush, he came upon a man who was carrying a few days old baby crying at the top of its voice. The escaped prisoner hid behind some trees because even though it was dark, who ever looked intently would know he was a prisoner because of the prison garb he was wearing
Firstly, he was shocked by the man's lack of compassion. He didn't care at all that the sweet baby was crying and made no effort to comfort the baby. The nurses informed her that her mother had been by her side all through her labour But she informed them that her mother was dead. Pandemonium broke. The nurses had assumed that the doting elderly woman by her side was her mother.
Immediately, the nurses and security guards started running around looking for the woman and the baby. But they were nowhere to be found. At the gate, they were informed by a commercial motorcycle driver that he had just dropped a woman carrying a day old baby to a certain destination. He was just telling the other drivers that she paid him N1000 and said he should go with the change

A few security men were called upon and the motorcycle driver led them to the destination. On reaching there, they approached the isolated house cautiously. They sighted the elderly woman pounding something in a mortar. When she noticed them, she was unperturbed. They approached her and asked her why she stole a baby. She casually told them to wait and see for themselves. They asked for the baby and she told them that they were late because it was already cooking.
At that point, those outside warned them that cars were approaching and everyone took cover. To their amazement, the people that were ushered in were heavy weights Some of them were still serving and others once served but their names still rang bell. These powerful men were served baby garnished soup. And they sat and ate it as if it was fish peppered soup.
Seeing the powerful people that have been served and the kind of security they came with, the security agents who came in respect of the baby knew their lives were in danger except they sneaked out unnoticed. And that was what they did.
Unfortunately, they could not explain to the hospital but said it was a fruitless exercise. The mother of the baby was devastated. This case was an eye opener for most maternity wards not to make assumptions but ask before trusting the life of a baby or mother in any body's hands.
These anecdotes are meant to show us the extent of human wickedness. The two examples above were committed agains innocent souls- babies. One was a day old and the other, a few days old.
Times without number, we have heard of girls who gave birth out of wedlock and came back home without the baby.. One lady said she gave birth to a healthy baby, who cried his first cry loud and clear. However, she was later told her baby died and the private clinic took the liberty to bury the child since she was sleeping. She said, she smelt a rat but since it meant she was free again, she let it go
We have heard cases of baby factories Has the government tackled it well? Government has to revisit the issue of registration of different health facilities. Because from every indication, there are a few bad eggs aiding the destruction of lives and selling of babies

In the same vein, quacks still abound in the health field. And they could be the bad eggs engaged in the destruction of lives to make ends meet at all cause. Government needs to fish them out by all means for the safety of lives.

# How poor privatisation of NITEL truncated \$82m NRTP 

In 2002, the Nigerian government conceived the National Rural Telephony Project (NRTP), designed to ensure that rural communities were not left out of the telecommunication development that was about to take off in Nigeria. BAKARE MAJEED writes.

N a rainy August morning, Abubakar AbdulKhadir science lesson for primary four pupils at LEA Primary School in Gurfata, a rural community in Nigeria's federal capital territory. The teacher is dissatisfied with his job. While parts of the world use computers to parts of the world use computers to each their studens, Mr AbdulKhadri relies on images in books to explain the basics of the subject to the 420 pupils in the school.
"We use images in books as instructional material to teach our pupils computer science," Mr AbdulKhadri said. Even worse than not having a computer, Mr AbdulKhadri's community is not connected to electricity or mobile network service, which are essentia infrastructures for teaching his pupils the basics of computing. He has lived in the community for 30 years since his birth.
Just a few metres from the school is Hajara Seriki, a farmer who is also struggling with the consequences of the village not having mobile network coverage. For her, this means being financially excluded. To overcome this issue, she has to travel to either the area council headquarters in Gwagwalada or Lambata in Niger Gwagwalada or Lambata in Nige State in order to access banking
services.

village, she has to climb a hill to access the mobile network.
"I currently don't have a phone, used to have one, but we have to climb that hill to get a mobile signal," Ms Seriki said while pointing to a hil outside the village.
The lack of mobile networks in this community excludes residents from the financial system. Over the past couple of years, the financial system in Nigeria has been leveraging technology to bridge the gap and provide accessibility to underserved communities. For instance, Point-ofcommunities. For instance, Point-of Sale (POS) machines have taken unbanked. However, this also unbanked. However, this also
requires telecommunication infrastructure, which is lacking in many rural communities in Nigeria. many rural communities in Nigeria. like one hour for you to use POS. Those without bikes will need to use okada (motorcycle taxi) which costs as much as $\mathrm{N} 2,500$ and the same thing when coming back. If you plan to withdraw N10,000, you would already have spent N5,000," Adamu Shehu, a local government worker in the community, told this reporter.
The lack of mobile networks is not peculiar to the Gurfata community, About 20 years after the liberalisation of the telecommunication sector, telecom operators are yet to cover the entire country and the telecommunication black hole remains in many areas, particularly rural communities.

On the other hand, the Citizens Mediation Centre Bill seeks to establish a center that will be saddled with the responsibility of mediating between parties on disputes such as landlord and tenant matters, contracts of employment, family matters, debt related matters etc. The center shall also help in reducing the huge legal fees paid by citizens to access the services of lawyers over minor disputes. We cannot deny the fact that these are issues people deal with on a daily basis. Plateau State Local Government Service Commission and Plateau State High Court of Justice. Agodfather is known among th ausa as a 'maigida' (landlord or the head of a household). The word 'maigida' goes beyond its literal meaning. Abner Cohen, Paul Lovejoy and Polly Hill'" used the term in their works to refer to those who provided brokerage services to Hausa traders in transit in different parts of West Africa. These Hausa traders brought cattle from their homeland to different parts of southern West Africa and took back kola nuts to the North. At the various transit centres where they have to stop to do businesses, they rely on a maigida to facilitate their economic activities The maigida provides them with accommodation, storage and brokerage services. The maigida receive compensations for their services and many of them became rich from the number of clients they had. Even in Hausaland, from where these itinerant traders came, this kind of patronlclient relationship is popularly known.
The Hausa sell kola nuts by the hundred (k'warya). One kola nut is added to every hundred that is counted or sold. This is what the maigida gets for commission. In other words what a broker gets is just one percent of everything? that is sold. This is what is known as 'd'an k'ida' (plural - 'yan k'ida) What is paid as commission to a landlord in cattle trade or other kinds of business is generally referred to as 'la'ada'. A 'godfather' is referred to in Yon~baland as 'baba kekere' (the small father), 'baba isale' (the father of the underground world), or 'baba nigbejo (a great help in times of trouble). The most historical of these terms is 'baba kekere'. It was used to depic community leaders with whom peopl of less social status identified as a way of providing physical, social, politica and economic security for themselves For example, most of the Yoruba refugees who came to settle in Ibadan in the early nineteenth century settled with the 'baba kekere' in the city.'" These were military chiefs and patrons appointed to be in charge of certain Ibadan colonies by the town's traditional council. The migrants who settled under these Ibadan chiefs paid the 'baba kekere' tribute. part of which the 'baba kekere' transmitted to the Ibadan authorities. In return. the chiefs were obligated to protect those under them against any act of violence that characterised Ibadan at this time. the sociology of traditional in Igbo society Has made reference to the popula relationship between 'Nnam-Ukwu' (my master) and 'Odibo' (the servant) in the Igbo world view. A younger person is entrusted to a more mature and experienced person for training in social, economic and moral adulthood The role played by the man in this kind of relationship is akin to that of a godfather. The latter is expected to se the boy up in his business after undergoing whatever training the master must have given him. In the three cases mentioned above, a person of lesser social status attaches himself to another person, usually of higher status, for support, which could be social or economic. The godfather gets something in return from the adopted son for the transactional relationship. It is probably on this understanding that the modern notion of godfatherism in Nigeria is based. In other words, the phenomenon ofgodfatherism is no strange to the cultural world of th Nigerian people. The giving of kola by a client to his patron is also not strange. What is probably strange is that the transposition of this social or economic system into the political arena and also the ridiculous nature of what patrons now ask for from their clients as compensation for providing them with 'brokerage services'. The present-day godfatherism is a primordial tradition taken to a criminal extent. The

## Godfatherism: Docile populace

The word 'godfather' appears in parenthesis in many western political studies. The situation is different in Nigeria. The patronIclient relationships that popularised the term in Nigerian politics have cultural roots among many Nigerians peoples. It is not a totally new experience in the sociology of the Hausa, Yoruba and Igbo for people to have one or other type of 'godfather'. For example, the word godfather' has a local equivalence in Hausa, Yoruba and Igbo languages and these words have been in usage since the pre-colonial era. AJIJI AJANG JOHN writes.

Politicians kneeling down, prostrating, and bowing down in worship of other politicians who they deem as gods is not new in the Nigerian political atmosphere, Remember sometime last year when a picture surfaced online showing a political figure in Delta tate, a 61-year-old Nigerian top tier senator, James Manager, the senator representing the Delta south senatorial district was also pictured on his knees, begging the former governor of Delta state, James Ibori, to push his 2023 it is norship ambition.
It is now a tradition. Some call it humility but we all know better, it can be anything but humility. It actually looks stupid, and clearly an act of desperation, its concept is pointing to how much decadence the Nigerian politics have suffered, it shows in clear terms that you can't occupy a juicy political position in Nigeria based on your credibility and merit but based on favoritism as you must be ready to kneel before, worship, bow down and adore some political majesties who will place you in their pockets and control you within their whims and caprices.
Western Nigeria is the pacesetter when it comes to godfatherism politics. Just like the godfather is the overall boss in the mafia family that other lords pay homage to him,
him and take instructions from him. If in that region. An Igbo man will you dare to do otherwise and fail to always tell you " anyi cha bu cha follow his instructions you will be Oga" , meaning, everybody is his treated like an insubordinate and such own boss. There is no state in act of insubordination is punished by eastern Nigeria where a governor, making sure you don't ever return to past or present, will boldly boast to the political position you were occupying before you frolicked or ever win an election again unless you have grown some huge wings to help you flourish independent of your political godfather.
This was the case of the former governor of Lagos state, Akinwunmi Ambode; based on his track records and achievements in the state, he was to return for the second term, he deserved it, but due to his insubordination to Tinubu, 'the Lagos mafia Godfather', he was denied the second term ticket. It has been the tradition and you can't help it. If you try to do otherwise the mafia gang will come after you and make sure you don't ever get close to any political seat, ever again and make you lose your political popularity for daring to be insubordinate to " the Godfather "
Adams Oshiomole was to try out this system in Edo state but it failed woefully as the opposition was able to introduce and sell propaganda to fight his grips in Edo state. They introduced and sold the "Edo nor be Lagos" slogan which was political propaganda sponsored by the opposition to fight the Adams Oshiomole system and structure and extol Godwin Obaseki.
Obaseki was clearly a political stooge of Oshiomole but due to unresolved differences the two fell off, Oshiomole tried to play the Obaseki unlike Ambobaseki, but Obaseki fled and fled the party and joined the opposition party and he was able to stand his ground and fight for his return ticket. He won and he made Oshiomole lose his popularity in Edo state, a state that was under his whims and caprices but he didn't fully grasp the state like Tinubu of Lagos state.
This godfatherism political system has never had a known or recorded success in the history of eastern Nigeria's political arena. Maybe the

Godfatherism can also be seen as a particular group of individual society that are wealthy, influentia and strong in the environment that contribute to the development of any interest group or political party in society, which view them as a superiors individual, with such advantage they regard them as a strong elite and respect their authoritative decision both the masses and the rich because of their power.
They are different type of godfathers in Nigeria, they are some groups of individuals that do not have any intention for politics but want to contribute to political affairs and have a say in the community or society in using their resources to decide a particular candidate for a particular post, and make use of the opportunity to gain ground in the opportunity to gain ground in the community that could help them to have a say in government and also recognize as one of the nobles in society of such particular environment and they are some that practice politics and also have mouth in the community or the society they residence but does not have the resources to aspire for political post, instead they make use of the mouth they have in the society to influence the society and candidate aspires for post.
Also some types of godfathers have high level of political participation in every aspect relating to politics, their political efficacy is high but they lack the practice strategic ideologies of politics, as result of this create room for some of the political gladiator to motivate them with money and utilize their manpower to wins election in different ward and ection ward and ventual drop then this group lection, mos people in this group are the illiterates in the society
A law should be made to forbid godfatherism in the state, The electorate should be properly sensitized that nobody has a monopoly of power and power does not belong to just one family. Godfathers are not all bad but they are some that are just evil and those need to be removed.

Hardship, hunger and poverty are major social determinants of health, and they a significant impact on mental health. We may not take the main cognizance of people who are already mentally challenged, but healthy individuals who suffer lack and want are likely to be depressed due to discrimination and isolation. DUE to the hardship in the country, a lot of people see food and medicare in thei dreams and not having food, means of transportation are great stressors which can cause depression, anxiety and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Hardship which comes in the form of financial insecurity, unemployment, homelessness, discrimination, violence can lead to depression, anxiety or sleep problems. People who are struggling to make ends meet may worry about how to pay for rent, food and other necessities, lose hope and turn to beggars
Moreover, beggars lack access to basic hygiene, sanitation facilities, and medical care which could lead to illnesses, infections and the spread of diseases. Beggars often face socia stigma and discrimination, which can contribute to their isolation and make it difficult for them to access support or opportunities for improvement. Begging makes it difficult to break free from the cycle of poverty. The ability to seek sustainable solutions such as education, employment or social support systems is completely hindered from them
Hitherto, begging does not only attract sympathy or elicit empathy from kind-hearted individuals, it aso has economic implications for a decent society. It would not only affect tourism; it would also limit visitation to places where beggars often flock.
Besides, depression is a socioeconomic disease. It is on record that patients with clinical depression experience mood disorder when they suffer lack and want. A test with Baboons in Kenya in the 1920s showed that displaced baboons who lack food and space are usually depressed and stressed. Financia stress is a major cause of depression and anxiety disorder. Inequality is one of the drivers of the mental health crisis and there is a link between mental health and money Going into a recluse, withdrawal, avoiding social functions, church attendance are various reactions of our mental state which could be detrimental.
On the same note, 'Japa' is already a syndrome in Nigeria and 'Sapa' is a mental condition. The grass is not green in Nigeria making citizens unduly stressed with A35,000 minimum wage which is less than $\$ 50$ and the government does not show any sign or readiness to remedy the ugly situation. THE word is agog with hysteria because of climate change. Far-reaching decisions that affect our lives are being made because of climate change. I often wonder if we are not doing too much globally because of climate change.
Recently, I found out that the weather can actually be controlled using weather modification technology. In other words, the weather could be engineered. This engineering of our weather could also be a double-edged word. One of such technology is called cloud seeding. This is one of the technologies used to cause rain and floods. Cloud seeding can do wonders in the desert. With rain caused by this technology, the desert could be converted into arable land. This seedling has been done in Dubai deserts.
Cloud seeding is an answer to droughts and dissertation. However, in the forest zones where rain is perennial, cloud seeding can lead to massive flooding. Today, occurrences of flooding across the globe has doubled. This leaves me with some questions. Are some of these floods results of cloud seeding gone wrong? Is climate engineering under government regulation? How can climate engineering be regulated in Nigeria even before it arrives here if it is not already here? I share with you an excerpt on what cloud seeding is from the Desert Research Institute:

## What is cloud seeding?

Clouds are made up of tiny water droplets or ice crystals that form when water vapor in the atmosphere cools and condenses around a tiny particle of dust or salt floating in the atmosphere. Without these particles, known as condensation or ice nuclei, raindrops or snowflakes cannot form and precipitation will not occur.
Cloud seeding is a weather modification technique that improves a cloud's ability to produce rain or snow by introducing tiny ice nuclei into certain types of subfreezing clouds. These nuclei provide a base for snowflakes to form. After cloud seeding takes place, the newly formed snowflakes quickly grow and fall from the clouds back to the surface of the Earth, increasing snowpack and streamflow.

## How we cloud seed

Cloud seeding can be done from groundbased generators or aircrafts. The DRI Cloud Seeding Research Programme primarily uses ground-based generators, which are designed and built by DRI and can be operated remotely. In the Carson and Walker River basins, DRI also conduct cloud seeding from a subcontracted seeding aircraft.
Most cloud seeding operations, including those run by DRI, use a compound called silver iodide (AgI) to aid in the formation of ice crystals. Silver iodide exists naturally in the environment at low concentrations and is not known to be harmful to humans or wildlife
When storm systems move through one of our cloud seeding project areas, a solution containing a small amount of silver iodide is burned from ground-based generators or released from aircraft. Upon reaching the cloud, the silver iodide acts as an ice forming nuclei to aid in the production of snowflakes.
DRI's cloud seeding operation generally runs during the winter season of November to May, when storm systems are actively moving through our project areas. During dry winters when storm systems are absent for long periods, cloud seeding cannot occur, because cloud seeding requires the presence of moisture-filled clouds.
DRI's team of experts include meteorologists who monitor the weather throughout the season for appropriate cloud seeding conditions. Cloud seeding does not occur during times when additional precipitation would be problematic, such as times of high flood risk or during busy holiday travel periods.

## Benefits of cloud seeding

Cloud seeding is used all over the world as a method for enhancing winter snowfall and ncreasing mountain snowpack, supplementing the natural water supply available to communities of the surrounding area.
The effectiveness of cloud seeding differs from project to project, but long-term cloud seeding projects over the mountains of Nevada and other parts of the world have been shown to increase the overall snowpack in the targeted areas by $10 \%$ or more per year (Manton and Warren 2011, Huggins 2009,

Super and Heimbach 1983)
At a study site in the Snowy Mountains of New South Wales, Australia, a five-year cloud seeding project designed by DRI resulted in a 14 percent increase in snowfall across the project area. This enhanced snowfall was shown to be a result of cloud seeding, at the 97 percent confidence interval (Manton and Warren 2011).
In Wyoming, a 10-year cloud seeding experiment in the Snowy Range and Sierra Madre Range resulted in five to 15 percent increases in snow pack from winter storms (Wyoming Water Development Office 2015). And older research from a cloud seeding programme in the Bridger Range of western showed snowall increases of up to

15 percent from cloud seeding using high there is significant danger that cloud seeding altitude remote-controlled generators (Super and Heimbach 1983). These generators are similar to the cloud seeding methods used by DRI's modern cloud seeding projects.
The foregoing is from the Desert Research Institute. following excerpt from the bulletin of Atomic Scientists explains the pros and cons of cloud seeding with instances of flooding in places like Dubai, which is also taking its firs harvest from cloud seeding this year
With water shortages in the American West continuing to worsen, policymakers are starting to recognize that incremental changes such as "avoiding long showers [and] fixing leaky faucets" will not be sufficient. During crises, "silver bullets"-promising but overlysimplistic technological solutions to complex problems-become increasingly appealing, despite the acknowledgement that no single technology or policy can address complex challenges like water shortages or climate change.
Cloud seeding is perhaps the ultimate silver bullet, in which literal silver in the form of silver iodide is infused into clouds, causing ice crystals to form and water to condense into rain or snow. Cloud seeding is a form of planned weather modification. Most commonly used to increase precipitation as a drought management technique, cloud seeding is also regularly used to clear fog in airports, fight forest fires, suppress hail, and even divert rainfall, as it was used, for example, during the 2008 Olympics in Beijing. The promise of creating rain is highly appealing in the face of increasing water shortages and disruptions to water cycles exacerbated by climate change. While cloud seeding is not a new technology-the first experiments took place in the 1940s-it fell out of favor in the 1980s for being an "unacceptable ethical and environmental hazard." It is now back on the policy agenda as a climate adaptation strategy. Idaho, Utah, Colorado, Wyoming, and California have all expanded their cloud seeding operations in the past two years in response to the worsening drought. Despite its potential, the risks associated with cloud seeding are high, and
may do more harm than good."Human consequences.
As early as 1965, the National Science Foundation called for urgent social science research into the impacts of weather modification, stating, "If the developing techniques of weather and climate modification are to be used intelligently, the human consequences of deliberate or inadvertent intervention need to be anticipated before they are upon us." But these issues continue to be under-explored. Compared to other forms of geoengineering that have received greater attention and generated more controversy-such as expanding research on solar geoengineering-policy discussions about the use (and misuse) of cloud seeding are lacking, even though it has been widely deployed
Having read the forgoing, we must interrogate cloud modification weather engineering technology in a world where flooding, earthquakes and all forms of weather hazards threaten human life. If this technology gets into the wrong hands, it will become a deadly weapon of destruction where the weather can simply be modified to cause flooding in any area of choice. This should not surprise us because today's military power lies in the possession of the most destructive technology and water is just as destructive as fire.
Bhupendra Jasani, in a publication titled environmental modification" talks about weather and climate modification modification of oceans and earthquakes, modification of certain types of electromagnetic radiation reaching the earth and modification of the electrical behaviour of the atmosphere. This paper calls all of this geophysical modification. The paper reads and quote as follows: "the term environmental modification embodies many types of deliberate or inadvertent changes in the nvoronment where man leaves. Prior to the Environmental Modification Convention signed in Geneva in 1977, the United States used weather warfare in the Vietnam War. Operation Popeye saw the use of cloud seeding over the Ho Chi Minh trail. It was hoped that the increased rainfall would reduce the rate of infiltration down the trail.[1]
A research paper produced for the United States Air Force written in 1996 speculates about the future use of nanotechnology to produce "artificial weather", clouds of microscopic computer particles all communicating with each other to form an "intelligent fog" that could be used for various purposes. "Artificial weather technologies do not currently exist. But as they are developed, the importance of their potential applications rises rapidly.
The Convention on the Prohibition of Military or Any Other Hostile Use of Environmental Modification Techniques (Geneva: May 18, 1977, Entered into force: October 5, 1978) prohibits "widespread, long-lasting or severe effects as the means of destruction, damage or injury". In 1972 an ENMOD convention on weather warfare presented that this permits "local, non-permanent changes".[2] The Consultative Committee of Experts" established in Article VIII of the Convention stated in their "Understanding relating to Article II" that any use of environmental modification where this is done "as a means of destruction, damage or injury to another State Party, would be prohibited.".[3] It also suggests all signatories are expected to abstain from using weather modification to cause harm at any scale, stating "military or any other hostile use of environmental modification techniques, would result, or could reasonably be expected to result, in widespread, long-lasting or severe destruction, damage or injury." However, the treaty does not directly condemn military use of weather modification when it does not directly cause harm,[3] such as the United States use of weather modification in the siege of Khe Sanh, discussed above. The limitations of the treaty, and its application only to signatory states, allow weather warfare to continue to play a role in warfare throughout the twenty-first century. The United States prohibits weather modification without permission of the United Sates.

## Will Egypt accept Palestinians out of Gaza? <br> Analysts say Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi fears instability at home if Palestinian refugees cross the

 borderPalestinians with dual citizenship wait for permission to leave Gaza at the Rafah border crossing with Egypt, in Rafah in the southern Gaza Strip, IBRAHEEM ABU MUSTAFA writes.EGYPT'S President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi appears unlikely to absorb the 2.2 million Palestinians who could be displaced from the Gaza Strip during the Israel-Hamas war, experts have told AI Jazeera.
"My assessment is that it is a 95 percent non-starter," said Nancy Okail, president and CEO of the Center for International Policy, a progressive nonprofit in Washington, DC.
"The political cost outweighs any of the benefits," she added, pointing to the potential for domestic unrest in Egypt if an influx of Palestinian refugees were to arrive.
But the prospect of a mass displacement from Gaza - a narrow, densely populated territory on Egypt's northeast border - has heightened concerns in el-Sisi's government.
On October 24, +972 Magazine and its sister publication Local Call reported on a leaked document allegedly from Is rael's Ministry of Intelligence, outlining a proposal to "evacuate" all Palestinians from Gaza to Egypt.
Rumours are also swirling that Israeli leaders are attempting to entice Cairo into accepting displaced Palestinians by offering to write off some of its bloated external debt, which hovers at about \$160bn.
In addition, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has reportedly lobbied European leaders to help him convince el-Sisi to take in refugees from Gaza - an idea he has so far rejected.
"It is entirely understandable why the Egyptians and Palestinians fear that there are Israeli leaders that seek to forcefully and permanently displace Palestinians from Gaza," said Timothy Kaldas, an expert on Egypt's political economy for the Tahrir Institute for Middle East Policy.
He added that Palestinians should still be granted the right to seek asylum in neighbouring countries, a protection that Egypt and Israel are denying them.
"Palestinians should still have the choice - and I emphasise the choice - to move into Sinai and seek safe haven. They should not be

ElSisi's government, however has denied those charges
But Bahgat said the pressure some countries are placing on Egypt to potentially allow the forced displacement of Palestinians - a grave crime - will give elSisi greater cover to commit human rights violations domestically
"The regime won't even have to be mindful of its image," Bahgat said.

ACCORDING to a Dietitian, Hibiscus tea is tasty, pretty and full of antioxidants that could be responsible for several health benefits. No wonder it was named one of the 2022 top food trends!
If you've noticed hibiscus popping up on cocktail menus or as an ingredient in nonalcoholic beverages lining supermarket shelves, there's a good reason. Hibiscus has been noted as one of the top food trends to watch for in 2022 and beyond. The bright red flower certainly is pretty, but its benefits go way beyond good looks. Read on to find out what hibiscus is, its benefits and side effects, and how you can put hibiscus to use at home.
Hibiscus (Hibiscus sabdariffa) is an edible flowering plant native to parts of Africa and Asia, though it's also cultivated in Mexico and Central America. Contrary to popular belief, the part of the plant you can eat and drink isn't the petals but rather the calyxes of the flower. Calyxes the calyxes of the flower. Calyxes
(or calyces) are the sepals of a flower, which, in addition to other things, are responsible for protecting the buds and petals.

These red calyxes, found underneath the bloom, contain a high concentration of anthocyanins, a red-blue pigment with antioxidant properties that gives hibiscus its pretty deep red color.
Hibiscus has a refreshing floral taste that combines fruity, tart and sweet. Some people compare the flavor of hibiscus to that of cranberries, but with a

## HIV prevention facts and questions

HIV is spread through semen, vaginal fluids, blood, and breast milk. Protect yourself by using condoms every time you have sex, and don't share needles with anyone. You can also ask your doctor about PrEP - a daily pill that helps prevent HIV.
How do I avoid getting HIV during sex?
HIV is spread through contact with blood or sexual fluids (like semen and vaginal fluids), usually during vaginal and anal sex. So the only $100 \%$ certain way to avoid HIV is to not have vaginal or anal sex.
But most people do have sex at some point in their lives, so learning about HIV prevention and knowing how to have safer sex is important. Using condoms really lowers your risk of getting HIV. If you're going to have sex, using condoms every single time is the best way to protect yourself from HIV. There's also a daily pill you can take - called PrEP - that can help prevent HIV. Your doctor or nurse can tell you if PrEP is right for you.
Some sexual activities are safer than others when it comes to getting HIV. These activities are "no risk" - they've never caused a reported case of HIV: Masturbating, touching your partner's genitals, rubbing your bodies together (dry humping), kissing, having oral sex with a

body. If you stop treatment your viral load can go up, making it possible to pass HIV to others you have sex with. Your doctor or nurse can help you find the treatment that's best for you to help keep your viral load low, so you can stay healthy.
How can I make sure I don't give HIV to anyone during sex?
If you find out that you have HIV, try to stay calm. People living with HIV can have normal, healthy relationships and sex lives. But it's important to take precautions to help your partner(s) stay HIVfree.
There are a few ways that you can avoid giving HIV to other people: Always use condoms when you have vaginal and ana sex. Start treatment for HIV as soon as possible, and keep taking your HIV medicine. When you take it correctly, HIV treatment can lower or even stop your chances of spreading the virus to your sexual partners (and help you stay healthy).

Ascreening test is done to detect potential health disorders or diseases in people who do not have any symptoms of disease. The goal is early detection and lifestyle changes or surveillance, to reduce the risk of disease, or to detect it early enough to treat it most effectively. Screening tests are not considered diagnostic, but are used to identify a subset of the population who should have additional testing to determine the presence or absence of disease.
When is a screening test helpful?
What makes a screening test valuable is its ability to detect potential problems, while minimizing unclear, ambiguous, or confusing results. While screening tests are not $100 \%$ accurate in all cases, it is generally more valuable to have the screening tests at the appropriate times, as recommended by your healthcare provider, than to not have them at all. However, some screening tests, when used in people not at high risk for disease, or when testing for very rare diseases, can cause more problems than they help.
Some common screening tests
Be sure to consult your healthcare provider regarding the appropriate timing and frequency of all screening tests based on your age, overall health, and medical history. The following are some examples of common screening tests:

Cholesterol measurements
Cholesterol is a waxy substance that can be found in all parts of the body. It aids in the production of cell membranes, some hormones, and vitamin D. The cholestero in the blood comes from 2 sources: the food you eat and production in your liver. However, the liver produces all of the cholesterol the body needs.
Cholesterol and other fats are transported in the bloodstream in the form of spherical particles, called lipoproteins. The 2 most commonly known lipoproteins are low-density lipoproteins (LDL), or "bad" cholesterol, and high-density lipoproteins (HDL), or "good" cholesterol.
Cholesterol screening is performed by a blood test People with high cholesterol measurements from a blood

## Mammography

The American Diabetes Association (ADA) recommends

People with blood in their stool may have a cancerous growth indicative of colorectal cancer. The test requires collection of 3 stool samples that are examined under the microscope for blood. It is important to understand that when blood is present in a stool sample, it can be due to other noncancerous factors, such as certain medications or foods, gastrointestinal bleeding, or hemorrhoids. Testing is recommended starting at age 50 by many organizations including the American Cancer Society.

## Breaking barriers in access to finance for \#MSMEs

Nigeria is estimated to have about 40m MSMEs, most of which are in the informal trade. With formal financial inclusion at just about 50\% according to the last EFINA study, skewed largely to mid and upper income, urban demographics, it can be assumed that most MSMEs in Nigeria are not included in the formal financial system. Olu Akanmu writes.

MOST of the \#MSMEs would be nano enterprises employing two or three people, informal, unstructured and would largely trade or do business in thei personal names.  realities in the country has further made feeding in Nigeria very poor. Stable foods like rice, beans and ingredients for cooking like palm oil and groundnut oil are beyond the reach of the common man. The common saying these days is: We live each day as it comes.Foods like sweet potatoes, cocoa yam, gotai (with roughly ground maize) which were unpopular in the past are now common foods in most average homes in Plateau State. Talk about na condition dey make crayfish bend. Even garri is beyond the reach of the common man.
This makes one wonder how dog owners are managing, knowing that dogs either eat leftovers or one buys their feed which is expensive. Alternatively, one could prepare the meal by getting the following according to specification: maize, soya beans, dry bones or fish meal, slightly roasted groundnut, mix them and take them to the millers to grind. This could be very tasking and it is now very expensive. Only the rich can afford it.
However, considering the peculiarities of the times, how many people can afford to keep a dog and feed it as desired? Of recent, one has noticed an increased number of stray dogs roaming the streets or rummaging through garbage dumps. The consequences of this cannot be over-emphasized.
Studies have shown that one of the ways dogs get rabies is by eating what bats have leftover which is mostly found in refuse dumps. As dangerous as this condition is, once a dog in an area gets it, all other dogs in that area would be in danger of getting infected.
A worst-case scenario is the danger to humans, especially children. A dog infected with rabies does not need to be provoked to attack. It silently goes after any moving object and bites it.
More than a decade ago, 2 sisters met their death as a result of being bitten by a rabies infected dog. They were from a humble background, and as such, the parents could not afford the treatment. The owner of the dog refused to be responsible for the treatment. Going back and forth like that, the little girls (age between 6 and 9) exhibited all the signs of rabies, including barking like a dog before finally giving up their ghost.

## Trader moni, fuel subsidy palliatives: Another hope differed <br> There seems to exist a recurring narrative one of grand promises and another, profound disappointments over certain policies

 especially geared towards poverty alleviation and improvement of the life of Nigerian citizens. This is despite the opportunities and prosperity that naturally abound in the country, writes OkoronkwoTHE economic asphyxiation of the masses is exacerbated by a government that often fails to harness its abundant resources effectively for the benefit of the people.

Nigerians are always promised relief, but what they often receive are half-measures and misdirection

As at the last count, Nigeria has implemented various social intervention programmes intended to alleviate the suffering of the masses. However, the effectiveness of these programmes is often questionable. Trader Moni, NPower, school feeding programme and now, fuel subsidy remova palliative among other initiatives have faced allegations of corruption, politicization, and mismanagement, leaving the intended beneficiaries in the lurch.

The Trader Moni of the past administration and palliatives associated with the recent fuel subsidy removal by this present administration which are promises of economic relief for the masses and positioned as lifelines for the most vulnerable citizens, have again, cast a mirage of hope.

These programmes are superficially positioned to uplift the masses from suffering However, as the dust settles and the realities emerge, the story is one of economic despair. The common thread that binds them is a pattern of waste mismanagement, and questionable outcomes, reflecting a broader challenge in Nigeria's approach to addressing the needs of its citizens.

Just like the now rested Trader Moni microcredit scheme of President Mohammed Buhari's administration, the N3.27tn subsidy removal palliatives announced by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu's administration to cushion the economic hardship on Nigerians following the removal of fuel subsidy may just be another phoney jamboree with no significance or impact on the common man, who is the primary target of the initiative
These palliatives included N100bn to acquire 3,000 units of 20 -seater CNG-fuelled buses, N200bn to boost agriculture production, N75bn for manufacturers, N125bn for micro, small and medium-sized enterprises and the informal sector, N185bn as palliatives for states, N1tn on student loans and other programmes.
Others included N315bn to pay federal workers' N35,000 allowance for six months, N1.13tn to 15 million households at N25,000 per month for three months from October to December


2023, N70bn earmarked as alliative measures for awmakers, and N75bn loan acility to 1.5 m market The fact is that Nigerians are always promised relief, but what they often receive are half-measures and misdirection. The yearning for substantial change always results in grand gestures without concrete actions.
The much-touted Trader Moni initiative as of today has no testimony of a Nigerian who was impacted by the programme, who could stand before the world and really chronicle a story o transformation from grass to grace, neither could anyone vouch for economi improvement since the fue subsidy removal initiative was announced. What an irony This is in spite of the fact that over $50 \%$ of the funds have left government coffers, yet poverty looms large on a daily asis.
With the current hardship in the country, Nigeria needs policies and initiatives that go beyond the illusion of hope. I requires genuin empowerment, sustainable development, and social and economic justice. Rather than short-term fixes, the nation must move towards long term, transformative solutions
all citizens
The economic strangulation of the masses cannot continue. Empowering ordinary Nigerians requires the government to prioritize policies that genuinely address the needs of the population. It involves a commitment to social and economic justice, investment in education, job creation, and the eradication of systemic corruption.
Accountability and transparency in governance are critical to mitigating waste and economic asphyxiation. These principles can help ensure that public resources are allocated efficiently and equitably. Strengthening the rule of law and anti-corruption efforts is pivotal to restoring the faith of the masses in their government.

Though the programs are conceived with the noblest o intentions and there may be beneficiaries, the question remains: are the programs genuinely making a substantia difference in the lives of the masses? A comprehensive impact assessment is often lacking, leaving the true impac unclear.
To mitigate some of the controversies that trail poverty alleviation programmes Nigeria's leaders should aim for lasting, sustainable solutions that genuinely address the needs of the population. The masses should be active participants in the design and execution of policies that affec their lives. True empowerment requires a shift from shortterm, politically motivated palliatives to long-term sustainable solutions that elevate the welfare of the nation.
To tip the balance of hope in favour of the masses, Nigeria must prioritize transparency accountability, and inclusivity in its policy implementations. It is imperative to ensure that the intended beneficiaries receive the support they are promised Oversight mechanisms must be strengthened to root out corruption and malpractice in the execution of these initiatives. The government must also embark on a sincere journey of effective communication, building trus with the masses through hones and open dialogue.
The government's tendency to waste resources and economically strangle the masses is a stark contradiction to the nation's potential. Nigeria should be a land of opportunity and prosperity for all its citizens However, this vision can only be realized when the governmen shifts its priorities towards transparency, accountability and policies that genuinely uplift the masses. The economic strangulation of the masses must end, and the governmen has a fundamental role to play in ensuring that Nigeria's wealth benefits all its people

## Saudi 2034 WC: Why decision is not a surprise

The prospect of a World Cup in Saudi Arabia has long been anticipated, with the country's unprecedented investment in sport over recent years always seemingly intended to lead to this moment. DAN ROAN writes.

NO-one who has been paying attention to the way the country has turned the world of golf upside down through the rebel LIV Series, or started to dominate the hosting of top boxing, or sent shockwaves through football's international transfer market, can be that surprised.
The regular meetings Fifapresident Gianni Infantino has had with the Saudi Crown Prince in recent years were also a sign of the growing influence the country enjoys at the very top of the game.
And yet, despite the staggering level of Saudi ambition in sport, the idea of a World Cup in the kingdom will still shock many.
Now that the country is all but guaranteed to be staging the tournament in 11 years' time, it has the potersial than Qatar's more controversial than Qatar's hosting last year; with concerns ranging from
human rights issues, and Fifa's human rights issues, and Fifa's
handling of the bidding process, to handling of the bidding process, to
the calendar disruption and impact on player welfare due to what is likely to be another winter World Cup because of extreme summer temperatures
In fact, with an expanded 48 -team format, the level of disruption could be even greater than for Qatar 2022, along with the requirement for significant infrastructure construction, intensifying sustainability concerns.
Many critics will see this as the ultimate expression of 'sportswashing' - a form of soft power - by the biggest exporter of oil in the world - a country where there are grave concerns over women's rights abuses, the criminalisation of homosexuality, the restriction of free speech, the continued use of the death penalty, the 2018 murder of death penalty, the 2018 murder of journalist Jamal Khashoggi, and scrutiny over the country's
involvement in the conflict in Yemen.
The Saudi authorities deny this,

However, while there is more footballing heritage in Saudi Arabia than in Qatar, attendances at most of the Pro League clubs have actually fallen this season.
But whatever the true motive of Saudi Arabia's rulers, its emergence as the one bidder for 2034 will intensify scrutiny on Fifa's processes and judgement, with some observers voicing concerns that this outcome had almost been engineered as an effective fait accompli in a deal lacking transparency and accountability.
First there was Fifa's shock announcement earlier this month, bringing forward the bidding month, for 2034 by the bidding proces for 2034 by three years when decreeing that the host country mus and giving just 26 days for bids to be declared.
This followed its approvat of 2030 tournament being given jointly o the continents of Europe, Africa and South America, despite the dismay of environmental campaigners, thereby ruling them out of bidding for 2034 under Fifa's rotation policy.
Then - within minutes - came the Saudis' formal announcement of heir bid, swiftly followed by the backing of the Asian Football Confederation.

'anointing' hosts via uncontested
bids - is preferable to the past, when years-long contests between many countries were vulnerable many threat of vote-swapping, bribery and corruption.
But the way that this process has seemed to pave the way for the Saudis will leave many uneasy.
In March, the World Leagues Forum - which represents domestic leagues around the world - expressed its "concern" over what it claimed was Fifa's lack of consultation over the global football calendar including expanding the 2026 men's World Cup and the new versions of the Club World Cup.
Its mood - along with that of other stakeholders such as player and fan representatives - is unlikely to have been improved by the way decisions have been taken since
Human Rights Watch has also accused Fifa of ignoring its own rules, saying: "The possibility that Fifa could award Saudi Arabia the 2034 World Cup despite its appalling human rights record and closed door to any monitoring exposes Fifa's commitments to human rights as a sham."
Fifa has declined to comment, but privately insists that human rights remain an integral part of the bidding process. Certainly Saudi Arabia will be far from the only controversial host of a sporting mega-event in recent years.
Same-sex relationships are illegal in 2030 World Cup co-hosts Morocco, as they are in Qatar of course, as well as in Saudi Arabia. Gay fans who said they did not feel safe going to the last World Cup may now feel they cannot attend two more either. Will there be player protests of the kind seen in Qatar, when the Germany team showed their support for the LGBTQ+ community? Could some countries even consider boycotting the event? And what is clear is that this underlines the extraordinary shift in sporting power towards the Middle East. However, recent developments in the Nigeria Professional Football League (NPFL) have cast a shadow over Nigeria's involvement in the sport, particularly with the omission of Nigerian referees from officiating in the upcoming AFCON 2024. The Nigeria Football Federation (NFF) must ensure that going forward, the greatest footballing nation in Africa must have a representation at the AFCON. The NFF must prioritise the welfare of referees so they
don't become vulnerable to corruption and other sharp practices.
This decision should serve as a wake-up call for all stakeholders in Nigerian football to invest in the development of referees and strive for greater representation in the future. Meanwhile, Rebecca Welch will become the first woman referee to be involved in a Premier League game when she acts as fourth official for Saturday's game between Fulham and Manchester United at Craven Cottage. Wendy Toms was the firs woman assistant in the Premier League, from its inception, and was followed by Natalie Aspinall and Sian Massey-Ellis. Welch will be the first to take on one of the roles of a referee, with Massey-Ellis the assistant VAR for the game.

The 39 -year-old has enjoyed a meteoric rise this year, in January becoming year, in January becoming
the first female to take change of a Championship change of a Championship
game, between Birmingham game, between Birmingham
City and Preston North End. City and Preston North End.
Welch was then selected to referee at the Women's World Cup, appointed to three games including the round-of-16 match between Australia and Denmark. Her hopes of refereeing further games in the tournament were effectively ended by England reaching the final. North Riding referee Welch was offered promotion to the EFL as an assistant referee in 2017, but opted to switch to being a referee and work her way up the men's game that way. She was officiating in the National League, the fifth tier of English football, by the 2018-19 seaso while als 2018-19 season while also contine.
She took charge of the Women's FA Cup final in 2017 and 2020 and in 2017 and 2020, and was promoted to UEFA's elite category of female referees in 2020, when she left her job as an administrator in the National Health Service
In 2021, she progressed to become the first female to referee a professional game in England, as Port Vale beat Harrogate Town in League Two.
It marks a further step by PGMOL, the refereeing body in England, to increase diversity in the professiona game. In January, Bhupinde Singh Gill became the first Sikh-Punjabi to act an assistant referee in the Premier League
PGMOL has also fast tracked promising referees who have shone in lowe leagues through to the Premier League this season Sam Barrott had refereed just 10 matches in the Championship before being elevated to the top flight last month at the age of 30 . A former Halifax Town youth player, he was only promoted
